Fellowship Period: August 1, 2013 – July 31, 2014.

Eligibility: The primary criterion for selection is evidence of ongoing scholarship in the study of economic inequalities and disparities between racial and ethnic groups. Applicants must complete all requirements for the doctoral degree by August 2013. Preference will be given to individuals who are within five years of their degree, but more senior applicants will be considered.

To the Fellowship Selection Committee:

I am writing in support of Inert Lerzer's application for an NSF Fellowship. Inert is genuinely a gifted student with great potential as a research scientist. I encourage you to give her your most careful consideration.

This domain is thought to play a role in forming a double-helical structure of T that facilitates appropriate interaction with viral DNA sequences at the replication origin. We believe that differences in the consensus sequence of the JCN T protein zinc finger affects its ability to efficiently replicate the viral genome and to establish latency.
