Good for the Bones

One of my favorite stories in the Bible appears in the Book of Ezekiel, one of the great prophets in Hebrew Scripture (the Old Testament). It's the story of the Valley of the Dry Bones. Ezekiel is led by the hand of the Lord: "He brought me out by the spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones." (37:1) It is a story of the life-giving presence of God, in this case, resuscitating and rejuvenating the whole people of Israel after the horrendous experience of the Exile (where many of the people had been uprooted from their homes and forced to live in Babylon). It is a story that, again, is about God's life-giving presence. God breathed new life into his people.

Some years back, I had the blessing of going to a talk given by Rabbi Harold Kushner, author of several books, among them When Bad Things Happen to Good People and How Good Do We Have to Be?. His focus was on the love and power of God to sustain and restore us. He said that our God always seeks to replenish us and will never leave us bereft of his love and strength. This, he said, is especially true when we experience hardships that have the capacity to take all our strength and hope. "God," he said, "accompanies us in all our struggles and lifts us up."

Sometimes faith can be approached too abstractly, yet scripture tells us that God cares for us completely, including times of physical deprivation and challenge. God cares for us right down to our bones, right down to our marrow. He is the one who gives us life and renews our life. God is concerned for our whole well-being.

A little exercise that brings this to mind is to stand in the sun, especially after a long, cold winter. It's as though the sunlight goes right down to the bones. As Ezekiel would say, it warms our sinews and muscles, too. As we are warmed by the sun of Spring, we do well to think of God's life-giving presence and let God envelope us... and remember that even on a cloudy day that God is with us to renew and sustain us with the light of his love found in our Lord Jesus Christ.
