- The **Backus building** looks great inside and out. We're in the planning stages for a few projects that we want to see happen. We expect to know the status of KOOTASCA's funding application in December for the purchase of the AB School.
- Our Backus tenants are all welcoming clients, so there is more business activity in the building each day. Community Café continues record-setting pace!


The current average number of meals served on Café nights = 237.






Mr. John Faith



Looking back, this assignment was to draw how we would adapt walking through deep snow. I was in Kindergarten, Mrs. Wagner was my teacher. We had the classroom with the fireplace on the first floor of the AB building. We drew these portraits on the floor and they were hung at the end of the



hallway for everyone in school to enjoy. I was the oldest in the class, but when I drew myself treading through the snow, I ended up being the smallest of everyone.

It was fun back then. We had a private entrance to the school yard from our classroom. There was a kickball field right out the door and a playground over by the Forestland building. The entire block was fenced in for recess. Today, when I am walking through AB it is eerie to see it empty and quiet. When I was young there were kids everywhere and there was always noise. One day soon, I hope to see it lively again.


