Presidents Report

Hello woodies.

Seymour has come and gone but work continues unabated. The groups are very busy preparing for Easter with emphasis on replenishing toys.

Easter timetable is as follows:

- Thursday 29th March: bump in, 1:00pm to 5:00pm.
- Friday 30th March & Saturday 31st March: open door 9:30am, close door 5:30pm.
- Sunday 1st April: open door 9:30am, close door 6:00pm.
- Raffle drawn at 3.00pm

NOTE: The show timings are 10am to 5pm. An extra 30 minutes before and after are for set up and for the close down each day. 1hr has been allocated for the Sunday to pack and clean up.

As usual members can begin to bring items in from 3.00pm onwards. Reminder that parking is restricted within the confines of the hall. So if you have to bring your vehicle in then you can drop your items, move you vehicle out then come back and setup. Some passes will be issued but these are for the vehicles who deliver the club equipment. Given that there will be more space available this year, the layout may be a little different to last year. We will keep that as a surprise on the day. More details at the next general meeting which will be held Monday before.

First Aid: In previous years, David Barber arranged formal First Aid (level 2) training for the club to ensure sufficient members were up-to-date with skills and knowledge. These courses were conducted every 3 years followed by refresher CPR every year. The training was partly delivered by a few of our members and subsidised by the club to reduce costs but we still needed 13+ people to reduce the costs even further. After some discussion, the committee voted to not proceed. Instead, it was proposed that informal training/information sessions would be conducted during the year and conducted at the general meetings. This would ensure as many members are made aware of current First Aid requirements that are relevant to our club environment. More information to come as to when these sessions will be conducted. My thanks to David Barber for his efforts in arranging these courses in the past.

Fund raising: The items (toys) made for the *Hispanos Unidos de Victoria* have now been collected and paid for. It is quite likely that we will be requested to produce more in the near future I wish to thank the team, Arthur Curnick, Robert Trigg, Steve Field and Robert Mason and helpers. These projects, as well as the Easter and other raffles, the Bunnings BBQ's and activity evenings held throughout the year, contribute to the fund raising efforts from all our members. These projects and activities are vitally important as all additional funds collected ensure the current subscriptions can be kept as low as they are now.

Kitchen/clubhouse: The roster was raised at the last general meeting for members to consider an alternative. In its current format the roster does not work. Therefore, until another option is presented, I believe that only one person is required to perform each of the duties. So from this month on, only one person for each duty will be nominated. We can review this after a couple of months or until a better option is presented.

Security: During the last couple of weeks, one of the containers and some clubroom lockers were found to be insecure. Please ensure that if you are the last one out, you double check that all locks are secured. It is everyone's responsibility and not just the key holders.

Bunnings: The club held a BBQ at Bunnings last Saturday and even though it was not a very busy day, we still managed to return a good profit for the club. Also attended the Easter activity evening on Thursday with a good turnout from the members. Photos later in newsletter.
