

## **JSS FINANCIAL AID 2025-2026**

The Financial Aid Committee of the Judy Sharp International School advises parents requesting grants that the policy and procedures used in determining financial aid are set and supervised by the Judy Sharp Foundation's Board of Directors. The Financial Aid Committee reviews all applications and administers the awards to families who demonstrate a need for financial aid.

## 1. Eligibility:

Good academic standing.

Good social behavior,, which includes

- Consistent satisfactory marks in effort and behavior
- No serious infraction of school rules.
- Records will be reviewed at the end of the first semester.

Demonstration of financial need based upon, but not limited to, parents' income tax returns and the attached Application for Financial Aid Form.

## 2. Forms Required

Application for Financial Aid

Income Tax Returns:

- US citizens or families residing in the US for the past fiscal year:
  - 1) IRS 1040 Form—signed photocopy with all schedules and attachments
  - 2) US citizens residing in Spain must also submit Spanish income tax returns.
- Spanish citizens and other nationalities residing in Spain:
  - 1) Impuesto sobre la Renta de la Personas Físicas
  - 2) Impuesto de Patrimonio
- Non-Spanish or US citizens must submit appropriate documents from their country.

After all the completed documents and information are reviewed and analyzed, a decision will be made to offer or deny financial aid, and notification will be sent to the families.

Parents are encouraged to include an explanation of any extenuating circumstances about which they wish the Financial Aid Committee to be aware. All information is strictly confidential. Also, please be advised that financial aid is awarded for one academic year only and must be reapplied for on an annual basis. However, if funds allow, it is JSS's policy to continue granting financial aid as long as the need remains.
