Around the turn of the 20th century a Catholic Priest, Father Edward Howard Brown, became the resident priest in Juneau, in what was at that time the Territory of Alaska. I first learned about Father Brown when I hiked to a cross that bears his name, Father Brown's Cross. About 2.000 feet above Juneau there is a simple wooden cross overlooking the city. In the early years of the 1900s, Father Brown was not only ministering to the people of Juneau, he was also busily engaged in forging a trail up the nearby Mt. Roberts so that the people of the city would have access to some of the marvelous beauty that surrounded them. When he finished the trail he built a cross that would overlook the city. The cross has been rebuilt many times in the intervening years and now serves as a popular destination for those exploring Mt. Roberts.

I share this story for two reasons. First, when I laid eyes on the cross I was struck at the dedication to ministry that Father Brown must have had. After toiling under the building of this mountain trail he took the time to place a cross as a reminder that making the beauty of the natural world accessible to all was a part of his calling and a part of his ministry. While many of his parishioners worked day in and day out mining for gold or fishing on the rough waters, Father Brown spent much of his time exploring the simple beauty of God's creation.

The second reason I share this story is to invite each one of us to consider where we are going to raise a cross for all to see. Roman crucifixions were public spectacles, a way of showing everyone what would happen to those who defied the will of the empire. In faith we have taken that terrible cross and transformed it so that everyone who looks upon it may know the grace that led the Lord Jesus Christ to bear the burdens of our sins. So where are you going to raise the cross of Jesus Christ? Or maybe a better question; where are you going to show the grace and love of Jesus Christ to others in the everyday walk of your life?
