## Temporary Traffic Management Basics for Project Managers

Temporary Traffic Management (TTM) is a recognised high risk activity by Safework (and equivalent) agencies nationally. A recent national program of works has targeted improvements in the technical guidance and training for individuals involved in traffic control, implementation and design of TTM.

However, there is relatively little guidance for project / contract managers with overall responsibility for projects which include TTM activities. Several high profile incidents at roadwork sites in recent years, and the subsequent legal actions and coroners inquests have shone a light on project managers and all organisations with a contractual linkage to TTM works being undertaken.

In this context, project managers have been identified as having key responsibilities which need to be carefully managed and there is a personal risk to those project managers without any specialist training in TTM activities. This workshop provides an overview of TTM basics that Project Managers need to consider and apply when managing projects involving TTM.

### Workshop Outline

This workshop is targeted at Project / Contract Managers with TTM activities within their contracts.

Using case examples an overview is provided of:

- Project Manager responsibilities.
- TTM basics. A brief overview of the various TTM roles, the Traffic Management Plan, Traffic Guidance Schemes—what to look for and the questions to ask.
- Development of TTM requirements of project briefs.
- What project managers should look for during the works.
- The role of surveillance and audit of TTM.
