 ${f T}$ he Temple in Jerusalem was a center of activity in the 1st century; it wasn't just religious activity, it was very much a center of city life. The Temple was a site of commerce and conflict, a place for religious festivals and political intrigue. But, if you begin traveling north from the Temple, you would soon find yourself on the outskirts of the city. Go north, pass through the Damascus Gate, turn right, and you would find yourself in a garden. Nearby you would see a series of tombs cut into the rock wall. places where the dead could be laid to rest. Perhaps what you would be most aware of however, if you had just come from the city, was how still the area must have seemed. There are no merchants or vendors buying and selling. There are no religious festivals or worshippers from across the reaches of the Empire. There are no young children playing about with their parents calling after them. In this garden there is stillness. In this garden there is quiet.

If you happened upon that garden on a certain spring morning in the first century you would have been witness to something magnificent. One of those tombs cut into the rock wall would be empty save for the graveclothes of its prior occupant. In the midst of the quiet stillness of the garden, the world was about to change.

Change is at the very heart of our Easter experience. The cross was changed from a symbol of oppression into a sign of great hope. The tomb was changed from a testament to death into a symbol of rebirth. Death was changed from a constant for all things into just one more thing that cannot stand in the way of God's desire for relationship with each and every one of us. The most authentic church is not the one that remains static from year to year, but rather the church that continues to embrace change while still proclaiming the Good News of Great Joy.

I was still in my first month of ministry, fresh out of seminary with a headful of ideas and some blissful ignorance regarding the politics of the local church, when a pastor in a neighboring church took me out to lunch. He told me something that I have now heard many times from many different people (I have shared these exact words on more than one occasion now myself). He told me "the 7 last words of every church before they close are always the same, 'We've never done it that way before.'"

Change can be a frightening thing, but as we see in the resurrection, change can also be the harbinger of a great new beginning. One of my goals this year is to get as many people in our church community as possible invested in the great new opportunities that God has set before us. I hope and pray that you want to be part of the new places this church will be growing into in the coming years. In many ways we are in the stillness of the garden right now. It is quiet, but it won't be quiet forever. Just as the stillness of the garden soon gave way to the hecticness of Pentecost, the stillness of this moment will soon give way to the abundant ministry God has in store for us.
