

Overview of National Board meeting 4-18-20-2024

Finance Report meeting at Thursday night 4-16 reported that the Life Membership Fund will be good through 2025.

A motion to increase Per Diem from \$50 to \$60 effective 6-1-2024. This passed.

Board meeting 4-19.

President McManus reported new reporting times for board meetings will enable the board to end meetings on Saturday by noon. Too many State Presidents must leave on Saturday.

Vice President Burke reported updated information on the Leadership Conference being held in August in Reno. Info and registration forms are on the National Web site. Treasurer Reynolds stated his report is in the packet.

Secretary Meeks reported that there has been good response on election and finance submissions.

AVVA -Hodge reported that their budget has been approved. Their Survivor Benefits brochure is going to print.

CSCP- Brick reported that Vet Centers are no longer providing counseling to Veterans' spouses.

Household Goods -Butcher reported revenue is up 9%.

Veterans Benefits – Harris reported that VVAs' Appellate Program cases have been outsourced to the Law Firm of Bergman and Moore. 438 cases were transferred. 168 cases have been finished.

Government Affairs-McCormick reported various bills that have been introduced. For one they want to remove the 12-mile restriction. The Navy still has not improved their water filtration system. A bill has been introduced to reinstate the 48-hour rule to allow claims representative to review claims decisions before they are final.

Membership-Kennedy stated there are 3700 new members, our membership is now at 91,285 and AVVA is at 10,858.
