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## **Secretary's Report**

Well, another year has passed albeit with all the problems and nuisances of Covid19 restrictions continuing.

The pandemic has caused the Club to shut its doors a few times through the last 12 months and restrict numbers in attendance for the greater part of the last 12 months also. Needless to say, the Club has survived.

The Club currently has 71 members with our membership fluctuating each year, but over the last 5 years or so the membership has always seemed to end up around the 70 mark. Our Tuesday morning group usually has between 20 and 30, and Thursday mornings between 15 and 20. Covid19 restrictions have limited our attendance in the Clubrooms to a maximum of 20 at any one time. Attendance at hands-on evenings is probably down but again Covid is a major reason for this.

Hopefully once the State gets to 80% vaccinations the chance of lockdowns will disappear and everyone will feel more confident in attending.

In the last 12 months the only major activities we attended were:

- Club Christmas Sales in Clubrooms (2 weeks of December 2020)
  - Eventhough we reduced the sales to 2 \* 5 business day weeks our sales were excellent. We will probably do the same format this year.
- Australia Day – Cancelled
- Easter
  - Very successful 3 days at our new location in the Trades Hall on View Street
- Seymour Alternate Farming Expo
  - Dates were pushed back from February to mid-April
  - Not as many exhibitors but still a very successful event for the Club
- Sheep & Wool Show – Cancelled the day before
  - This was a major blow to the Club, but many other people suffered far worse than us financially.
- CraftAlive – Postponed to a date to be advised

The major concern for the Club with the cancellation of many events is that we did not have the opportunity to sell raffle tickets for either our major raffle or mid-year raffle. Fortunately, this loss of income was offset by money raised at 6 Bunnings Sausage Sizzles that we have had between 14<sup>th</sup> November and 4<sup>th</sup> July that accrued over \$5,000.00 for the Club. I will also thank Bunnings for their generosity of donations to the Club that are probably worth about \$1,000.00 in the last 12 months also.

In the last 12 months many of us have been busy in improving the Club with the following work either completed or nearing completion:

- Retaining wall along Eastern fence line
- Concrete paving from side gate to rear steps
- Water proofing of back wall of Club
- New covered area in top work area including concrete slab
- General tidy-up of all storage in top area

I thank everyone who assisted in these works.

There are many other members to be thanked for the work they have done for the club including the following:

- Arthur Curnick for putting out the bins weekly
- Patrick Curtis and his team for our ground maintenance

- Malcolm Hill and team for equipment maintenance, and
- David Barber for keeping the Club kitchen stocked and looking after raffle prizes at monthly meetings
- Jeff Willey for the work he has put in to applying for government grants
- Maurie Chelman for sharpening chainsaw chains
- All the volunteers at our Bunnings Sausage Sizzles

This Club continues to be very successful and happy place for all of us to enjoy ourselves and I'm sure this will continue.

Finally, thank you to the President, committee and members who have assisted me in the last 12 months and hopefully the coming year will be even better.
