If you recall Mr. Greg Mathkey, WDNR Fisheries Manager for our region, was working on the recent Bass survey that is required in order for there to be a change in the Largemouth Bass regulations on Pickerel and Crane Lakes. Unfortunately, he has informed me that the results from the survey have indicated that there would not be a change in the regulations. Mr. Mathkey understands that this decision

will not be popular with most people but said that he is willing to try a pan fish survey next spring to see if the Bass population has had a negative effect on the pan fish population. I believe that we all agree that this type of survey may not aid us, but we will continue to monitor this situation.

On a more positive note, at our last meeting we spoke about the possibility of raising our own Walleye's on our Lake District property that has an artesian well and natural ponds that connect to both Crane and Pickerel Lakes. District member Mr. Brad Kupfer volunteered to explore the idea and is providing us an update in this newsletter. I'd like to thank Brad for his time

and helping to educate all of us in this possible new adventure. In closing, I would like to remind everyone to mark your calendars and plan on attending the next meeting on Saturday, September 3rd at 9:30 a.m. at the Ainsworth Town Hall. I know that it is Labor Day weekend and everyone has plans, but your input at these meetings is very important especially if you think the District Commissioners are not pursuing issues that are important to you. Walleye Project on Crane & Pickerel Lake

During a discussion at the Spring Meeting, the topic of Walleyes came up. Pickerel/Crane Lake often gets stocked with Walleye fry that are only $1\,1/8''$ long. The survival rate for these fish is very low; only 1 in every 300 fish will survive its first year. This spurred a suggestion that the Lake District look into possibly raising our own Walleye to a size that would greatly increase their success rate when released into the waters. If we could find a way to release 6-8'' Walleye into the water, the survival rate jumps from 0.3% to 40%.

Mr. Brad Kupfer from Crane Lake offered to research the possibilities. He has found that it is feasible to either purchase larger walleye from a private fishery or to take our allocations of fry and create our own ponds to protect and feed these fry to a larger size. Obviously, this is a complicated issue, and there are many things that need to be worked out. Brad will be at the Fall Meeting to present his findings.

It is our hope that you will come to this meeting to let us know if this is a project the board should pursue.
