#### Age Planning

Anyone who knows me, knows I am a 16-gauge man. My confidence is reinforced, whether I shoot well or not, as long as I carry one of my 16-gauge side-by-sides. The saying Carries like a 20 and shoots like a 12 is meaningful to me. Yet as I grow older, I am sensitive to the heft of any gun as well as the other items I carry.



On my 3-and-a-half to four-hour Quail hunts I carry a lot of gear...a fairly stout Westley Richards bag of at least 75 cartridges, a water bottle, a Game Bag to place my spent shotshells (I don't like to litter) and the occasional Quail, an electronic Garmin Alpha and whistles to manage Lord Riley, King George my Setters and Cooper, my German Shorthair and a 7-pound game gun.

Working with gun weight, I experimented with a 12-gauge 2-inch Patstone which my late friend Bill Curry sold me as well as a 16-gauge Thomas Turner Featherweight

(another story sometime perhaps). I like them but they are not the answer and I have continued to migrate back to my regular 16-gauge companions.

I have reached age 70 now and I have become even more thoughtful about the weight. I remember a passage I read in Havilah Babcock's writings which has weighed on me in my later years, viz:

"As I grow older a lighter gun, especially one with lightness of barrel, adds measurably to speed and maneuverability. I don't particularly object to weight in the stock. That doesn't move much anyway. Lightness of barrel is what counts, because such lightness tends to counteract a lagging coordination.

I have also discovered that he 28 does well on open shots. Paradoxically, it seems to drop a bird farther than my regulation 12-gauge double, and I have fewer cripple birds to chase. I realize I am swapping pattern diameter for responsiveness and versatility, but what I lose here I more than gain there. All the shot that misses a bird doesn't do me any good anyway. I can get the little 28 where it ought to be when it ought to be there, and that is the meat of the matter."

In 2018 at the Southern Side-by-Side, walking by the Atkin, Grant & Lang tables, I spied the Holy Grail...a svelte Damascus Hammergun by W. W. Greener in a leather case with trade label! It was being eyed by another Gentleman so I held back until I asked him if he minded if I examined the little 28-gauge. Gaining his approval, he even mentioned what the offer was to him to purchase. I have learned over time, once something is spotted of value, it can quickly get away. I asked Francis Lovel, the Proprietor and Director (a true Gentleman) if I could take it over to Toby Barclay of Heritage Arms to give it a once over. My anxiety was that it was strange; I had never seen a coined

Damascus barreled Hammergun! He readily agreed and I carefully took it over to the Heritage Arms Booth. I received Toby's gilt-edged guarantee and triple bond seal of approval.



#### I struck (after

speaking with my beautiful wife of course). Still nervous about the coined receiver I did not show my new acquisition to my Vintager friends and quietly took it Home. Sometimes the confabulation includes criticism and I am a sensitive fellow.

I have done some research on other old guns I own. Knowing Greener was still in business I reached out to Graham Greener who provided me an email and later a Maker's Letter describing the 28. The shorter email reads, viz:

Dear Mr. Floyd,

Thank you for your order and payment for information. We have the following information about your shotgun.

W W Greener gun no. 37966 was started on 2nd October 1889 and finished on 13th December 1889. It was one of three double barrel, sporting non-ejector, shotguns with external hammers made as a batch for Rosier, one of our agents. As all three were shipped to him on completion we do not have the original owner's name. The three were all made to the same specification and with the same engraving but they were not made as a garniture of three matching guns. 37966 is a 28 bore with 28-inch barrels.

It is a model no. 106 which means it has a 'Treble Wedge Fast' type action incorporating the famous Greener cross-bolt which adds strength to the action. This action was invented by W W Greener in 1873 although the cross-bolt predates this having been invented by WWG in 1867 for pin fire guns being made at that time.

Stock dimensions when made were 2 by 1-5/8 by 14-1/2 inches, half pistol hand. The model 106 is described in a catalogue of that year as being, 'This celebrated Treble-wedge-fast gun is now fitted with Laminated steel or Siemens steel barrels, tastefully finished, engraved and of superior make - cost 20 guineas ( $\pounds 21.00$  in today's money). So it is a medium grade shotgun and this particular shotgun has Damascus barrels not the type stated in the catalogue. At the time it was made inexpensive grades cot up to  $\pounds 20$ , medium grades from  $\pounds 20 - \pounds 40$  and top models from  $\pounds 40$  to  $\pounds 60$ .

It was originally proved by the Birmingham Gun Barrel Proof House and bears the original marks in use at that time for a choke bore shotgun. It also bears recent metric re-proof marks for modern cartridges. I attach some notes on condition which I hope will be helpful.



This gun was illustrated in The Greener Collections (still available as a Limited Edition) on pages 93/4. I was unaware of the laser engraved re-proof marks although I did see this gun many years ago in a collection when I photographed it for my second gun book.

So not only is the finish correct but its image is captured in Mr. Greener's Tome on Greeners!

Of course, no self-respecting collector would avoid the temptation to add to the accoutrements of such a beautiful side-by-side. Below is a picture of additions to the gun case including (top left to right) a pull through in pouch for cleaning, a 28-gauge eccentric Cartridge extractor, a Spratt's Gamekeeper knife (given by the company to Gamekeepers as a premium), 1889 Victorian Half Crown coin, a Lightwood Game Counter and lastly a W. W. Greener oil bottle and 28-gauge Damascus Snap Caps from Heritage Arms (center).



With very slight bending adjustments and a leather pad added by Master Gunsmith, Tim Carrick, it is ready for the Field. Keeping in mind Professor Babcock's advice (to me), I am now better prepared to age...it weighs about 4.8 pounds. And no, that is not too light!
