

## Cleaning Procedures ☒

**Step 1: Cleaning/Prep** We can't clean the bounce house until we have prepped it first; we lay the bounce house down on a clean, waterproof tarp, and inflate. We remove any additional items like steps, banner, or netting so we can clean those separately. Next we inspect the full unit to address any problem areas, we check for: Moisture/dampness/wetness Mildew and Mold Dirt, mud, or grime buildup Physical damage (tears, rips etc.) Fading.

**Step 2: Dry Cleaning** Once we have done our visual assessment we remove any loose items that we find (socks, crayons, leaves, sticks.. you name it). We blow out any dust and dirt left behind.

**Step 3: Soap and Water** Sweeping, vacuuming, and brushing isn't enough to clean a bounce house. We need some elbow grease to keep our units looking great! We make our own cleaning solution using water, vinegar, and soap. (Bleach not recommended as it will cause discoloration). We scrub the whole unit from head-to-toe focusing on the grimy/dirty areas. We power-wash the soap off to ensure no soap/residue remains and dry with clean rags

**Step 4: Disinfecting** Once the bounce house is cleaned it's time to disinfect! If I wouldn't trust my kids to use it.. I wouldn't let your kids either! We use medical grade disinfectant for maximum protection! Germs, bacteria, and viruses can live in a bounce house if left ignored. We make sure the complete unit is disinfected focusing on areas where hands/faces go. We make sure to wipe down railings, stairs, landings, and walls.

**Step 5: Drying** This last step is probably the easiest! We let the bounce house sit in a sunny area until it is completely dry. If there are any areas that store water we dry them with a clean towel. The sun's UV rays are a powerful disinfectant against water pathogens. Once dry we fold and put away the unit in a cool, clean area for the next use.
