Minutes:

- Meeting called to order by Travis Bandy with confirmation of quorum met
- Travis moved to accept the meeting minutes from March 15, 2025 be accepted as written; and all present were in favor, none opposed
- Treasurers Report
 - o Approximately \$35,000.00 in checking account.
 - Annual expenses/audit and updated budget to be developed and confirmed:
 - Confirm whether we must legally have an auctioneer to conduct the fur sales. Auctioneer cost is approximately \$400.00/year
 - Per the NTA attorney, we are better off staying a 501c6 instead of changing to a 501c3.
 There is no benefit to the VTA for changing status.
- Membership Report:
 - Derek provided membership report spreadsheet and update via email
 - o Currently 371 members, 116 life members with post and 78 life members with no post
- General Organizer Report:
 - New member Orion Mustard recruited and volunteered to be General Organizer starting January 1, 2026
 - o For 2026: proposed amendments to VTA bylaws for future discussion & voting:
 - to remove coordination of the fur sales from General Organizer to President

- to add coordination of state convention to General Organizer annually in June (discussed importance of making conventions the same time of year and locations)
- to add coordination and management of on-demand website for VTA merchandise to General Organizer

NTA Report:

 The convention this year was a success, Craig thanked all for their help. Next year's convention will be held in Richmond, Indiana

FTA Report:

- The convention went well though Travis was unable to attend. They will look to hold their future conventions more spread out relative to timing of the NTA convention.
- Votes held and confirmed by all present for the following:
 - Any DWR furbearer biologists and/or CPO's interested to be sent to Trapper's College in 2026 paid by VTA
 - VTA to pay for sending Trapper Training Coordinator to Trapper's College in 2026

Training Coordinator Report:

- Reviewed latest completed classes held and upcoming classes on calendar of events on website and social media
- Encouraged all involved with training classes to register with DWR as a volunteer. This
 enables DWR grants and funding validation with Pittman-Robertson Act and other funding
 sources.
- New projector and laptop is needed. Craig to donate the projector, and new Coordinator (David) to use his laptop for classes.
- Vote held and confirmed by all present for the following:
 - The cost for training patches in the Master Trapper award program to be paid by the VTA in lieu of the applicant.
- Training Grant funding needs to be applied for 2026
- Training Courses for 2026 need to be scheduled

Committee Reports:

- o Ways & Means: Budget report and forecast needed
- Website:
 - Videos from FTA demo's will be used and uploaded on website
 - Biology of furbearers are being uploaded and shared via blog, site and social media
 - Need three VTA banners for use at various events
 - Need button up shirts for VTA position holders to wear at events
