

1. EDU Program; Our Reflections of Vietnam Artifact display was taken to three locations this past quarter. We presented at two high schools in October and at Rawhide Boys Ranch. Thousands of students were able to view the artifacts we have in the 90-foot display and ask questions of the Veterans. We also go on stage at each school and give a brief presentation covering where we served and what we did while we were in Vietnam.
2. We also had our annual Vietnam Veterans Fund Drive the weekend of September 20-21. All the donations are funneled to the many Veteran projects that we support as a Chapter.
3. Over a dozen members participated in our November nursing home visits which were scheduled around Veterans Day. We will assemble another group to do visits next year around Memorial Day.

Our Reflections of Vietnam display was highlighted at the Military Vehicle Preservation Association Convention at the EEA grounds in Oshkosh on September 12<sup>th</sup> through the 14<sup>th</sup>. There was a good crowd from all over the United States and some foreign countries that attended which gave us great exposure. Many individuals asked if we would be willing to bring the display to their State.
5. On Veterans Day, November 11<sup>th</sup>, our Chapter was recognized by the Veterans Village in Appleton for our donation of a marble bench in front of their office building. It was part of the dedication ceremony and ribbon cutting for their new "Courtyard of Honor". Veterans Village has several apartment buildings and furnishes very nice one or two bedroom apartments for veterans to rent at low rates.
