

Oil Paint Colors

Steve and I will use Winsor and Newton, Winton Oil Paint in class. You are free to use any brand you choose. Feel free to bring any colors not listed below that you enjoy using. Since each day will be a different painting and there will be no reference beforehand, the supplies listed below are for all any of our workshops.

Titanium White
Prussian Blue
Phthalo Blue
Black of your choice
Van Dyke Brown or Burnt umber
Dark Sienna or burnt sienna
Sap Green
Cadmium Yellow (pale hue in WN) or Lemon yellow
Yellow Ochre
Phthalo Green or Viridian
Bright Red or Cad Red Hue
Alizarin Crimson
Indian Yellow
Payne's Grey

Liquid First coat medium by Grumbacher (Hobby Lobby), Liquid White or Magic White. Might be a good idea to bring Liquin if you have it (you can use liquid clear instead of liquin), if not, then Liquid Clear will work.

Brushes

Any brand of brush you want to use is fine with us. The ones we will use are below, but you may wish to bring whatever brush makes you happy. Just because it isn't listed, doesn't mean you cannot use it. Shoot, we may pull a sneaky or two with brushes. Brushes, especially the 1 and 2 inch, **MUST** be natural hair to work best. See the end of the supply list for suggested budget brushes.

2" Brush
1" Brush
Fan Brush (typically the size is a #6)
Liner Brush (We prefer a long haired liner)
Filbert Brush (typically a #4 or #6)
Palette Knife

Canvases:

Steve and I will be using Sunbelt Canvases. Any brand you choose to use is fine with us. Sunbelt has offered a 15% discount for our workshops by using the code Steveross20. Make sure you order **"Traditional Stretched Art canvas, Edge stapled, 3/4" deep"** One note about sunbelt

canvases is that they can be wet stacked. Wet stacking allows them to be placed on top of each other while still wet in a box for carrying home or shipping. But please, use whatever you like or fits your budget.

18 x 24 “Canvas or any size you feel comfortable painting using. **No canvases larger than 18x24 permitted.**

Table Easel -ABSOLUTELY NO LARGE EASELS. If fact, this easel is the best for classes as to not overcrowd the space. <https://www.dickblick.com/products/blick-studio-aluminum-tabletop-easel/>

Other Supplies needed:

Paper Towels, wet wipes, etc.

Black gesso

Thinner and a Palette - You will also need odorless mineral spirits (see below for approved brands. No stinky thinner please!) and a palette of your choice. Palette paper is the best for classes as the clean up is super easy.

Until we have a brush line available here are some economical but effective 1- and 2-inch brushes and other suggested tools. These will not hold up as long as artist grade brushes but will help beginners and experienced painters get the desired effects that Steve and I achieve. Much better than anything you can buy from most art stores and WAY better than anything synthetic. **PLEASE, don't bring synthetic 1 and 2 inch brushes to classes.**

3. Weber Odorless Turpenoids
4. **Sunnyside Pure Odorless Paint Thinner**
5. Any other brand that is completely odorless. Open it and if it smells, don't buy it and bring it to class please.
