Dear Student:

Thank you for applying for this scholarship. We hope this will be a learning experience for you and an opportunity to win \$1,500 for your education. Three (3) scholarships will be awarded in Wisconsin. To be eligible you must interview a United States Vietnam Veteran, who was on active duty during the Vietnam War (1 January 1959 to 7 May 1975). The Veteran may have served in any branch of service, <u>anywhere</u> in the world; *serving in the country of Vietnam is <u>not</u> a requirement.*

These scholarships are funded by Vietnam Veterans of America Wisconsin State Council. We want <u>you</u> to gain a deeper understanding of the U.S. military Veteran from the Vietnam Era. You could focus on, but are not limited to the veteran's job, where he or she was stationed, how the Veteran feels about his or her service, and how that service has affected his or her life today.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP

- Interview a U.S. Military Veteran (any service branch) who served anywhere in the world between 1 January 1959 to 7 May 1975.
- Write an essay based on the interview.
- The essay must be: original, typed, double spaced and three (3) to five (5) pages in length.
- The essay, application, school transcripts and proof of Veteran's service*, must be mailed and <u>post-marked</u> no later than 18 February 2019.
- * Special Note Veteran's proof of service can be a copy of the Veteran's DD214 <u>or</u> verification of service from a County Veteran Service Office (CVSO), Tribal Veteran Service Officer (TVSO) <u>or</u> another approved official document (see Frequently Asked Questions).

Entries that do not meet these requirements will not be considered.

What you learn from the interview and how you express your ideas is most important to the judging committee. Your entry will be scored based on <u>originality</u>, <u>appearance</u> and its <u>elements of grammar</u>.

High School Scholarship recipients will be notified according to the policies of their respective school's May awards/scholarships program. A check for \$750 will be issued before the fall 2018 semester, upon receiving a copy of the fall course registration. At the end of the fall semester, satisfactory grades (2.00 GPA or better) and spring course registration must be submitted to the VVA WSC Scholarship Committee for the release of the \$750 scholarship balance for the spring semester. Winning students and their parent(s) will be invited to the Wisconsin State Council's quarterly meeting(s) to read their essays, at their convenience, dates and time to be determined.

VVA WSC SCHOLARSHIP FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

What is a Vietnam Veteran?

A Vietnam Veteran is any U.S. military veteran who served on active duty between and including 1 January 1959 to 7 May 1975.

Can I interview someone who did not have a combat role?

Yes, most military jobs do not involve direct combat actions.

Can I interview a Vietnam Veteran who did not serve in South Vietnam?

Yes, the VVA believes that all U.S. Veterans who served during the Vietnam War share a common bond and experience.

Can I interview one of my parents?

Yes, you may interview anyone who meets the criteria of U.S. Vietnam Veteran.

One of my step-parents is a Vietnam Veteran, can I interview that parent? Yes.

What proof do I need to provide that I am related to a Vietnam Veteran? A copy

of your birth certificate and the Veteran's proof of service.

Can I interview someone who was in the National Guard or Reserves?

If the Veteran served more than six(6) months in <u>active duty</u> during the above dates, you may interview them.

What kind of document is needed to prove that the person I interviewed is a Vietnam Veteran?

You need to provide proof of service for the person you interviewed. In most cases, veterans have a copy of their DD214 (service record) or a copy of their discharge orders. If the veteran does not have proof of service they can contact their County Veteran Service Officer (CVSO), Tribal Veteran Service Officer (TVSO), or other Service Officer within a Veteran Service Organization (VSO) (e.g., American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, etc.). To locate a CVSO or TVSO in your county go to http://wicvso.org/locate-your-cvso/. Will I be notified if I do not win?

No, due to the large number of entries, we cannot let everyone know their status. However, if you want to be notified that we received your entry, you may include a self-addressed envelope with your entry, and we will notify you that your entry was received.

I am a Wisconsin resident, but not attending school in Wisconsin this year, am I eligible?

No, the scholarship is for Wisconsin high school seniors and Wisconsin continuing education students attending accredited Wisconsin schools only.

I am not attending a college or university; will I be eligible for the scholarship?

Yes, you may attend any <u>accredited</u> Wisconsin school.
