“THE BATTLE FOR RECOVERY” (REFINED VERSION)



OPENING FORMATION (5 MINUTES)

(Drum cadence. Soldiers march in slowly and form a line.)

COMMANDER: Attention!

(Sharp movement.)

At ease.

Tonight, you are not watching actors. You are witnessing survivors.

Every person on this stage fought a war they did not choose—
a war that tried to take their minds, their families, and their lives.

Addiction does not knock. It invades.
Recovery is not retreat. Recovery is enlistment.

This... is our story.



ACT I: THE WAR — BEFORE RECOVERY (20 MINUTES)

(Lights dim. Soldiers step forward one by one.)



SOLDIER 1

I didn't wake up one day and decide to be an addict. I woke up already defeated. I told myself I had control, that I was different. But addiction stripped me of rank, dignity, and direction. Every promise became another casualty. I learned how to lie with confidence and cry in silence. I wasn't living—I was surviving enemy fire.



SOLDIER 2

At first, it was quiet. It whispered that I deserved relief, that I earned escape. Then I was

surrounded. No exit. No backup. I called it independence, but I was abandoned by myself.



SOLDIER 3

I wore a mask like armor. Smiled while bleeding inside. "Tomorrow I'll stop," I said. Tomorrow never came. I lost years I can never get back. Addiction taught me how to disappear in plain sight.



SOLDIER 4

I thought silence was strength, so I carried pain like a loaded weapon. I drank, I used, I fought everyone except the real enemy. I called destruction freedom.



SOLDIER 5

It made me feel invincible—until it didn't. I lost housing, trust, and my reflection. I didn't recognize myself anymore. I thought death would be easier than surrender.



SOLDIER 6

I come from generations of trauma. Pain passed down like medals no one wanted. I tried to numb wounds I didn't create. Addiction became my battlefield.



SOLDIER 7

I didn't think I belonged anywhere. Every relapse felt like failure. I told myself, "This is who I am." That was a lie I believed.



SOLDIER 8

I became someone my children feared. I hated myself more than any substance ever could. I thought I was unlovable. I was wrong.



SOLDIER 9

I lost friends to this war. Some didn't make it back. I carry their names with me. Survivor's guilt is heavy.



SOLDIER 10

I hit bottom and there was nothing left but truth. That's when recovery found me.

(Silence. Drum stops.)

ACT II: THE ENLISTMENT — FINDING NA (15 MINUTES)

COMMANDER:

Every soldier remembers the day they surrendered—not to addiction, but to help.



SOLDIER 1

I walked into NA scared. Someone said, “You never have to fight alone again.” That saved my life.



SOLDIER 2

Asking for help wasn’t weakness—it was strategy.



SOLDIER 3

The Steps became my training. Sponsors became my guidance.



SOLDIER 4

Meetings became my safe place. Service gave me purpose.



SOLDIER 5

I learned honesty, accountability, and progress—not perfection.



SOLDIER 6

NA didn’t promise comfort. It promised truth. And truth set me free.



SOLDIER 7

I learned to feel instead of escape. That was the hardest battle.



SOLDIER 8

For the first time, I felt seen—not judged.



SOLDIER 9

I stopped fighting the program and started fighting for my life.



SOLDIER 10

One day. One meeting. One decision at a time—I stayed.

 **ACT III: THE FIGHT & BROTHERHOOD (15 MINUTES)**











(Soldier stumbles.)

SOLDIER: I want to quit.

GROUP (together): Leave no one behind.

COMMANDER:

Relapse is not treason. It is a wound. Get back up.

-  Recovery taught me courage.
-  Service taught me humility.
-  Honesty taught me freedom.
-  Clean time is earned daily.
-  I fight so tomorrow has hope.
-  We don't graduate recovery.
-  We stay ready.
-  We stay connected.
-  We stay clean—together.
-  We help the next person find their unit.

 **FINAL ACT — THE MISSION CONTINUES (5 MINUTES)**

COMMANDER:

These are not medals for winning wars.
They are medals for surviving them.

If you are hurting...
If you are tired...
If you are losing...

You are not weak.

You are a soldier who has not yet found their unit.











COMMANDER:
Welcome home.

(Moment of silence → Serenity Prayer or NA reading.)

(Commander distributes clean-time coins.)

FINAL TRANSFORMATION SCENE

(Lights soften. Soldiers break formation—standing in peace.)

We are rebuilding together.

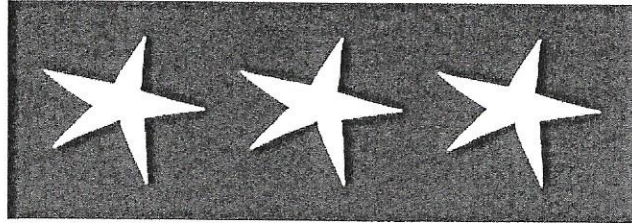
