### Citizens For Backus/AB Annual Meeting - February 17, 2022 Minutes

- 1. Meeting was called to order at 6:02 pm by Bob Marquardt, President.
- 2. Bob introduced members of Board of Directors and Citizens for Backus/AB Members at large.
- 3. Bob introduced Lois Lundin, Executive Director. Lois introduced Backus staff: Alyssa Crawford as Office Assistant, Mikayla as Event Coordinator, and Hoa Sobczynski as Business Manager.
- 4. Motion to approve 2021 Annual meeting minutes by Gail Rognerud second by Patti Ballan. Motion carried.
- 5. Nomination and election of new Board Members Patti Ballan (incumbent), Julie Bartkowski (incumbent) and Gail Rognerud (incumbent) are presented for election to the Citizens for Backus/AB Board of Directors for a three-year term (2022-2025). Motion by Tim Fairchild; second by Sherrie Lessard. Motion carried.
- 6. Review/discussion of Director/Treasurer/Committee reports:
  - a. AB Project Update: Lois Lundin: Reviewed press release for the project.
  - b. Executive Director: Lois Lundin: Reviewed the highlights of the year. Report reviewed as submitted.
  - c. Finance/Treasurer: Patti Ballan: Highlighted the grants received in the year due to the hard work of staff. The City and County provided great support to Backus in 2021. The Backus membership goal for 2021 was exceeded by almost \$5.000.
  - d. Building Use by Numbers: Lois Lundin: The display of flags were donated by Fred Napper and will be a permanent display at Backus for all visitors to enjoy. There has been a recorded number of over 19,000 people walking through the doors of Backus.
  - e. Volunteers at Backus: Lois Lundin: Backus is fortunate to have a solid foundation of volunteers. Report reviewed as submitted.
  - f. Operations: Patti Ballan: The biggest upcoming project for the Operations Committee is the Boiler Project. There is one central heating system for both buildings and that will need to be separated for the AB Project. Report reviewed as submitted.
  - g. Endowment Fund: Bob Marquardt: The Endowment Fund is setting Backus up for long term financial stability and sustainability. The Endowment Committee is planning to kick off a campaign for the three-year goal of raising \$1 million funds. Please contact Lois Lundin if you have questions or would like to be involved in this committee.
  - h. Building & Grounds: Lois Lundin: Due to the approval of the AB Project, Backus is working on cleaning out the first floor of AB and organizing storage. Report reviewed as submitted.
  - i. Arts & Programming: Lois Lundin: In 2021, Backus has had a variety of activities involving art work, digital media, music and theater. 2021-2022 performing arts serices will wrap up with PARADIGM and the Shane Martin Band.
  - j. Events Coordinator: Lois Lundin: This position has a variety of responsibilities related to events and Backus is excited to have Mikayla on board in this position!

- k. Borealis Bards: Lois Lundin: Charlotte's Web will begin auditions this spring for a May 2022 performance. Fall 2022 performance will be Peter Pan, directed by Tim Weaver.
- I. KCC-TV Program: Lois Lundin: This program is a great outreach to increase exposure and information about what is available at Backus. Program director Darcy Sullivan is busy covering events all over the community to share in people's home and on the internet. KCC-TV has also helped film and edit programs of local artists for the Hidden Talents project.
- m. Ruby's Pantry: Lois Lundin: Ruby's Pantry overall had a strong attendance and participation. After November 2021 with some decline in numbers, Ruby's Pantry was put on pause to restructure leadership and processes. Ruby's Pantry will resume in March 2022 at Backus.
- n. Community Cafe: Lois Lundin: Community Cafe has worked to meet a variety of needs in the community that go above and beyond hunger. Meals have been provided in pick up/take out format and this has seen an increase in number of meals provided to a total of over 25,000 meals over the year.
- o. Summer Food Service Program: Lois Lundin: Almost 10,000 meals were provided to children and their family members in a pick up/take out format in 2021. The take out format has been very successful and families report preferring to take the meals to-go to enjoy at home. Taco in a bag continues to the crowd favorite.
- p. 2021-2022 Performing Arts Series Sponsors: Report submitted.
- q. Membership: Lois Lundin: Membership continues to grow for both Backus and KCC-TV. The support that the community shows to Backus in the form of membership is appreciated.
- r. Contributions & Donations: Lois Lundin: Donations and contributions come in in a variety of forms every day.
- s. Seat Sponsorships: Lois Lundin: Seat sponsorships continue to be used to memorialize loved ones.

# Bylaws Citizens for Backus/AB Bylaws Sections

#### Article IV, Section 4.1 Board Role, Size and Compensation:

The Board is responsible for overall policy and direction of Citizens for Backus/AB, Inc. The Board shall have up to 15 and not fewer than 11 members. No Director may receive compensation for his or her service as Director. However, nothing contained shall be construed to preclude any Director from serving the corporation in any other capacity, or receiving reasonable compensation therefore.

#### Article IV, Section 4.3 Board Elections:

Election of new directors or re-election of current directors to a second or third term will occur as the first item of business at the annual meeting of the corporation. Directors will be nominated by a majority vote of the current Board of Directors. Directors may also be nominated from the floor at the annual meeting.

#### Article IV, Section 4.5 Terms:

All Board members shall serve three-year term, and are eligible for re-election. The initial Board of the corporation will have staggering numbers of terms to prevent an entire turnover of the board at one time.

### Alexander Baker School Update





Citizens for Backus/AB, KOOTASCA Community Action and Trellis Co. staff have been hard at work over the last year pursuing the adaptive reuse and revitalization of the Alexander Baker School. The project is on track to begin construction this spring/summer, and some of the project's many milestones over the last year are below.

To ensure the building's historic character is preserved Part 1 and Part 2 applications have been submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office and the National Park Service for the Alexander Baker Building's historic renovation. Unfortunately, the 2022 MN Legislature's end of session grid-lock, which saw many omnibus budget and tax bills fail to receive a vote, including an extension of the State Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit, delayed the project from it's intended Winter 2022 construction start by creating a financing gap. However, the project has since filled this gap with an award of additional housing tax credits from Minnesota Housing.

A new plat subdividing the property along the shared wall of the buildings has been approved by the City of International Falls. This is necessary for the eventual sale of the property to the Developers, KOOTASCA and Trellis, and for the creation of a Housing TIF district by the City of International Falls, which the City Council has approved a Development Agreement for.

To ensure good environmental practices and health, Phase 1 and 2 Environmental Assessments and lead and asbestos risk assessment/inspections have been completed as well as a Part 58 Environmental Review with the Koochiching County HRA and St. Louis County Planning. Plans to remediate environmental risks from lead, asbestos, underground storage tanks and radon have been created to remediate the building's environmental issues and ensure healthy living conditions.

The Alexander Baker Building and portions of the Backus building were LIDAR scanned and 3D modeled to provide accurate information for the project architects and engineers to plan the rehabilitation of the building and create construction documents. Excitingly, with a spring/summer construction start in sight, the project has recently gone out to contractors for bid. Anticipating a 12-18 month construction period, we hope to see the building begin a new life on its 111<sup>th</sup> year as a fixture in the landscape of our community.

## **Executive Director's Report**

2022 was a year of learning and growth for Backus. Please review the highlights, below:

### Quarter One:

- Rainy Lake Community Orchestra officially became a part of the Backus Music Program.
- Backus purchased a 24' enclosed trailer for IFalls Ruby's Pantry for external storage for supplies and equipment. IFRP to reimburse Backus in full.
- Doors installed and construction completed in Room 304. This will be the space where music lessons will be taught.
- Staircase wall sheeting project was completed. This was done to protect the crumbling plaster and prevent further damage to the walls.
- Grant application submitted by Steve Crosby to Cenex Corporation for \$25,000 for Community Café.

#### **Quarter Two:**

- All fire safety equipment, kitchen, and general building inspections completed on schedule.
- Environmental studies conducted in the AB building for radon, asbestos, and lead.
- Community Café distribution guidelines implemented to help ensure sustainablility of the program. One meal per person served. Carry-out service will continue.
- West Bend Insurance conducted a full building inspection and noted only that the kitchen exhaust fan should be scheduled for cleaning.
- The new Americann rented storage space for inventory items for the new hotel (televisions, refrigerators, microwaves, bedding, etc.).
- The Red Cross had a strong presence in the Backus building providing temporary evacuation services and emergency shelter. The Red Cross was stationed in Backus and provided a variety of emergency services to people affected by the 2022 Rainy Lake flood.
- Backus staff volunteered regularly to fill sandbags and to help local families.
- Summer Food Program began in June. Attendance was lower due to program change requirements from MN Department of Education (dine-in only).

### **Quarter Three:**

- Backus made an agreement with the AB Partnership to heat the Backus building with the old boiler system for the 2022/2023 heating season.
- Building painting was completed in room 101, the former art room, west entrance hallway.

## Executive Director's Report (continued)

#### Quarter Three, continued

- Music lessons began. Ukulele and guitar, strings for youth.
- Local bridge clubs continue to meet at Backus to play.
- The newsletter became a one sheet, monthly publication.
- The auditorium floor was waxed.

#### **Quarter Four:**

- Painting completed on west side of building. Exterior door and large wooden panels on exterior of the building painted dark brown. East door also painted.
- The railing above the alcove window well was replaced.
- Backus partnered with AEOA to distribute shelf stable meal packages and frozen dinners to Community Café recipients.
- A Community Theater script reading of "It's a Wonderful Life" was a tremendous success.
- New boilers arrived on Wednesday, November 30.
- Backus actively volunteered at the Thanksgiving Day Community Dinner and at the Community Christmas Parade.
- The Community Christmas Day Dinner was held and all donations were given to Backus Community Center.

Over the course of the year, the Backus team and the Alexander Baker Partnership continued with preparations for the anticipated sale and development of the Alexander Baker building. There were many environmental and structural studies conducted in the AB building. Easement requirements for shared access between the Backus and AB buildings were discussed and agreed upon. Projects for both entities that involve asbestos removal and electric transformer work that could be managed by a common provider were discussed and noted. Backus leaders continue to be involved in bi-weekly phone calls with the AB partnership to discuss necessary subjects and planning. All parties look forward to closing with great optimism.

2022 brought new tenants to the Backus building. Rainy River Rugrats day care, the Oberholtzer Foundation, the Koochiching County Veterans are all at home at Backus. Backus continues to serve and have a strong presence in our community through its programs (music, theater, and broadcast) and food services (Community Café and Summer Food). Backus is also a popular venue for community events, banquets, and meetings. Our catering service is a positive offering for customers. *Submitted by Lois Lundin, Executive Director*







# **Endowment Fund**

Since 1937, the historic Backus building has been a community gathering place, first as a school and, since 2002, as a Community Center playing a vital role in the lives of many who live in and visit the area. Now an effort is underway to ensure the same holds true for generations to come.

Citizens concerned with the sustainability of Backus and its Community Center programs gifted funds to establish an endowment fund. A committee was formed to outline plans and goals for the fund and its future. The endowment campaign is an effort to raise \$1 million in three years. Major donors have already contributed significantly to the fund.

The fund is established to provide effective and responsible stewardship and to ensure expansion of community work. The fund can accept gifts and bequests in wills, charitable trusts, gift annuities, assignments of life insurance, and transfer of property (cash, stock, bonds, real estate, etc.). Backus endowment will accept pledges for annual gifts. Contributors can dedicate gifts in memory or honor of a family member or friend. If physical assets are received, they will be liquidated as outlined in the fund's by-laws.

All "In Memorial" gifts and donations that are directed to Backus, unless otherwise designated, are directed to the Endowment Fund.

Once the three-year goal of \$1 million is reached, earnings may be expended to fund programs and projects that help fulfill the Backus mission, such as:

- Outreach programs to address community needs and opportunities in International Falls and Koochiching County.
- Ensuring the preservation and re-use of the historic Backus building continues in perpetuity.
- Allowing flexibility in times of economic down-turns or major crisis.

The Endowment Committee continues with its efforts to promote and grow this program for Backus's long term future.

**Advertising Options -** Facebook, newspaper, email blasts and new format for Backus newsletter are options. Newsletter will now be a monthly letter & shorter format. Request went to members for updated email addresses.

AB Space Clean Out - Harry Batdorf led this effort and was successful in disposing, selling, moved & removed items. AB is getting ready for new owners.

**Boiler Project** - New boilers for Backus has been ordered & delivered. Installation will be coordinated with AB project since heating system will have to be separated. Relocation & upgrade of transformer will go inside basement new current electrical controls as approved by City Inspector.

AB Water & Sewer Line - Per recommendations from AB planning committee, City Inspector, and architect consultant, Jim Lucachick, the AB complex will have an independent sewer/water line which will be installed and run thru Backus basement to City connections. AB project will be responsible for installation, costs & maintenance of the water/sewer line.

**Strategic Plan** - Review of completed previous Strategic plans and accomplishments. Discussions held on suggestions, improvements needed, and a facilitator to help set priorities and complete a new 3-5 year plan. Members agreed to continue in Fall '23 due to boiler & AB project and staff shortage.

**Endowment Fund -** Memorial funds are being added to Endowment Fund. Committee activity slowed this year due to Rainy Lake flood issues. Funds continue to be invested in CD at Border Bank, which offered best investment rate. Fund balance is approximately \$144,000. Donations are welcome!



### **Backus Programs**



2022 was a year of rebuilding and regrowth for the **Borealis Bards.** The Bards and Backus leaders partnered to develop goals and expectations to help build the program. # Backus Programs, cont'd

The Backus Music Program operates in conjunction with our local school districts and private teachers to make music education more accessible to our community. Students of all ages are able to learn to play music with on-site teachers. Lessons are offered for guitar, ukulele, banjo, violin, viola, cello, bass violin, piano, and others. Backus is committed to bringing in instructors as requests are presented from the community. Backus music partners with teachers from the Indus, Littlefork, and International Falls school districts to conduct all school music festivals. The Backus Music Program is also looking forward to a Summer Arts Week in 2023! Summer Arts was cancelled in 2022 due to the flooding conditions that were affecting area families and the greater needs that presented to protect and preserve homes. We will look to host classes for visual and musical arts for area children.

### Ruby's "Pop-Up" Pantry

Ruby's Pantry opened its doors in International Falls in July 2015 and continues to have a very strong presence in Borderland communities. On the second Monday of each month, the an average of 17 tons of food are unloaded at Backus to be distributed to area residents. All of the food is brought in to the auditorium and prepped into "shares", and then sent out to guest's vehicles. Area organizations who also have needs for food items come at the end of the distribution to collect items that are left. Waste is minimal.

Food shares continue to be very generous and contain quality items. Many people share the food they receive with others. It is common to hear about people who gather with their neighbors and divide the food amongst households.

Benefits to our Northern Minnesota communities don't end with the food that is distributed. Benevolence dollars from each share are allocated to organizations across Koochiching County. To date, Ruby's Pantry has given more than \$35,000 to area charities and non-profits.

This year, the International Falls Ruby's Pantry leaders purchased an enclosed trailer to store all equipment and supplies that were once stored in the AB school. The trailer is brought to Backus each month and the contents are unloaded and used for the food distribution. At the end of the night, the supplies and equipment are loaded up again and the trailer is stored off-site. This has served our local Ruby's Pantry team well.

# **Backus Community Cafe**

Backus Community Café: Dedicated to reducing hunger and building a stronger community.

The Backus Community Center is very well known across our region for the support services that are available to area residents. Backus is home to two key meal programs. Backus's Community Café serves free, hot, nutritious meals to all guests on Tuesday and Thursday evenings all year. All meals are served "to go", and each person is allowed one meal. Many guests pick up and deliver meals to others who are shut-in or who are unable to pick up food. Community Café helps to address hunger and isolation. Café promotes improved mental health, improved physical health, and a stronger community.

Community Café is supported with generous help from many teams of committed volunteers. Groups schedule specific weeks each year where they can come help dish food, package the "to go" containers for pick-up, and then bring the meals to waiting guests. Our volunteers enjoy working together for the good of our community. They value having the opportunity to meet new people and to help where there is a need. The Backus kitchen is a busy place on Café nights, but there is no shortage of laughter and goodness there.

Community Café continues to serve meals as carry-out. The cooks and crew at Backus shop for food from a variety of vendors, being very mindful of the budget while choosing quality foods that are appealing and that encourage people to eat. The cooks pay close attention to providing meals that promote balanced food groups and appropriate portions.


## Summer Food Program


The second key meal program offered at Backus is the **Summer Food Program**. Area children can come to Backus each week day during the summer months when school is not in session and have a hot, nutritious lunch for free. Clients of our homeless shelter and the food shelf are also welcome to participate for free. Childhood hunger is a very real issue in our communities today. Backus is committed to helping by providing lunch through the Summer Food Program.

Changes to the 2022 Summer Food Program brought a significant reduction in the number of children served. During the summer months of 2020 and 2021, Summer Food Programs were allowed to provide meals for pick-up and carry-out. In 2022, when pandemic conditions subsided and society was returning to "pre-covid" life, the Minnesota Department of Education reinstituted the requirement that all Summer Food Programs provide dine-in service only. The number of children served was still good, but the total number served was significantly less for 2022. The high number of working parents who utilized the service for their children who were at home during the work day found the dine-in requirement to be challenging for the amount of time they had available. Backus will continue to have discussions with representatives from the Summer Food Program about the impact of this change and will seek viable solutions that can help area children.

One of the great joys that the Backus staff and volunteers experience is watching area youth grow up. Friendships form between the Backus team, parents, and the kids over the summer months. The kids enjoy all of the food types offered; there is rarely waste. "Taco in a bag" is still a favorite! This is a great support service for the families that Backus serves.
