I would like to share a story and a confession with you. The story comes from my own childhood. It was Christmas morning and I, like many young children, couldn't wait to tear into my presents. I had woken up before anyone else was stirring, tiptoed into the living room, and gazed with awe at the wrapped gifts under the tree. The lights were off and the sun had not yet risen, but it was light enough to see the spoils of another successful Christmas. I would try to discern what each of my gifts must be by the shape and size of the wrapped boxes. I was never the kid who could just wait for something that I wanted. Even if I couldn't tear into that shinny wrapping paper, I just had to see it ahead of time. Just that glimpse, that hint of joy to come, was enough to hold me over to when my family would wake up and I could appease my curiosity.

Time for the confession; I have not changed. In the days and weeks leading up to Christmas my anticipation still sores. Heather knows that she has to hide my gifts because I will look for them. As an adult, Christmas gifts are much less of a surprise than when I was young. I usually at least have an inkling of what I will be opening on Christmas morning. There is a small corner of my brain that doesn't want to wait, doesn't want to anticipate, and earnestly desires to at least glimpse the joy of Christmas morning.

The season of Advent teaches us to wait. As someone who hates waiting, Advent teaches me to find joy in anticipation. As someone who greatly desires some instant gratification, Advent teaches me that holy things come to those who wait. It's why it causes me such great sorrow to see how little emphasis the world gives to Advent. The world ramps up to Christmas and forgets to enjoy the holy time of waiting.


This year has been given over to a great deal of uncertain waiting. I, and I suspect many others, have found the uncertain waiting to be a time of anxiety. I'd like to suggest that we view this year as a year-long Advent, a time of waiting while something holy is being born in our midst. As we close out one year and await the next, what holiness are you waiting to be born, what good news are you looking forward to sharing with the world?

All of us, in a sense, are tiptoeing around some beautifully wrapped presents. I pray that you join me in entering this period of holy waiting. I do not know how long this experience of waiting will last, but I know that the church has been preparing us for times such as these since the early Christians set aside a period of their lives to experience the celebration of waiting in eager anticipation, with one another, in order that they might experience profound joy that was entering the world.

We will begin with a two-step process:

# Step #1 pertains to only those who DON'T have a computer/and or e-mail address: If this pertains to you and you would like to continue receiving the newsletter by first class mail, please either:

- Call the church at 315-858-1553 and state that you do not have a computer/e-mail address, but would like to continue to receive the newsletter via first class mail. Also, please state the name currently showing on your newsletter mailing label.
- Or, send a note stating the above, to: Church Secretary, Church of Christ Uniting, PO Box 896, Richfield Springs, NY 13439

# Step #2 pertains to only those who would like to *DISCONTINUE* receiving the newsletter:

If you would like to **discontinue** receiving the newsletter all together, we'd greatly appreciate it if you would do one of the following:

- If you have a computer and e-mail address, please e-mail cocu@verizon.net and state your desire to discontinue receiving the newsletter, and also specify the name currently showing on your newsletter mailing label.
- If you don't have a computer/and or e-mail address, please call the phone number shown above, or send a note specifying you wish to discontinue receiving the newsletter. Again, please specify the name showing on your newsletter mailing label.

Our tentative deadline for the above two steps is February 1, 2021. After that, we will move onto the below final steps:

- Because we already have e-mail addresses for some who currently receive the newsletter, we will work on finding out if there are e-mail addresses for those remaining on the current newsletter list.
- Compile a list for those we have heard from that don't have a computer and/or e-mail address but wish to continue receiving the newsletter via first class mail.
