


Borealis Bards have musical hit with new directors

KCC-TV receives funding for new equipment

For 20 years, KCC-TV has been one of our community's greatest links to what is happening in and around International Falls. Today, people have very timely access to view local government, school board and many organization's meetings as well as community events and happenings. People can access KCC-TV via the KCC-TV channel on YouTube, on the Backus website, Facebook, and on local cable channel 7.

In March of this year, the KCC-TV equipment that pushed broadcast out to Midco failed. The antiquated computer equipment had been "Frankensteined" many times and it simply couldn't take any more. When our technicians deemed the system was beyond repair, it was time to invest in new equipment.

With the generous help of the **City of International Falls Economic Development Authority**, Backus purchased new equipment for KCC-TV. It was very evident to the City and to Backus that this was an essential service to the citizens of our community. The equipment we selected meets our needs, came with a few consumer requested upgrades and has capacity to be enhanced in the future when funding will support it.
