Pastor Casey's Message


One of the biggest takeaways for all of us these past few weeks is that no two people are experiencing this pandemic in the same way. Some are finding relief in the slowing down of the world, taking this as a time to rest and recover. Some are discovering that this is a great time to do things that they had been putting off. Others are struggling through unemployment. Some of us are mourning that normalcy that has been lost. Some are mourning the barriers to interpersonal connectiveness that had been so crucial in our lives only a few weeks ago. We are all experiencing this pandemic differently, but all of us are experiencing it profoundly.

In the mid-18th century a new holiness movement was spreading across England, and subsequently the colonies that the English had established around the world. This was the Wesleyan movement, though it was based on ideas cultivated over centuries. This new holiness movement brought some new ideas of theology, though if we are being honest, many of these "new" theologies were actually very old theological ideas that were simply being brought into a new context.

What made the Wesleyan movement so successful though wasn't its theology, it was its presence. The holiness movement followed the miners to work and set up shop in the cities amongst the poor. Wesleyan utilized leaders amongst the laity to form small groups that would be attentive to the physical and spiritual needs of its members. In other words, they focused on community. A central question permeated this community—"how is it with your soul?"

In our world, right at this very moment, our notion of community is being redefined. I don't pretend to know what our community will look like in the coming months. I do not know if our social distance will grow or shrink, I don't know if we will be embracing one another or shying away from each other. Our community is in the midst of a shift unlike any we have seen in recent memory. Some will find this shift a blessing, many will find it a trial, but I pray all of us see it as a reminder to go back to that one question that is of utmost importance—"How is it with your soul?"
