Ventsislav Stoykov, General Overseer of the Bulgarian Church of God and Senior Pastor of Crossroads Church in Bulgaria. Our Hands of Hope Bulgarian Project Director and inspiration has been led by Nina Shull.
- **9. 2013 Hands of Hope Foundation Peru Outreach,** In May 2012 Hands of Hope helped sponsor RN, Edward Heath and the Amazon Promise Outreach team on a back packing medical mission to his native Peru. It was a powerful and life-touching mission.

- **10. 2013 Hands of Hope Foundation Bulgaria Outreach Trip,** We traveled there in June 2013. We have completed a project with Petko Slaveykov in the funding of the second "Little House" with Hope for the Little Ones Foundation. We look forward to partnering on more projects in the future with our partners from the Bulgarian Church of God in the Gypsy and Refugee camp areas.
- **11. 2013 Hands of Hope Foundation Thailand Outreach**, HOH Medical Director, Dr. Jeffrey & Sherrie Parks visit and create begin our relationship with Tamar Center and Hand to Hand Foundation in Pattaya, Thailand.
- 12. Hands of Hope Foundation Med-Surgical-Education Outreaches: 2011-2014, 2016, 2018, 2019 & 2022.
 - a. **Weala Medical Clinic Building-** Was built by the Norwegian UMC and left unfurnished and unequipped in 2010. This would inspire the 2010 HOH Team to come back with a Medical Mission focus in 2011.
 - b. **Weala Medical Clinic Launched during the HOH 2011 Trip.** We have continued Med-Surgical Mission outreaches in 2012-2014, 2016, 2018, 2019 & 2022. The 2015 trip was cancelled due to the Ebola Crisis.
 - c. **Weala Medical-Surgical Center broke ground in 2012.** During the 2012 trip a vision was cast to add a surgical center to the Weala Clinic and with a generous gift from Springfield First UMC, the Weala Mission Station project was launched and with several other generous gifts the \$70,000 plus project was funded. The Weala Medical Center was formally dedicated on March 15, 2014.
 - d. **Medical Supplies and Clinic Support:** From 2011-2024 and thanks to the gifts of generous donors and friends, we have provided operating funds, sufficient medicines and supplies to support day-to-day operations at the Weala Medical Center and recently begin supporting the clinic in the village of Boway.
 - e. **Medical-Supply Containers:** From 2010-2019, we have sent 12-40 foot ocean medical and educational supply container to Liberia to supply our operations. During the Ebola Crisis, we stepped up our efforts with our **Operation Hope: Liberia Ebola Response Campaign.** During this effort and through some great partnerships, and with the funds raised from **Hopefest 2014 &** our **Tour of Duty 2014 Concert Series,** we sent 5 relief containers in one year.

 Each of these ocean containers held hundreds of thousands of dollars of relief supplies for the Liberia work.
- 13. Hope Scholar Program: For the last 15 years Hands of Hope has had over a 150 students in our John Wesley PreK-12th Scholarship program and another nearly 50 students in our Hope Scholar Vocational, Collegiate & University program. In 2016-17 year, we unified our program to one Hope Scholar Program Elementary through University. As of 2024, Valerie Fry, HOH Education Director, celebrates that all of our students have completed the program and she has created the Hope Scholars Directors Fund to help those graduates transition to the next phase of their life as they move into their career tracks and begin shaping Liberia for decades to come. We are now exploring the launch of a new Hope Scholars Program 2.0 in 2025.
- **14.** Crusade & Church planting work in 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014 Village #7 (2011), Weala (2012-14), Village of Kpakoloyah (2012) and Jennet Town (2013 & 2014). In 2024, HOH with its COF Global Division is looking to begin a new level of church planting in partnership with our new COF Global Associate and Affiliate Churches.
- 15. Hands of Hope Foundation Liberia NGO (non-governmental organization): Was formed in 2013.
- **16. Community House Launched:** In 2012, we launched Community House, on the campus of Community of Faith Church. Community House is run today by our Executive Director and his wife, Rev. Dr. Troy & Beth Benitone. They serve as hosts to many of Hands of Hope's interns, partners and friends from around the globe, by providing respite and housing support for special ministry needs identified the Hands of Hope's team.
- **17. Rebuilt Churches:** We have partnered in rebuilding numerous war-torn and ravaged churches in the Weala Region at Freeman Reserve, Grimes Farms, C.D. Sherman, St. Thomas, Bong Mines and 2nd Kieyea-*located in the adjacent Gbanga Region*.
- **18. Weala Mission Station Power Plant:** In 2013 we sent a refurbished Detroit 160 KW Power Plant and power grid designed to power the School, Church, Medical-Surgical Center and District Center all at once. The generation was Christened at our March 15, 2014 Weala Medical Center dedication service thanks to generous donors and the great work of our March 2012-2014 HOH Engineer, Daniel Cook and his team. It was overhauled by our 2018-2019 team led by Rev. Steve McKeown and his team.
- **19. Safe Drinking Water Wells:** We have worked to add Safe Drinking Water Wells at St. Thomas, Salala, Totota, Village #7 and multiple wells at the Weala Mission Station—District Center, School and Medical Center.
- **20. Pastors' Motorcycles:** In 2012, 2014 & 2022, we have provided 4 Motorcycles for the pastors of some of our upstart churches in Salala, Village #7 and St. Thomas, along with the dean of students at John Wesley School.
- 21. Computers: Since 2012 & Thanks to many generous donors, especially John A. Logan, we have taken numerous computer systems for our churches, John Wesley School, Weala Medical Center & our Hope Scholars.
- 22. Operation Hope: Thailand 2014-2019: In July 2014, we took a small advance team to lay the grounds for a new partner-ship with 2 Thailand based ministries: Hand to Hand Foundation and The Tamar Center. In June-July 2015, we launched 4 new Community of Faith Churches in Thailand utilizing a new group of pastors we trained & equipped at 3rd Road, Soi 6, Tepparsit #7 and Gohpai #1. We have continued with outreaches in 2016-2019. Our Thailand churches are working under the support and covering of Community of Faith Church in Marion, IL in partnership with Hand to Hand Foundation and Tamar Center in Pattaya, Thailand.

- 23. For His Glory served as a special partner with Hands of Hope Foundation from 2014-2019: In 2014, FHG, joined the ranks of the Hands of Hope Foundation family. For His Glory, is a Christian Worship Ministry team led by Hands of Hope Foundation, National Director & FHG Director Joshua Benitone. FHG teams have served as our worship team for our Operation Hope Outreaches in Thailand and in leading our Tour of Duty and Tour of Hope Events in the USA. We look forward to a FHG reunion as we head back to Thailand in 2025.
- 24. Hopefest 2014, Operation Hope-Tour of Duty 2015 & Tour of Hope 2016: September 27, 2014 Hands of Hope launched a full-day relief concert event on the grounds of Community of Faith Church to provide support for the Ebola Crisis. Hands of Hope was back to its founding relief-event roots. In November, 2015, we held a 5 city-stop concert-relief event across the state of Illinois, called Tour of Duty. The tour was a part of our Operation Hope initiative with a goal of raising support to ship 5-6 containers of Ebola Relief supplies to Liberia. In 2016, For His Glory led a series of National-USA based concert events with other guest and nationally renowned Christian Artist to bring awareness and support to our Human Trafficking efforts with our partners in Thailand. This was led by our National Director, Joshua Benitone.
- 25. Thailand Pastors & Church Leaders School: In June 2017, we launched a 4 semester pastors & church leaders training program designed to equip a new group of nearly 26 pastors, using our indigenous Thai pastors with Dr. Benitone serving as the dean and organizer of the school. Session #2 & 3 was held in January 2018 & July 2018. With the final Session #4 completed in January 2019. We are leading new churches through indigenously trained & equipped pastors.
- **26. Maria-Irma-Harvey Relief Aid Campaign:** In September 2017, HOH went back to its beginning roots and led a campaign to support hurricane victims in Texas, Florida & Puerto Rico with 7 incredible partners across the Southern Illinois region.
- 27. Williamson County Excellence in Long-Term Care Recognition Program 2015-2019: These events recognizes outstanding leadership and provide a day of family encourage for those working in Long-term care.
- 28. Hands of Hope Foundation Winter Gala: On December 1, 2012, Hands of Hope Foundation held its first Winter Gala offering a celebration of its ministry year and held its final 8th Gala prior to COVID in December 7, 2019. The Gala has been on a break since. We hope to see it return in 2024-2025.
- 29. Project Hope: After a couple of years of dreaming & planning we launched our Project Hope—Hands of Hope Foundation's Sustainable Agricultural Plan during our Vision of Hope ask during our 2017 Winter Gala, we are working to raise funds for Phase I currently and continue our efforts and study into launching this project. One of our partner ministries Christian Life Church has a very successful project as of 2024 in year 4 in the Boway.
- 30. JFK Memorial Medical Center, Monrovia, Liberia Surgical Equipment Project: Dr. Jerry Brown, CEO of JFK & 2014 Time Magazine Man of the Year "The Ebola Fighter", requested our assistance in providing surgical equipment, furnishings and supplies to their newly renovated surgical floor to include equipping 8 OR's, Post-Op areas, ICU and other surgical prep areas. We sent 2-40 foot containers with equipment with help from our friends at Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach, Southern Illinois Healthcare (SIH) and others many friends and partners valued at nearly \$500,000.
- 31. HOH Family of Ministries is Born: In 2024, Hands of Hope Foundation becomes the Parent 501(c)3 non-for-profit corporation to two subsidiaries, with 3 more on the horizon in 2025 & 2026. The Herrin House of Hope (HHOH), a subsidiary 501(c)3 was handed over to us by the Herrin Ministerial Alliance in October 2024. HHOH serves the underprivileged of our region with feeding, education, job training and more. In May 2023, the Marion based, Community of Faith Church also reorganized from being a local church to the mother of a "Denominational Body & Network". By becoming a subsidiary to HOH, the two are building and forming a networking of Community of Faith Associate, Affiliate & Partner Churches to Grow Faithful Follower of Christ both in the USA, Africa, Asia and Beyond in the years to come. The new ministry covering this Global church effort is now called Community of Faith Global. In 2025, Hands of Hope is already at work to add some new regional ministries to the HOH Family, while in their pre-launch stage now, will certainly take center stage in Southern Illinois in the years to come. Working with the support of the Williamson County Emergency Management Agency (WCEMA) and Bi-County Health Depart with MOU's for Emergency Feeding, Shelter and Wellness Care— we have purchased the adjacent building to the Herrin House of Hope at 116 N. 14th St., Herrin, Illinois and are currently renovating and are preparing to launch the Hope Community Wellness "GAP" Clinic & "Mobile GAP" Clinic for a 2025 target, along with plans to stand up the Hope Emergency Shelter later in 2026.
- **32. Hope University & Theological Seminary, Liberia, West Africa**: In December 2024, we began partnering with a group of amazing spiritual & educational leaders in Liberia to launch a new university & seminary, starting with 4 undergraduate & 4 graduate schools. We are leading the effort in raising the capital funds, securing and preparing the campuses as trustees of this new work. (More info @ www.hopeuts.org)





HISTORY

Hands of Hope began as the vision of a single-event, gathering together a cluster of local churches in the Springfield area of Illinois in an effort, to raise resources to assist in the Hurricane Katrina-Rita recovery in August 2005. The Rev. Dr. Troy D. Benitone, then pastoring in Pawnee, II., was one of the co-coordinators of the event, and was inspired by God in developing the image and persona for the event which was "The Church living out its mandate to be God's Hands, Hands of Hope, to the victims of the disaster." Pastor Troy worked with an artist to develop the logo for that event called **Hands of Hope: Hurricane Katrine/Rita Relief Aid**. On October 9, 2005, the family-day concert event raised over \$35,000 worth of cash and relief items The items were sent to the relief efforts of the Hurricane Victims through the United Methodist Commission on Relief via the Midwest Distribution Center and Hands of Hope was complete.





In 2008, Rev. Benitone was asked by his superintendent for the Sangamon River District of the UM Church to lead a district-wide effort to fund the building of a District Center and Parsonage for a war-torn sister church in the Weala District of the Liberian Conference of the UMC of West Africa. Liberia had gone through a devastating 14 year civil war. Our district was partnered with Rev. Paye Cooper Mondolo, the Wealah district superintendent, and his people to help in restoring hope to the people of Liberia. When asked to take on the goal of raising \$51,000 for the building of a District Center and Parsonage, Pastor Troy having met Rev. Mondolo and working with Rev. Sylvester Weatherall and Springfield 1st UMC, Pastor Dr. Roger Ross, all church planters, struck an agreement with our District Superintendent Rev. Jerry King, that every dollar raised beyond the \$51,000 needed would go to crusade to establish new churches in the war torn district. We had a dream to do three! It was then that Rev. Benitone said it


was time for Hands of Hope to ride again. The logo was revised **Hands of Hope "Build from the Center", Sangamon River District Liberian** Initiative. This time an entire district of churches came together to celebrate their fund-raising efforts through another even larger and more powerful family day. This event surpassed the \$51,000 goal for the district center and exceeded \$135,000. Not only was the center built, but we rebuilt or upgraded 4 war ravaged churches and planted the three new churches. Rev. Benitone and Rev. Ross made trips to Liberia in 2009 and took a team of 13 in January 2010 to use the resources raised to fulfill the dream of holding the crusades and planting three new churches with Rev. Mondolo in the regions of Salala, Totota and Village #7 in Liberia. Those churches are thriving today.


Just months after returning from the 2010 crusades, Rev. Benitone became the Directing Pastor of Community of Faith Church, a non-denominational church located in Southern Illinois. During the transition Rev. Benitone shared his heart to continue this work with, Bishop, Gregory Palmer. With his blessing and with the invitation of the Liberian Bishop, John G. Innis, Rev, Benitone and the Elders of Community of Faith Church entered into an independent partnership with the Liberian church to continuing the work that God was doing in Liberia through Hands of Hope. By early 2010, the work in Liberia had grown to include not only new church crusades, but doors were opening to enhance the churches work through Christian education, providing safe-drinking water wells, and helping to re-establishing medical services to strengthen the life of the Church. It was clear Hands of Hope had moved way beyond a couple of events and now was a full-blown ministry drawing others to be God's Hands of Hope.

Back up in time! In 1996, when the Community of Faith Church established a Refuge Home to provide housing and living accommodations for up to six mothers and their infant children in order to help them become self-sufficient. The Refuge Home provided these services to any mother with one infant child without regard to race, creed or ethnic background in a Christ-centered environment that promoted life-affirming values. After years filled with many incredible success stories of changing lives, things changed. When the home began, there were very

few options to help a young girl facing the birth of Child, but by 2010 increased governmental welfare programs and services with little expectations made the Christ-centered alternative unattractive. In 2010, the Refuge Home Foundation shut down its operation.

During this time, the vision of **Hands of Hope** was flourishing in its new home at Community of Faith Church. In February 2011, Rev. Benitone took another education, crusade, new church building and medical mission team called Hands of Hope: Community of Faith, composed of 15 from several area churches. During that trip the Weala Medical Clinic was launched and we developed our John Wesley K-12 Sponsors program for over 50 children and our Hope Scholars program were birthed. During this trip a vision plan was developed for Hands of Hope to go to the next level in planting and building new churches, expanding the Christian School, supporting the Weala Medical clinic and so much more. It was on this trip that we decided to rename and purpose the former, Refuge Home Foundation, to give Hands of Hope a nongovernmental (NGO) faith-based 501@3 organization to build on. After seeking God's heart for wisdom, the Elders of Community of Faith Church, also acting as the Board of the former Refuge Home, renamed and purposed the ministry into one ready for the next level. What started as the inspiration for one event through the incredible blessings of God has become an epic in the making, with a bright future ahead, all for the glory of God. Today, Hands of Hope Foundation with a vision of Offering Hope in Christ in the spirit of 1 Peter 3:15 is the result. Today we have a whole new global look and you can see that new look below as we head into the next season.
