



To meet the requirements in the document will require that we move the records onto another media storage. The Senstar system is not designed to retain records that have specific retention requirements. Federal Elections and Incidents have different retention times and our strategy has been do download the footage to another storage media and maintain the record there.

For example, if we had an incident that we needed to capture. We would download the video and perhaps store the incident video in Laserfiche and set it up there to ensure we meet the records retention requirements for the incident. That generally is not a lot of video footage in disk space, so not too much of an issue.

Meeting the Federal requirement of 22 months with Terabytes of data to be retained is a whole different problem. It could potentially be housed in LaserFiche if the Disk space is there and the system can support large files. I think that is what we look at first. Laserfiche disk usage is billable and I have no idea at this point what 8 TeraBytes of data would mean to the Elections budget. The good thing about LaserFiche is that it is built to retain digital records and has many safeguards built into it.

The other option is to move the video to a local (USB?) drive and put it on a shelf. This does not have the protections that LaserFiche has built into it and there is the possibility that the video could be lost for many different reason prior to the expiration of the retention period.

I am adding Brent, Cori and Tom to this email to get their thoughts on moving the data into Laserfiche for storage. WE will want to purge the data after the 22 month retention and will need to involve records if we go this route.

Morning Team,

We could move the video files onto a USB drive. This is not my favorite option for a number of reasons. However, it is a cheap way to go. I have some other ideas for this as well...

Tom, could we look at procuring a lower cost storage media (such as NAS), for the purposes of storing digital media? Also, do you want to assign an engineer to work on a plan for this?

I understand from Brian that all of the video from the Presidential election came to under a TeraByte of data. That information is currently stored on our Storage Area Network disks. We could also look at procuring our Phase III security servers with a lot of extra disk space to store digital media? We have funding for the phase III project.

Also, I understand that retention is as follows. So every election we will need to work out a process with the Elections team to retain the data.

State elections – No Federal Candidates at 18 months

Federal Elections - 22 Months.

Brent talked about importing into LaserFiche and that the software would have some limitations. The largest being that you would still need to export the file from Laserfiche in order to view the video. I like using Laserfiche as it is designed to manage digital files for long term data management. i.e. we could set the retention on the files and make sure they get purged once the retention period is over. I would be open though to exploring this option as well if:

- 1. We can add cheaper storage to Laserfiche for Digital Media
- 2. We have a clearly defined and tested process for exporting digital media.
