Regional Delegate Report, Buckeye 4/13/24

- WSC Conference Participants Webinar on 3/16/24, I was not able to attend fully, got some notes from tri-state RDA
 - Major takeaways:
 - Three topics were discussed, in preparation for the next WSC:
 - Collaborating on creating motions
 - Motions/proposals could be sent to the zone with an invitation for discussion and/or collaboration. Develop some kind of system to invite collaboration or signing on from a zone or more than one region.
 - Reshape how we build motions, allowing conference participants to come together to create motions. Service bodies work together to develop motions.
 - Create a discussion-based process that allows the conference to build consensus around ideas and develop proposals together.
 - Full WSC involvement and better use of the time between WSCs
 - Create motions or proposals and launch topics for discussion through the planning process, which begins at the WSC meeting.
 - Use the CAR survey as the sole mechanism for setting literature project priorities, rather than also having motions for specific literature pieces.
 - Hold WSC forums to discuss CAR motions to see which need to be in the CAR and which don't.
 - Determine what must be done in person and what can be done virtually.
 - Collaborative prioritization of motions
 - Form a workgroup to review, refine, and prioritize motions. advance
 - More pre-motion discussion to determine how much support a motion may have. If minimal support, the maker may decide to withdraw the motion prior to publication of the CAR.
 - Release all motions in of the CAR and have an online polling process to determine what gets included in the CAR.
 - Only conference participants can attend, due to high volume of participants

- RD participated in the virtual Zonal Planning Conference on 4/6/24 12pm-5pm
 - Major takeaways:
 - RD and MZF participated in small-group discussions with other zones on 3 IDTs (below). Issues considered included: impact of these topics on our ability to carry the message, impact in our Zone, and primary challenges that need to be addressed (detailed notes available on request)
 - Rise of harm reduction and DRT/MAT
 - “Mental Health in Recovery” and “In Times of Illness” provide valuable insight into this issue already, but we determined there is a greater need for tools and resources for welcoming members, especially those who come into NA by court order on MAT, or for those arriving via other alternative approaches to recovery
 - Development and Organization of Trusted Servants
 - We determined a greater need for Mentorship committees across all US Zones, as well as more resources and literature for mentorship in service
 - Impact and Rise of Virtual NA
 - We are working to transition fully into a “hybrid” age of NA. Need to balance virtual and in-person recovery, service, and member’s needs. Virtual is not a replacement, it’s an addition—we need to create strategies and messaging reflecting this, so as not to lose the value of in-person
 - Side topic: All Zones in attendance recognize a need to hold a planning session to reflect on the need for Zones, making Zones more attractive and valuable to the Regions we serve

OCNA AC Report

Hello family,

The Advisory Committee met to consider options for exercising corporate control over OCNA Inc. going forward. We considered a number of options and ultimately, we recommend that this regional body should vote to give specific authority to take action when needed. Currently we need to update OCNA's statutory agent. Upon a properly presented motion, this body could vote to give a member authority to file the appropriate paperwork with the Ohio Secretary of State. Additional motions can be brought and considered by this body if and when the OCNA AC deems it advisable. The statutory agent could be the regional chairperson, an OCNA AC member, or a member of the current OCNA convention committee.

As for progress on the conventions, both OCNA 40 and 41 are doing well. OCNA 40 made its initial \$8000 deposit with its hotel, and currently has enough funds to cover the remaining deposit-- about \$7,000. Their fundraising committee is active and the convention is on track to be financially successful. OCNA 40 needs people to purchase registrations, banquets and room nights. Please consider going this year.

OCNA 41 is off to a great start. All committee positions are filled, and the committee is functioning well. Hotel bids are being considered and a couple of venues have been visited.
