Fellow Vintage Gunners,

For many of us, the Southern Side-by-Side Spring Classic marks the beginning of spring. If you're from the northern region of the country, the Southern gives us our first chance to shed our winter coats, shoot with friends and enjoy some warm weather. With less than a month to go, most of us are champing at the bit.

Hopefully you have gone to the website, Vintagers.org to see the Chapter events for 2019. Remember as a Vintage Gunner member, you can attend any chapter's event. Consider calling the chapter contact person listed just to be sure that the date or venue has not changed. This is also a good time to remind people to renew their memberships and to reach out to your shooting companions and let them know about the planned events including this year's Vintage Gunners Cup.

Planning for the Vintage Gunners Cup is well underway. Hausmann's Hidden Hollow Sporting Clays is adding a new small-bore course, an area for the rifle competition, and they have expanded the area for the exhibitors. The rifle range will be located near the exhibitors' tents so that spectators can watch the events. New areas have been created for the flurry events and the clays pigeon ring. The Vintage Gunners Cup has long held the tradition that our shooters should be well dressed. Several of the collector's associations are reciprocating with free advertising for free booth space. Through these advertising efforts and increasing the number of side games and social events available to participants, we hope to continue our growth as an organization. As we are looking for a large participation this year, I strongly suggest you make your hotel reservations now.

Pennsylvania Flyfishing and Wingshooting Expo

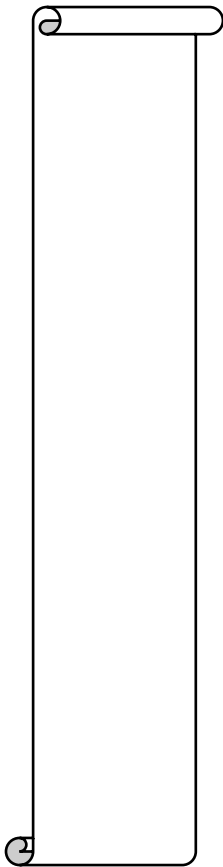

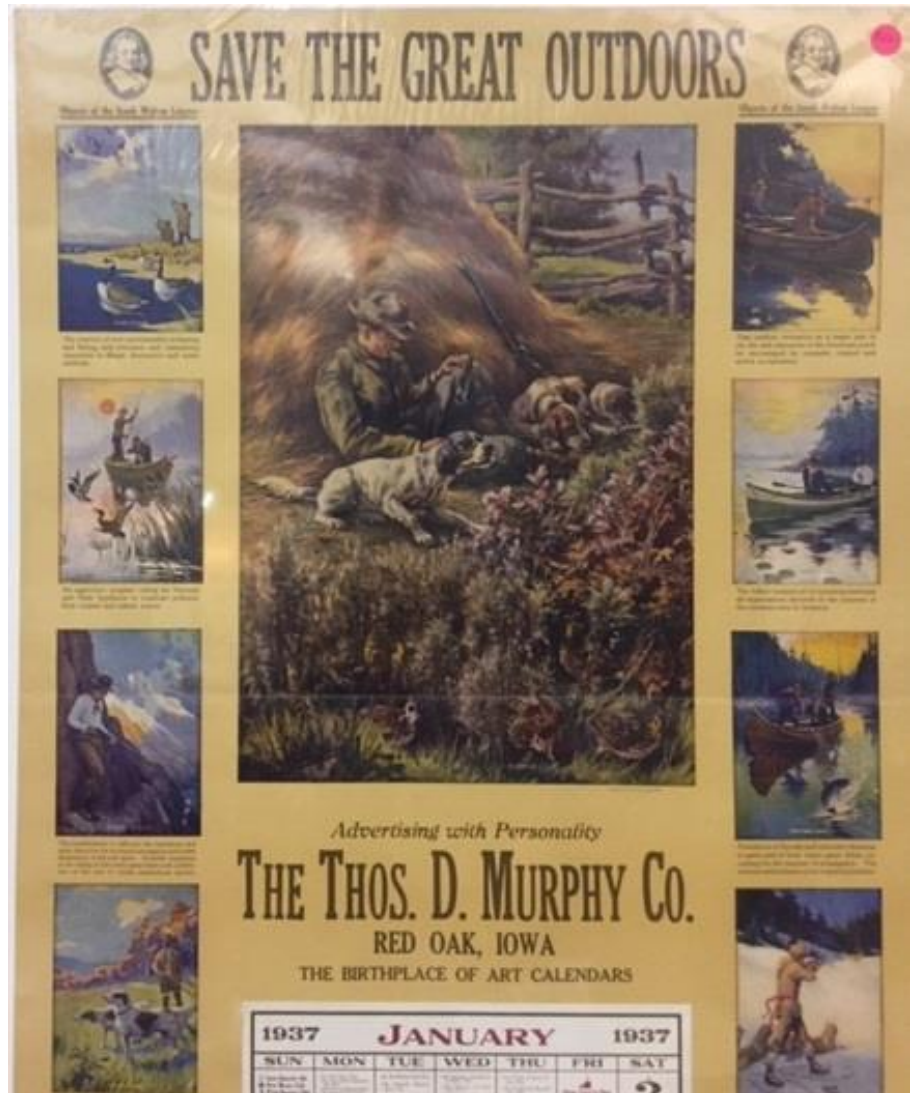
chapter Treasurer (Dick Mider) resting after grouse hunting all day. The happy setter is his dog Gem. ☺

Importing Guns from England

In the several years since I first wrote about the process of bringing in guns from England, there have been some changes. Recently I have been helping one of our Carolina Vintagers to import a gun from the Holts Auction (www.holtsauctioneers.com) and his questions have been really useful in sharpening my thoughts on this matter. So, for what they are worth, here is the short course on importing a gun from the UK.

So you have bought the Purdey of your dreams at one of the auctions or one of the shops. What next? The auction house or shop will have a shipper and most likely it will be HGSS (Harry Gordon Shipping Service). The shipper will contact you and send you the boiler plate (template) for a one-page document that is required by the UK for all firearms exported. This is called an End User Undertaking. In it you will describe the firearm in detail with serial number(s) and promise that the gun is for you own use and that it will not be used to deliver biological, chemical or nuclear weapons (no, I'm not kidding – just do it). You will promise not to sell the gun(s) to an embargoed country and some other stuff. Keep a copy and send one to your UK shipper.

While you are doing the End User Undertaking, go online to www.ATF.gov/forms. Go to the Forms Library and arrow down to ATF F 5330.A (Form 6). You can fill it out online and it is neater than hand written, although the ATF has to accept neatly handwritten as well.

Form 6 is not difficult, but you need to pay attention. Blocks 1 and 2 are filled out by your FFL holder. Block 3, the country of Export is England or UK. Block 4 calls for the name and address of the Customs Broker – That's YOU. Fill in your name followed by (Self-Broker) and your address. The law is very clear. You are allowed to bring in a limited number of firearms per year on your own, without a custom's broker. Most brokers today charge \$1,000 to bring in a nice shotgun so this is a do-it-yourself job. Block 5, Applicant's Name and Address refers to your FFL holder. Block 6 is the foreign Seller, in my case that is usually Holt's, although I have also bought from Graham MacKinley and a few others. Block 7 is the foreign shipper, again usually HGSS at 18 Hilton Rd., Canvey Island, Essex SS8 9XD, UKGB. Block 8 is pretty straightforward. In the section that asks if the gun is new or used be sure to put the date of manufacture if it is pre-1898. Pre-1898 guns are really easy to import and there is no import duty. Block 10, I usually state that the gun is for my private collection and for occasional quail hunting or sporting clays. Block 11 asks if you are registered as an Importer and you check no. Blocks 13, 14, 15 & 16 call for your full name, full signature, title and date. That's it. Form 6 is done.

Now arrow down a bit further in the Forms Library and pull up ATF F 5330.3C (Form 6-A). This is the release and receipt form that you will need to get the folks at US Customs to release the gun to you. Again, you are the Customs Broker and the Applicant is the FFL Holder. Having already done Form 6, 6-A is a piece of cake.

Burn off five copies of each form. Keep one for yourself and send three to the ATF and give one of each to your FFL holder. The address of the ATF is:

I strongly suggest sending the forms by registered mail with return receipt. I had the bureaucrats of Needy Road lose one of my applications for six months.

Now you wait. I have gotten my forms back in as little as three weeks or as long as three months. There is no point in trying to hurry up federal bureaucrats. They are like mules, they just sulk up and quit on you. Here endeth the first part of the process.

Oh Happy Day! The forms are back from the ATF, all signed and stamped. Now what? First, scan a copy of the signed and stamped Form 6 and send it to your shipper (who should have gotten your End User Undertaking some time earlier). You should also send a good copy of the form by conventional (snail) mail. In a week or two the shipper will box up your firearm and ship it to the nearest international airport to you. When your box comes in you will get notified by the air freight company. Now, drive to the air freight company's office at your international airport and pick up an impressive sheaf of papers. These you need to carry to the Office of Homeland Security and Customs, which will be in the same general area as all the air freight companies. The folks at your air freight office will be able to tell you exactly where it is. Drive over to the Office of Homeland Security and Customs and hand your sheaf of papers, along with your stamped and signed Forms 6 and 6A, through the slit in the bullet proof glass window. The fellows at Security and Customs may take a while if they are not used to dealing with self-brokers, but eventually they will realize that you have done everything correctly and you are within your rights, and they will add their signatures and stamps.

Important point. If your gun was made after 1898 you will owe some duty on it. This is usually not much, seldom as much as \$100, but they only accept cash. I always go with at least five \$20s and a \$10, a \$5 and a few \$1s.

Once they have checked everything out and gotten your cash, they will hand you what is by now an even larger sheaf of papers which you take back to the air freight shipper and collect your gun. The shipper may also want some money, usually from \$10 to \$35. As soon as I have possession of the package, I like to take it outside to the tailgate of my pickup and open it to make sure that everything is OK. I have never had a problem, but I think it is really important to check before you leave the premises.

The last step is an important one. You must take the gun to your FFL holder and have it fully registered and this needs to happen right away. I once waited a few days and the FFL holder was not happy. Luckily the gun was pre-1898, so it wasn't actually a problem. Your FFL holder will have you fill out the exact same one-page sheet that you have filled out for every gun you have purchased in any shop in the US. Now your firearm is legally yours and properly registered. You have dotted every I and crossed every T.

On paper this looks like a lot, but it is actually quite straightforward. The main requirement is patience, but the purchase of a fine firearm is not usually an emergency situation. (If it is, you need to buy from a retail shop, where you will pay a whole lot more than you paid at an auction in

England.) The savings, both in the price of the gun and the fees that the custom’s broker would charge are really significant and it is fun both to get a bargain and to make the bureaucrats cooperate.
