HISTORY

For many years prior to the inception of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, yacht racing was the popular sport on the Bay. Commodore Herman Muller of the Seaside Park Yacht Club, invited members of local yacht clubs to meet with him on February 11, 1914, to discuss the advisability of forming an association to foster and unify yacht racing on the Barnegat Bay. Four clubs were represented at this meeting: Bay Head, Island Heights, Ocean Gate and Seaside Park.

After agreement as to the name and purpose of the Association, Commodore J.V.A. Cattus of the Bay Head Yacht Club, was unanimously elected Chairman and to serve with him, Commodore E. A. Lloyd, Jr., as Vice Chairman, Commodore Herman Muller, Secretary and Mr. M.R.H. Crowell, Treasurer. The first regular meeting was held March 11, 1914, at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which time the original Bylaws were adopted and a racing schedule formulated, the first race being held at the Seaside Park Yacht Club on July 4, 1914. At this first meeting, the Association was enlarged by the election of the Mantoloking Yacht Club into its membership.

The first season's championships awarded by this new organization were in 1914. The first annual meeting was held on October 21, 1914. By this time, membership had grown to six Clubs by the addition of the Lavallette Yacht Club; an official Regatta Committee was appointed then known as "The Racing Commission." In 1922, the Toms River Yacht Club was elected to membership. The following Clubs were subsequently elected to Membership: Shore Acres Yacht Club (1941), Beachwood Yacht Club (1946), Metedeconk River Yacht Club (1946), Normandy Beach Yacht Club (1947), Manasquan River Yacht Club (1962), Pine Beach Yacht Club (1979), and Ocean County College Sailing Club (2005).

The BBYRA Delegates approved an extensive revision of the Bylaws in 1994. The organization applied for, and received, Federal and State status as a tax-exempt corporation 501(c)(3) enabling contributions to the BBYRA to be tax-deductible based on individual limits. The impetus for change during the 90's did not stop at the Bylaws.

Significant changes have been made to the Racing Rules, Sailing Instructions, Course Configuration, scoring and methods of registration. An active web-site was introduced in 2000, which has provided timely communications between the Yacht Racing Association and the Clubs and Sailors.

The BBYRA horizons continue to expand beyond the Saturday Championship series. We currently serve as the umbrella organization uniting Junior Sailing Programs and YRA-sponsored instructional clinics and coordinated events. Our seminars, providing Race Management and Judges' training, reinforce our commitment to provide the best venue possible for our sailing members.

The development of the Association has been gradual but sound. Each group of officers contributes their time, energy, and effort to continue the commitment to sailing and racing on Barnegat Bay.

**O.G. Dale Memorial Trophy
Outstanding Sportsmanship in BBYRA**

"Awarded for a period of one year in recognition of Outstanding Sportsmanship in the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association."

This award recognizes outstanding sportsmanship and conduct. Any sailor, skipper or crew, senior or Junior is eligible to be nominated for this award. "If no ones name readily comes to mind during the racing season, there is no need to make this award."

"Also, if someone has already earned recognition for good conduct during any of the past few seasons I see no reason why the award couldn't be made this year on that account."

THE B.B.Y.R.A. RACE MANAGEMENT TROPHY

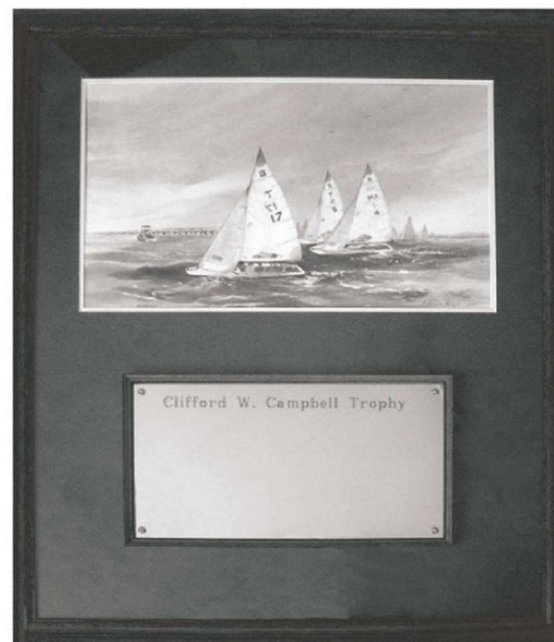
Clifford W. Campbell Trophy

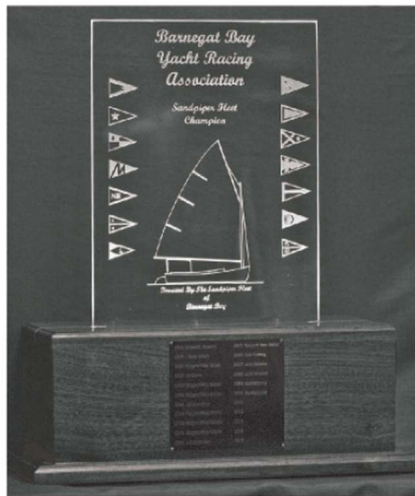

ENSIGN FLEET 63 - BBYRA SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP

Awarded to the BBYRA Season Champion. William M. Wood and his crew and wife Peggy Keyser started winning trophies on Barnegat Bay in the 1910's. Bill won BBYRA Championships in his 18ft. Catboat, SUDS, in 1927, and his Barnegat 17, Grandmother Honey, in 1967. In the 1950's, he helped develop the current BBYRA Barrel Courses. In 1972, he bought Pearson Ensign #176, Demitasse, and in 1973 formed Ensign Fleet 63. Over the next twelve years, he helped the fleet grow to 23 racing boats. Bill taught 6 grandchildren to sail, race, crab, and over-night cruise on the Demitasse. Bill's daughter, Leigh F.W. Murphey, renamed Ensign 176 the Chowder. These days, the Chowder is actively raced by Bill Wood's grandson Bill Murphey with crew great-granddaughter Erin Murphey.

This trophy was first awarded in 2012.

Edward W. Feirer Memorial Fund

The Edward W. Feirer Memorial Fund (Feirer Fund) was created by the family of Ed Feirer. Mr. Feirer was an avid sailor, active in the BBYRA for many years, and a long time member of Beachwood Yacht Club (BYC). The purpose of the Feirer Fund is to enable skippers "to pursue further competition beyond the BBYRA level" in US Sailing National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events. As per the Deed of Gift, the Feirer Fund is to be placed in a separate interest bearing account of the BBYRA and maintained by the BBYRA. The interest of this separate account are the funds to be disbursed annually to qualified skippers. Any portion of the available funds that are not disbursed are to revert to the principal of the Feirer Fund. Distribution of the available funds is to be at the sole discretion of a committee consisting of a representative member of BYC, BBYRA Commodore and BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events.

Disbursement of Funds

1. All eligible registration forms submitted to the BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events and approved by the Chairperson shall be considered an application to the Feirer Fund. The BBYRA Chairperson shall notify and forward a copy of each accepted application to the BBYRA Commodore and BYC Commodore simultaneously.
2. BBYRA shall pay the registration fee(s) for approved application(s) for those competitors who qualify for the finals of the National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events from the BBYRA operating fund in consultation with the BBYRA Commodore and BYC Commodore (or their designees). Disbursement is limited to posted registration fee.
3. The BBYRA Commodore, BYC Commodore and BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events shall meet in September of each year to review the disbursements for the Feirer Fund and the performance of the Feirer Fund. BBYRA is to be reimbursed for disbursement(s) made for posted registration fee(s) for National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events up to the maximum interest earned. In the event BBYRA disbursements exceed the annual interest of the Feirer Fund for posted registration fee(s) for National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events, BBYRA will be reimbursed from the Feirer Fund as future funds become available.
4. Any funds that are not disbursed shall revert to the Feirer Fund principal.

NOTICE OF RACE ("NOR")

Organizing Authority: Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association (BBYRA)

1 RULES

- 1.1 The BBYRA Championship Series will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 RRS 40 and Part 4 Preamble are modified to require all singlehanded competitors to wear a personal flotation device (PFD) at all times while on the water.
- 1.3 Under RRS 87, the E-Sloop class rules are modified to require mainsail floatation at all times.
- 1.4 Under RRS 87, all class rules are modified such that all boats shall carry all safety equipment as specified in NOR APPENDIX 1.
- 1.5 The changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other rules.

2 CLASSES AND ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The BBYRA Championship series is open to all boats of the following classes: A Cat, E Sloop (AM and PM), Ensign, Flying Scot, M Sloop, Laser Full Rig, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, MC Scow, Sandpiper, Marshall Sanderling, Sneakbox and Sunfish.
- 2.2 Entrant Eligibility
 - 2.2.1 A boat entered for a race must be the bona fide property of a recognized member club or of the person in whose name she is entered, who must be a member of a member club of the BBYRA, except as noted in NOR 2.2.3 and NOR 2.2.4. A person chartering a boat shall be deemed the owner provided said boat has been chartered in good faith for a period of not less than thirty days.
 - 2.2.2 Except as noted in NOR 2.2.3 and NOR 2.2.4, skippers are required to be members of the BBYRA, a member club of the BBYRA and their class organization. Crews are exempt from this requirement.
 - 2.2.3 A sailing instructor actively employed by a BBYRA member club may be permitted to enter and/or skipper a boat provided he/she is a member of US Sailing and his/her respective class organization, and pays the usual entry fees for the class in which he/she is entered. Entry will be at the discretion of the Regatta Committee and shall be denied if not in the best interest of the BBYRA.
 - 2.2.4 A non-BBYRA member may be permitted to enter and/or skipper a boat as a "Guest" for a maximum of two (2) race days only per season, subject to the prescribed daily "Guest" fee. Entry will be at the discretion of the Regatta Committee and shall be denied if not in the best interest of the BBYRA.
- 2.3 There are no age restrictions in any fleet included in the 2020 Championship Series. Entrants are encouraged to include age information when registering in order to establish eligibility for Junior awards and/or Registration Fee discounts as applicable.
- 2.4 Any Competitor not in good standing with the BBYRA shall not register, skipper or crew until good standing is re-established.
- 2.5 The person or persons entering a boat shall be deemed to be the skipper(s) and person in charge under RRS 46, unless the BBYRA is properly notified of a change prior to a race.

3 REGISTRATION

- 3.1 **Season and Daily Registration Forms and Registration Instructions** will be available no later than June 30, 2020 on the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).
- 3.2 **ONLINE SEASON REGISTRATION** - Boats are strongly encouraged to register ONLINE for the season via the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org). No late fees will apply at any time for online registrations.
- 3.3 **MAIL-IN REGISTRATION** - Boats may still register for the season by mail before July 15, 2020. Late fees will apply to mail-in registrations postmarked after July 15, 2020.
- 3.4 **IN PERSON REGISTRATION** - In Person Registrations will NOT be accepted this year due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- 3.5 Boats may register for "Daily" participation ONLINE only, via the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org). Such registrations must be made no later than the Wednesday prior to each race day.
- 3.6 See 2020 REGISTRATION FEES for all registration fees for all fleets.



4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 There will be two separate sets of sailing instructions published, one applicable to ROSE COURSE and one to GREEN COURSE.
- 4.2 The sailing instructions for the ROSE COURSE and GREEN COURSE will be available no later than May 14, 2020 on the BBYRA website (only).

5 RACING VENUES

- 5.1 E-Sloops shall race on the ROSE COURSE. All other fleets shall race on the GREEN COURSE.
- 5.2 GREEN COURSE - UPPER BAY HOST CLUB: On race days hosted by yacht clubs north of the Mathis Bridge, the Green Course Fleets will race on the "Green Island Course" located approximately between Hankins Island and Green Island.
- 5.3 GREEN COURSE - LOWER BAY HOST CLUB: On race days hosted by yacht clubs south of the Mathis Bridge, the Green Course Fleets will race on the "Wanamaker Course" located at the mouth of the Toms River.
- 5.4 GREEN COURSE FINAL WEEK (SEASIDE PARK RACE DAY): On Seaside Park Race Day the Green Course Fleets will race on the "Seaside Park Course" west of Seaside Park Yacht Club.
- 5.5 ROSE COURSE - Except as noted in NOR 5.6 and NOR 5.7, the ROSE COURSE will race each week on the opposite side of the Mathis Bridge from the GREEN COURSE [e.g. when the host club is north of the Mathis Bridge, the ROSE COURSE is south (either Wanamaker or Seaside Park). When the host club is south of the Mathis Bridge, the ROSE COURSE is north (on Green Island)]
- 5.6 ROSE COURSE FINAL WEEK (SEASIDE PARK RACE DAY) - On Seaside Park Race Day the ROSE COURSE will be located on the Wanamaker course.
- 5.7 The ROSE COURSE will sail on the Cedar Creek Course on select race days. See E Sloop CLASS SIGNALS AND START TIMES for specific Cedar Creek Course race dates.
- 5.8 Fixed Mark Courses and starting area maps are available on the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).

6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 GREEN COURSE: The first warning signal in the morning is at 0920. No warning signal for morning races will be made after 1130. The first warning signal in the afternoon is at 1315. No warning signal for afternoon races will be made after 1530. See the attached schedule for sailing dates for each fleet.
- 6.2 ROSE COURSE: Three races are planned for each scheduled ROSE COURSE race day, to be sailed back to back to back. The first warning signal is at 1000. No warning signal will be made after 1530. See the attached schedule for race dates and for which specific races apply to which series (AM or PM).

7 SCORING AND QUALIFICATION

- 7.1 RRS A9 (Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta) applies.
- 7.2 In order to qualify for the Championship, a boat must check in with the Start Boat in at least 50% of the races started for her class.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 8.1 For all classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that a Two Turns Penalty is replaced by the One Turn Penalty.
- 8.2 For all classes, RRS 44.1 is changed such that a boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 may either take a penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.1 or a Scoring Penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.3.

9 PRIZES

9.1 Daily Prizes

- 9.1.1 First place individual regatta pennants may be awarded for each race having at least two entrants. Second place pennants may be awarded when there are at least four entrants in any particular race. Third place pennants may be awarded when there are at least seven entrants in any particular race.
- 9.1.2 The host clubs may provide additional trophies as listed in the Club Trophies List found on the BBYRA website.

9.2 Season Prizes

- 9.2.1 Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning boat in each fleet when there are at least three (3) qualifiers. Second place trophies may be awarded when there are at least four qualifiers. Third place trophies may be awarded when there are at least seven qualifiers. Fourth place trophies may be awarded when there are at least eleven qualifiers. Fifth place trophies may be awarded when there are at least fifteen qualifiers.
- 9.2.2 Fleet Championship Perpetual Trophies may be awarded as listed in the BBYRA Trophies List found on the BBYRA website.

REGULATIONS OF THE BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION

www.bbyra.org

A. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be sailed under The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Sailing Instructions and these Regulations.
2. The Championship Series, held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be conducted by a Race Committee appointed by the Regatta Committee of the Association and chaired by the Vice Commodore.
3. Each year the Regatta Committee shall adopt Sailing Instructions (SIs) that shall be provided to all entrants. The Regatta Committee shall also cause appropriate race information not contained in the SIs or these Regulations and required by RRS J1, "Notice of Race Contents", to be published on the BBYRA website on or before May 15th.

B. ELIGIBILITY

1. Any existing class qualifying three or more boats in the previous year's Championship Series will be eligible for competition.
2. Additional classes may be considered upon written petition to the Regatta Committee by at least six skippers representing a minimum of three member clubs. Such petition shall be submitted no later than November 15th of the prior year for which eligibility is being requested and shall include (as a minimum) the following information for consideration:
 - a) A commitment from each skipper stating his/her intention to qualify for the championship.
 - b) Identification of Class Liaison Representative (including pertinent contact information).
 - c) Listing of any and all racing preferences (i.e. morning or afternoon, bye weeks, preferred courses, etc.).
 - d) Proposed age limit or gender restriction (if applicable).

Any new class accepted shall be considered "provisional" for a period of at least one year with provisional status to be reviewed annually by the Class Eligibility Committee. Provisional classes are not eligible for championship awards. Those classes eligible for competition each year shall be designated by the Regatta Committee and published on the BBYRA website on or before May 15th.

3. In junior classes with an age limit, a contestant will be considered eligible when his age limit birthday will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year.
4. Member Clubs are expected to furnish the Regatta Committee with a

membership list and a list of BBYRA contributing members prior to June 15th of each year in order to facilitate monitoring of Registration eligibility.

C. ENTRIES

1. A member of the Regatta Committee shall supervise the receipt of entries and fees in all classes.
2. Entries shall be made as required by the Regatta Committee.
3. An entry fee will be charged for the season or for each race of the championship series for all classes at rates established by the BBYRA. Entry fees are non-refundable.

D. RACING TRIM

1. All one-design and restricted classes must file with the Association Measurer a copy of their class rules and regulations which shall include restrictions, measurements and designations pertaining to the hull, mast, rigging, sails, and crew limitations as to weight and number, not later than two weeks prior to the date of the first championship regatta. These will remain frozen through the entire Championship series. No boat will be entitled to start in any race unless the boat meets the above mentioned requirements and conforms to these Regulations.
2. A record of class restrictions and designations including sails, crew limitations, equipment, etc. will be maintained by the Association Measurer.

E. QUALIFICATION and SCORING

1. Each season the Association will award the championship to the boat in each class making the best score as prescribed in the sailing instructions, for any eligible fleet having a minimum of three (3) qualifiers.
2. Points shall be awarded to a boat and may not be transferred except by specific written permission of the Regatta Committee.

F. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

1. The BBYRA may act to suspend the awards of a class's season championship series if the final outcome of its series is dependent on the outcome of an appeal.
2. A report of each championship race giving the identification of all boats registered therein and their order of finish shall be filed with the Scorer of the Regatta Committee and kept in the Association archives.

2020 GREEN COURSE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 RRS 60.1 is modified so that a boat may not protest another boat for an alleged breach of any class rule other than class equipment measurement/membership rules.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 The Official Notice Board for Notices to Competitors shall be the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).
- 2.2 The Protest Notice Board shall be the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted on the BBYRA website Official Notice Board at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled AM or PM First Warning Signal, or on the water communicated to each boat prior to her warning signal.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 There will be no signals made ashore due to COVID-19 restrictions.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 See GREEN COURSE CLASS SIGNALS AND STARTING TIMES for race schedule and warning times.
- 5.2 For morning races, no warning signal shall be made after 1130.
- 5.3 For afternoon races, no warning signal shall be made after 1530.

6 THE COURSES

- 6.1 Green Course Race Venues:
 - a) On race days hosted by yacht clubs north of the Mathis Bridge, the racing area will be the Green Island Course. On race days hosted by yacht clubs south of the Mathis Bridge, excluding the SPYC race day, the racing area will be the Wanamaker Course.
 - b) On SPYC race day, the racing area will be the Seaside Park Course, west of Seaside Park Yacht Club.
- 6.2 Portable Mark Courses:
 - a) The course designator W, S, O or T and the number of legs shall be displayed on a placard on the Start Boat no later than preparatory signal for each fleet.
 - a) Course W is a windward/leeward course.
 - b) Course S is a windward/leeward course, where the windward mark is the short mark.
 - c) Course O is an Olympic triangle.
 - d) Course T is a triangle.
 - b) If the letter "S" is displayed following the number of legs, then the leeward mark is the short mark.
 - c) If the "C" flag is displayed on the stern of the Start Boat during the start sequence, the windward mark shall be the Change Mark as provided in SI 7.2b).
 - d) An offset may be employed at the weather mark. When present, boats shall round the offset mark to port while approaching and after rounding the weather mark.
 - e) When the letter "G" is signaled on the course placard, a gate will be set as the leeward mark on any windward-leeward course. When a leeward gate is set, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark.
 - f) If one of the gate marks is missing, the remaining mark in position shall be rounded to port.
 - g) Examples:
 - a) Example: W4G is a four leg windward/leeward course, finish downwind, with a gate as the leeward mark.

- b) Example: S5G is a five leg windward/leeward course, finish to windward, with a gate as the leeward mark, and the short mark as the windward mark.
- c) Example: W4S is a 4 leg windward/leeward course, finish to leeward, where the leeward mark is the short mark.

6.3 Fixed Mark Courses:

- a) Fixed mark courses are numbered courses using fixed marks. See UPPER BAY COURSE CHART and LOWER BAY COURSE CHART for a list of courses consisting of the approximate location of marks, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- b) The number of course to be sailed will be displayed not later than the Preparatory Signal for each fleet. This modifies RRS 27.1.

6.4 Any special course, not included in these instructions, will be posted on the official notice board.

6.5 For a race with a club finish the last leg of the posted course is from the last turning mark to the host club.

7 MARKS

- 7.1 For fixed mark courses, permanent marks will be drums painted orange and white with identifying letters in black.
- 7.2 For Portable Mark Courses:
 - a) The turning marks of the course will be large yellow marks.
 - b) The Change Mark as provided in SI 6.2c) and SI 10 will be a large ball with yellow and black alternating panels.
 - c) The short mark, when used as either the windward mark for course S, or as the leeward mark shall be a large yellow mark with a horizontal black stripe. This mark will be placed to leeward of the windward mark, and to windward of the leeward mark or gate.
- 7.3 A missing mark will be replaced either by an orange tetrahedron or boat displaying Flag M. Sound signals may be omitted. This modifies RRS 34(b) and RRS Race Signals.

8 THE START

- 8.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Start Boat at the starboard end and an orange mark at the port end.
- 8.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. After starting and before finishing, a boat may not cross the start line.
- 8.3 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS). This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 8.4 The race committee may attempt to hail and broadcast sail numbers of boats that are OCS on VHF Radio. Failure to hail or broadcast any sail numbers; failure of a boat to receive the recall hail or broadcast; a boat's position in the sequence of hail or broadcast numbers; promptness of the hail or broadcast shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 29.1 and RRS 62.1(a).
- 8.5 A small limiting mark may be attached to the stern of the Start Boat, and if present shall be considered part of the Start Boat.

9 THE FINISH

- 9.1 For upwind finishes, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag or shape on the Finish Boat and an orange mark on the port side of the Finish Boat.
- 9.2 For downwind finishes, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag or shape on the Start Boat and an orange mark on the starboard side of the Start Boat.
- 9.3 For club finishes, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag or shape at the host club and an orange mark.

10 CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 10.1 During the race, marks may be repositioned without signal for minor changes in the course. This shall not be grounds for redress. This modifies RRS 33 and RRS 62.1.
- 10.2 When a change in course is signaled, the new mark shall be the change mark as provided by SI 7.2b). If a subsequent change is signaled, the new mark shall be the original mark.

- 10.3 When a change in course is signaled prior to the start as noted in SI 6.2c), only flag "C" will be displayed. This modifies RRS 33 a).

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1 A boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 may either take a penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.1 or a Scoring Penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.3.
- 11.2 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe) replaces the Two-Turns Penalty.

12 POSTPONEMENT AND ABANDONMENT

- 12.1 A postponement signaled before 1200 does not apply to afternoon races. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- 12.2 Flag N over A over first substitute will Abandon All Races for the Morning. This modifies RRS Race Signals.

13 TIME LIMITS

- 13.1 If no boat has finished a race within two hours the RC shall abandon the race.
- 13.2 Boats failing to finish within two hours, or within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes, or by 1230 for the morning races (whichever is earlier), shall be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired) without a hearing. This modifies RRS 35 and A4.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1 A boat shall inform the race committee finish boat immediately after finishing of its intention to protest another boat and provide the sail number of the protested boat. This changes RRS 61.
- 14.2 Protest forms are available online at www.bbyra.org. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered within the appropriate time limit either:
- a) Electronically at www.bbyra.org for all weeks except the last race day of the Series (SPYC), or
 - b) On the last race day of the series (SPYC) only, in person to the Protest Committee Chairman or Secretary, Area PRO, or BBYRA Flag Officer.
- 14.3 The protest time limit is 2000 on the day of the race in question, except on the last scheduled racing day when the protest time is 45 minutes from the time the Green Course Start Boat docks. This modifies RRS 62.2.
- 14.4 Notices will be posted as soon as possible after the protest time limit on the official Protest Committee notice board at www.bbyra.org. Hearings will be held at Regatta Headquarters commencing at 1600 on the next scheduled race day or at a location and time agreed upon by the protest committee and interested parties, except on the last race day when hearings will be held immediately following the races.
- 14.5 Breaches of Instructions SI 8.3, 16.1, 16.2, 16.3 and 17 shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

15 SCORING

- 15.1 In order to qualify for the Championship, a boat must check in with the Start Boat in at least 50% of the races started for her class.
- 15.2 RRS A.9 (Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta) shall apply.
- 15.3 For all classes, RRS A2 is modified so that:
- a) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - b) When from 4 to 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - c) When from 7 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
 - d) When from 9 to 12 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three worst scores.
 - e) When from 13 to 15 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her four worst scores.

- f) When more than 15 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her five worst scores.

15.4 The last sentence of RRS A9 is changed to read "A boat that did not come to the starting area shall be scored the points equal to the number of boats that came to the starting area plus one point."

15.5 Boats scored TLE will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus two points by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.2, A5 and A11.

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1 Changes in registered skipper (person in charge) or sail number must be reported at the registration desk or reported to the late entry boat in the vicinity of the Start Boat or the Start Boat prior to the boat's warning signal. The skipper need not be the helmsman but must be on board while racing.
- 16.2 A boat that either retires from a race, or retires prior to starting a race shall notify either by VHF or in person, the race committee or a patrol boat prior to leaving the race area.
- 16.3 All single-handed competitors shall wear a personal flotation device (PFD) at all times while afloat. This changes RRS 40 and the Part 4 preamble.

17 SAFETY EQUIPMENT CHECKS

A boat may be inspected by the race committee at any time for compliance with the required safety equipment for her class (see NOR APPENDIX 1 for required safety equipment per class). When Flag L and a class signal are displayed at the finish line, boats in the signaled class shall proceed immediately to the inspection boat flying the same signal in the vicinity of the finish line for a mandatory safety inspection. Boats must remain in the area of the inspection boat until dismissed. While awaiting inspection, contact with other boats is prohibited. A boat that fails to comply with this sailing instruction, or does not display the required safety equipment to the inspection boat, shall be protested by the Race Committee. The penalty for breaking this sailing instruction shall be DSQ for the race immediately preceding the inspection.

18 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 18.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 18.2 VHF radio channel 68 will be used for emergencies and communication of race information.

19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta. The organizing authority will not accept any liability related to competitors potential exposure to COVID-19 prior to, during or after the regatta.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 RRS 60.1 is modified so that a boat may not protest another boat for an alleged breach of any class rule other than class equipment / measurement rules.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 The Official Notice Board for Notices to Competitors shall be the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).
- 2.2 The Protest Notice Board shall be the BBYRA website (www.bbyra.org).

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted on the BBYRA website Official Notice Board at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled AM or PM First Warning Signal, or on the water communicated to each boat prior to her warning signal.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 There will be no signals made ashore due to COVID-19 restrictions.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Three races are scheduled for each race day. Races will be sailed back to back to back without a scheduled break. See ROSE COURSE SAILING SCHEDULE for AM and PM Fleet race designation.

- 7.2 The number of legs will be displayed on the Start Boat course board.
- 7.3 An offset mark may be employed at the weather mark. When present, boats shall round the offset mark to port while approaching and after rounding the weather mark.
- 7.4 A gate may be set as the leeward mark. When a leeward gate is set, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark.

8 MARKS

- 8.1 The starting mark will be a yellow pin.
- 8.2 The turning marks will be large orange balls.
- 8.3 The windward offset, if used, will be a smaller green ball.
- 8.4 The Change mark, if used, will be a large ball with alternating yellow and black panels.
- 8.5 The Finish mark will be a yellow pin.

9 THE START

- 9.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Start Boat at the starboard end and a starting mark as identified in SI 8.1 at the port end.
- 9.2 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS). This changes RRS A4 and A5.

- 9.3 The race committee may attempt to hail and broadcast sail numbers of boats that are OCS on VHF Radio. Failure to hail or broadcast any sail numbers; failure of a boat to receive the recall hail or broadcast; a boat's position in the sequence of hail or broadcast numbers; promptness of the hail or broadcast shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 29.1 and RRS 62.1(a).
- 9.4 A small limiting mark may be attached to the stern of the Start Boat, and if present, shall be considered part of the Start Boat.

10 THE FINISH

- 10.1 For upwind finishes the finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Finish Boat and a finish mark as identified in SI 8.5 on the port side of the Finish Boat.
- 10.2 For downwind finishes, the finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Start Boat and a finish mark as identified in SI 8.5 on the port side of the Start Boat.
- 10.3 These instructions modify RRS Race Signals.

11 CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 11.1 During the race, marks may be repositioned without signal for minor changes in the course. This modifies RRS 33 and RRS 62.1. The race committee will make every reasonable attempt to broadcast such mark movements to the fleet via VHF radio. Failure to broadcast same, or failure of a boat to receive same shall not be grounds for redress.
- 11.2 When a change in course is signaled, the new mark shall be the change mark as provided by SI 8.4. If a subsequent change is signaled, the new mark shall be the original mark.
- 11.3 RRS 33 is modified such that:
- Paragraph a) is modified to read "If the direction of the leg will be changed, the signal shall be the display of flag C with repetitive sounds and the new course displayed on a course board."
 - Paragraph b) is deleted.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 A boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 may either take a penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.1 or a Scoring Penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.3.
- 12.2 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe) replaces the Two-Turns Penalty.

13 TIME LIMITS

- 13.1 The time limit for each race will be two hours.
- 13.2 Boats failing to finish within two hours, or within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes shall be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired) without a hearing. This modifies RRS 35 and A4.

- 14.1 A boat is required to inform the race committee finish boat immediately after finishing of its intention to protest another boat and provide the sail number of the protested boat. This changes RRS 61.
- 14.2 Protest forms are available online at www.bbyra.org. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered within the appropriate time limit either:
- Electronically at www.bbyra.org for all weeks except the last race day of the Series (SPYC), or
 - On the last race day of the series (SPYC) only, in person to the Protest Committee Chairman or Secretary, Area PRO, or BBYRA Flag Officer.
- 14.3 The protest time limit is 2000 on the day of the race in question, except on the last scheduled racing day when the protest time is 45 minutes from the time the Rose Course Start Boat docks. This modifies RRS 62.2.

- 14.4 Notices will be posted as soon as possible after the protest time limit on the official Protest Committee notice board at www.bbyra.org. - 15.2 RRS A.9 (Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta) shall apply.

- When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - When from 4 to 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - When from 7 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
 - When from 9 to 12 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three worst scores.

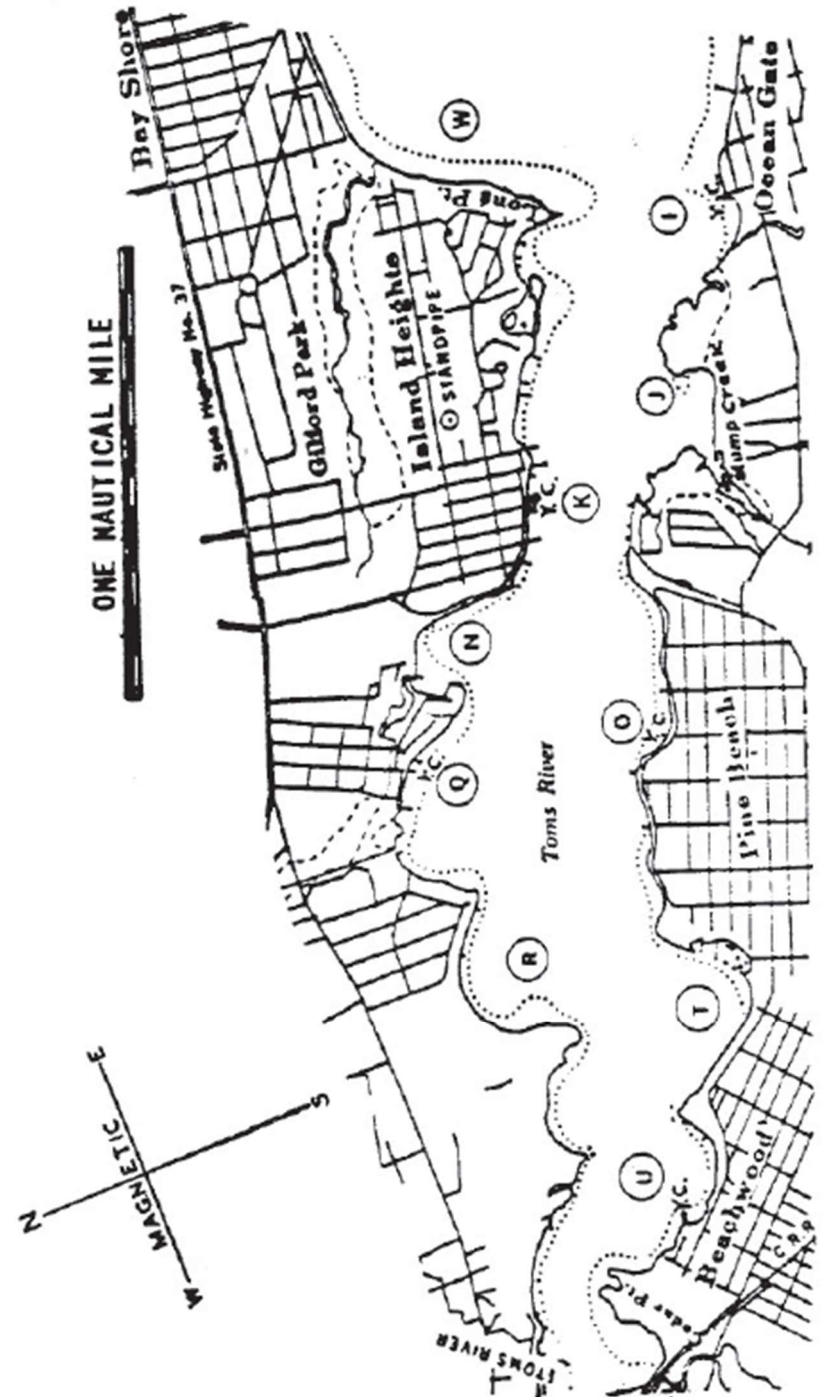

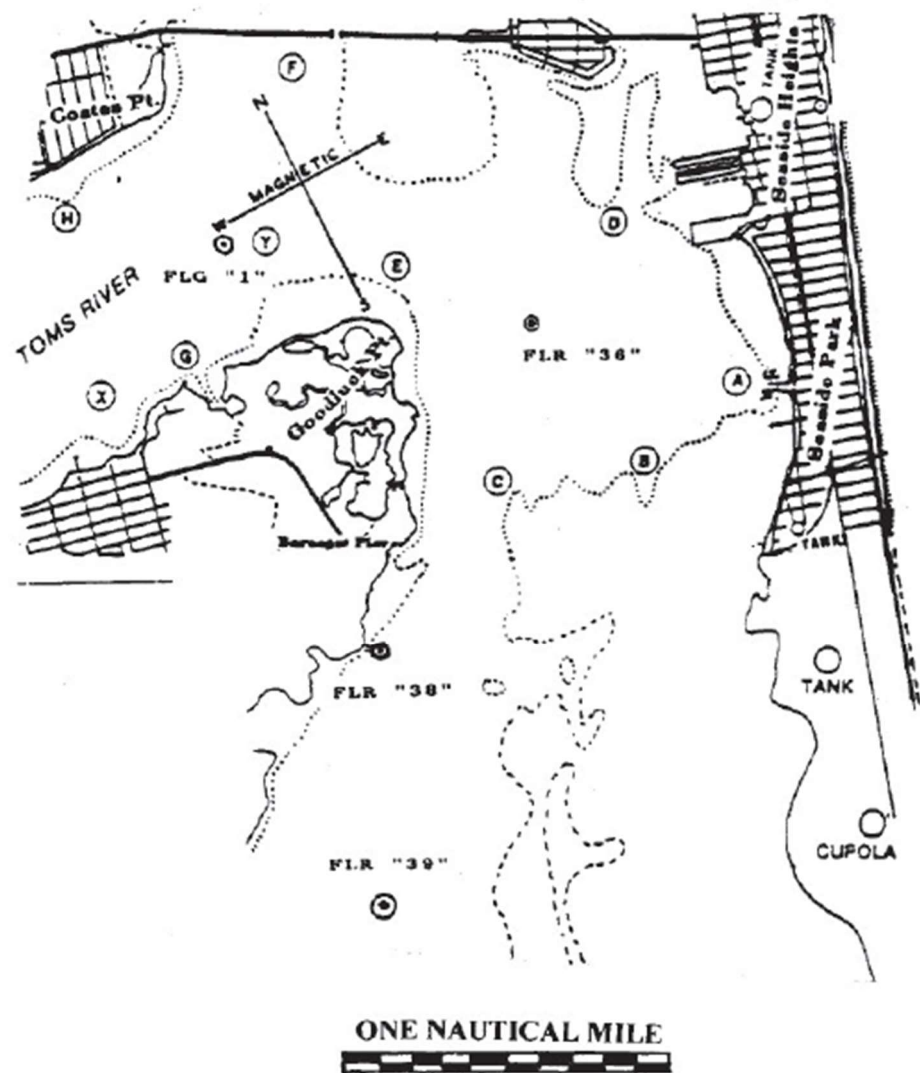

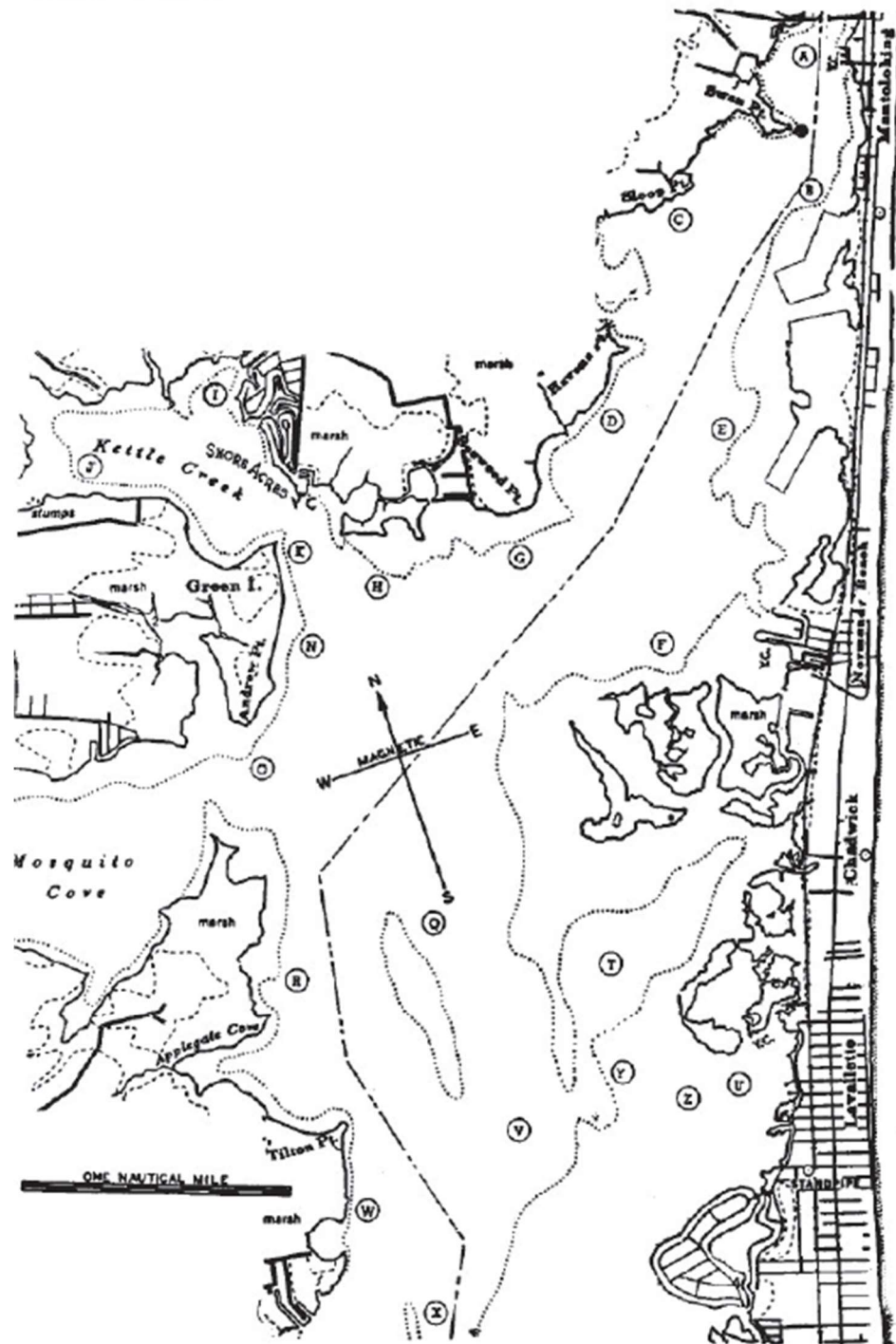

BBYRA BYLAWS

Adopted October 1, 1994

Last Revised October 4, 2014

ARTICLE ONE - NAME

The name of this Corporation is the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association.
(Hereinafter BBYRA)

ARTICLE TWO - PURPOSE

The BBYRA is organized exclusively to foster amateur sailboat racing competition in yachts on Barnegat Bay and on a national and international level and to support and develop amateur athletes for the sport of sailboat racing, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future tax code). It may provide training for candidates and their crews by organizing and/or holding competitive events and holding of meetings in the nature of seminars. The prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association, Inc., (hereinafter USSAILING) with respect to matters of race, color, religion, age, sex or national origin shall apply to the BBYRA.

ARTICLE THREE - MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership in the BBYRA shall consist of three classes: Active, Associate and Individual.
 - a) The Active Membership class consists of Yacht Clubs, represented by delegates hereinafter described, and presently consists of: Bay Head Yacht Club; Beachwood Yacht Club; Island Heights Yacht Club; Lavallette Yacht Club; Manasquan River Yacht Club; Mantoloking Yacht Club; Metedeconk River Yacht Club; Normandy Beach Yacht Club; Ocean Gate Yacht Club; Pine Beach Yacht Club; Seaside Park Yacht Club; Shore Acres Yacht Club; and Toms River Yacht Club; and such additional yacht clubs located between Manasquan Inlet and Little Egg Harbor Inlet or waters tributary thereto as may be hereafter elected to membership as an Active member. No club shall be elected to Active Membership unless it has been an Associate Member for at least two years immediately preceding its application.
 - b) The Associate Membership class shall consist of Yacht Clubs which have been elected by threefourths vote of the Executive Committee of the BBYRA, after submittal of a written application signed by an elected officer of the Club and by an elected officer of an Active club, which certifies the applicant has at least five yachts of a class or classes presently scheduled in the BBYRA Regattas. Yachts of Associate Member Clubs shall enjoy rights and privileges of yachts of Active Member Clubs, including representation on the Regatta Committee of the BBYRA. Associate Member Clubs will not be required to sponsor a Regatta. An Associate Member Club may apply for Active membership after two consecutive years of Associate Membership immediately prior to its application for Active membership. Associate Member Clubs shall not have voting rights. The Associate Membership class presently consists of the Ocean County College Sailing Club
 - c) The Individual Membership class consists of persons who belong to Active or Associate member Clubs of the BBYRA, and desire to assist in supporting the objects and purposes of the BBYRA by payment of the annual dues.
 2. All members shall have the privilege of attending or being represented at all annual and special meetings of the BBYRA. All members shall receive such BBYRA publications as the Delegates shall from time to time prescribe.
 3. Individual Members shall be eligible to hold office and serve on committees.
 4. The Delegates shall establish a schedule of annual dues to be paid by each class of membership.
 5. The membership of any member may be declared forfeit by the Delegates for nonpayment of dues.

ARTICLE FOUR - MEETINGS

1. The annual meetings of the BBYRA shall be held on the first Saturday in October and notice shall be sent to each Active and Associate Member Club at least 30 days prior to such date. When practicable, the time and place of all routinely scheduled meetings will be published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website.
2. A quorum shall consist of twelve (12) delegates, provided they shall represent eight (8) Active Member Clubs.

3. At least (15) days notice of all meetings of the BBYRA shall be given, in writing, to each delegate and all others whose attendance is required.
4. Special meetings of the BBYRA or its Executive Committee may be held at the call of the Commodore, or upon request of the delegates of two (2) Active Member Clubs.
5. The delegates or any committee of the BBYRA may act without a meeting if, before or after the action, each delegate or committee member shall consent, in writing, to the action. The written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting.
6. The death, resignation or removal of an officer shall be cause for an emergency meeting of the executive committee, as soon as the committee may deem it appropriate, for the sole purpose of filling the vacancy caused by such an event.

ARTICLE FIVE - VOTE

1. Active Member Clubs shall be represented at meetings by Delegates, who shall be Individual Members, and may be three (3) in number, one of whom shall be the Active Member Club's Commodore or Vice Commodore. The names and addresses of those delegates who shall represent the Club must be sent to the Secretary of the BBYRA not later than January 1 of each year. Delegates shall be equivalent to "Board" as defined in New Jersey Statutes Annotated (N.J.S.A.) 15A: 12b.*
** "Board means the board of trustees or the group of persons vested with management of the business and affairs of the corporation irrespective of the name by which the group is designated; "entire board" means all the trustees then in office. "L. 1983, c. 127, Section 15A: 12b, eff. Oct. 1, 1983.*
2. Each Associate Member Club shall be represented by one of its members, who shall be an Individual Member of the BBYRA. Said representative will not be entitled to vote, but his or her views on any topic shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be aired.
3. Each Active Member Club shall be entitled to one vote. Voting may be done by proxy, which shall be filed with the recording secretary at the meeting.
4. A majority of those present in person and by proxy shall determine all questions, except as may be otherwise provided herein.

ARTICLE SIX - OFFICERS

1. The BBYRA shall have the following officers: Commodore (who shall be President for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Vice Commodore (who shall be Vice President for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting. The Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore shall be elected from the Delegates; the Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer may be elected from the Individual Members of any Active Member Club.
2. The BBYRA'S Representative to the Council of Sailing Associations of the USSAILING., shall be appointed by the Commodore from the past or present officers of the BBYRA, and shall be a current Individual Member.

ARTICLE SEVEN - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Commodore (President): The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the BBYRA and perform such other duties as may be delegated from time to time by the Delegates. The Commodore shall be an ex officio member of all Committees. The Commodore shall be the chief executive officer of the BBYRA and shall have general charge and supervision over and responsibility for the affairs of the BBYRA. The Commodore may enter into and execute, in the name of the BBYRA, contracts or other instruments not in the regular course of business which are authorized, either generally or specifically, by the Delegates. The Commodore shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president of a corporation. From time to time the Commodore may delegate to any other officer any or all of these duties and authority.
2. Vice Commodore (Vice President): The Vice Commodore shall be responsible for the BBYRA's Regatta Program and shall assist the Commodore and preside in the absence of the Commodore. The Vice Commodore shall have duties and possess authority as may be delegated to the Vice Commodore by the Commodore.
3. Rear Commodore: The Rear Commodore shall be responsible for the equipment of the BBYRA and shall assist the Commodore and Vice Commodore, and preside in the absence of both and have the duties and possess the authority as may be delegated to the Rear Commodore by the Commodore.

4. Fleet Captain: The Fleet Captain shall function as an administrative assistant to the Commodore, shall be responsible for the Safety and Training Programs of the BBYRA and shall cause random safety equipment checks to be made of competitor's yachts during the BBYRA's summer Regatta season, reporting the results thereof to the Chairperson of the Regatta Committee and to the Scorer.

5. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Delegates, the Executive Committee, the Officers, the Regatta Committee, and the Class Liaison Committee and shall keep an accurate roll of all Active, Associate, and Individual Members, and of any written proxies of same. The Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the BBYRA, send out all notices and perform such other duties as pertain to the position of Secretary. The Secretary shall keep all delivered reports of the Scorer for two (2) years and then turn same over to the Historian. The Secretary shall keep copies of all delivered committee reports and turn same over to the Historian upon relinquishment of office. The Secretary shall have charge of the seal of the BBYRA, if any.

6. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall have custody of all the funds and securities of the BBYRA and shall keep or cause to be kept regular books of account for the BBYRA. The Treasurer shall perform other duties and possess other powers that are incident to the office or that shall be assigned by the Commodore.

7. Measurer: The Measurer shall receive and keep a record of all yachts as may be required to have measurement certificates by their fleet measurers, and maintain copies of each classes current scantlings as required by such classes association, if any.

8. Yacht Racing Association Representative: The Yacht Racing Association Representative of the BBYRA shall represent the BBYRA on USSAILING's "Council of Sailing Associations" (CSA); shall report to the Delegates at the annual meeting; and shall be reimbursed for duties performed as a member of the CSA while representing the BBYRA, and upon the presentation of a voucher to the Treasurer, approved by the Commodore.

9. All elected officers shall make or cause to be made, at the annual meeting of the BBYRA, and at such other times as the Delegates may direct, a written report of their activities and the condition of the affairs of the BBYRA with which they are charged, and coordinate the submission of budgets of committees over which they have appointing power, for the following year of the BBYRA.

10. The officers of the BBYRA, by virtue of their office shall be members of the Executive Committee.

11. No officer or member of the Delegates may receive a salary or compensation from the BBYRA, but nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent reimbursement for expenses incurred for and on behalf of the BBYRA.

ARTICLE EIGHT - DELEGATES

1. The Delegates are the equivalent of the "Board" as defined in NJSA 15A:12*, and shall consist of the following: Three (3) delegates (one of whom shall be the Commodore or Vice Commodore) from each Active Member Club, which Club, through those persons shall have one vote. *(See Article Five, 1.)

2. The Delegates shall have general control and management of the affairs, funds and property of the BBYRA. As a body, they shall have full power and it shall be their duty to carry out the purposes of the BBYRA according to law and as provided in these ByLaws and the Certificate of Incorporation.

3. The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the Delegates and in the absence of the Commodore, the Vice Commodore shall preside.

4. The presence of twelve (12) Delegates, representing at least eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum and a vote by a majority of those present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be necessary for the transaction of its business.

5. Without in any way limiting the general powers of the Delegates, they shall, among other things: a) consider and act upon applications for membership in the BBYRA; b) approve dates and formulate arrangements for various championship events, with the advice and consent of the Regatta Committee; c) elect the officers of the BBYRA; and, d) adopt such regulations governing policy, organization, and procedural matters as they deem appropriate.

ARTICLE NINE - DUES

1. The Delegates shall fix the dues for each class of membership and direct the Treasurer and/or Chairperson of the Membership Committee to issue receipts and/or membership cards to those making payment.

2. The dues of Active and Associate Member Clubs are due on or before May 1st of each year. Upon any such dues remaining unpaid as of May 31st in any year, written notice thereof shall be

sent by the Treasurer. If such dues remain unpaid as of June 30th then said delinquent Club(s) shall stand suspended until restored to membership by the Executive Committee.

3. Sailing privileges in the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association will automatically be accorded members in good standing of member clubs. To be considered a club in good standing, that club must pay annual dues to the BBYRA which shall be the greater of \$500 or ten dollars per paying member of the member yacht club, times 90 percent. The Treasurer may request from each club a copy of their corresponding membership list to verify payment of dues, but shall promptly return or destroy such lists as directed by the member club. All such lists shall be treated as confidential information and not disseminated to any other person for any reason.

4. Nonpayment of dues by an Individual Member who wishes to be a competitor in any BBYRA championship series shall bar such person from being scored and receiving any award for said series.

ARTICLE TEN - TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

1. The Delegates may expel or suspend any member of the BBYRA by a two-thirds vote of the entire Delegates for any violation of the ByLaws or for any conduct which in the opinion of the Delegates is improper and prejudicial to the welfare, reputation or best interests of the BBYRA. No member shall be expelled or suspended without having been given the opportunity to submit written answer to such charges. A proceeding similar to that contained in Article Fourteen of the ByLaws of USSAILING, shall be followed by the BBYRA in the resolution of grievances.

2. Any Club may withdraw from the BBYRA by giving written notice to the Secretary.

ARTICLE ELEVEN - COMMITTEES

1. There shall be the following standing committees of the BBYRA: Executive, Nominating, Regatta, Financial, Appeals, Protest, Scoring, Class Liaison, Junior Sailing, Membership, Class Eligibility, Sailing Instructions, General Programs and Services, Safety, Historical, US Sailing National Cup Events, Training, and Equipment.

2. All Committees and their chairperson shall be appointed and their duties delineated as herein provided.

3. Each committee shall be authorized to prescribe rules and procedures for the direction of the activities assigned to it, including budget preparation.

4. All committee chairpersons appointed by the Commodore or Vice Commodore, shall serve for a term of one year.

5. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Executive Committee which shall be comprised of the following: The Officers; Past Commodores of the BBYRA; and the incumbent Commodore (or designee of said Commodore) of each Active Member Club. This committee shall have general executive powers of the BBYRA between meetings of the Delegates and shall be responsible for executing the policies set by the Delegates. It shall be presided over by the Commodore, and carry out such other duties as may be specifically set forth in these ByLaws. It may appoint such ad hoc committees (e.g., Finance), as may be necessary in the performance of its duties. It shall normally carry out its duties by telephone, correspondence or meetings as determined by the Commodore. It shall report all of its decisions to the next meeting of the Delegates for their review and ratification.

6. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Nominating Committee, appointed by the Commodore at the Spring Meeting of the Delegates, and consisting of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA. It shall be chaired by the most recent available Past Commodore. The committee shall propose a slate of nominees for Officers to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before the annual meeting of the BBYRA. Additional nominations may be submitted in writing by Delegates, provided the nominees also consent, in writing, to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before said annual meeting, and the Secretary shall notify all Delegates of such nomination(s) at least seven (7) days before said annual meeting. No other nominations shall be accepted at the annual meeting except by unanimous consent of those present and entitled to vote at said meeting.

7. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Regatta Committee, which shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting. "It shall consist of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA (who, collectively, shall have one vote), the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA, who shall act as chairperson, the Rear Commodore who shall act as vice chairperson, the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Fleet Captain and the Measurer (all of whom shall have no vote, unless they are also representing their clubs; in the event of a tie vote, the Vice Commodore, and in his absence, the Rear Commodore may vote); and a minimum of three but not to exceed seven Representatives, designated by each Active and Associate Member Club." The Regatta Committee shall have entire control of BBYRA's Championship Series. It shall receive and

pass upon requests for allotment of racing dates; sanction races; submit for approval, a schedule of proposed races for the next season at the annual meeting of the Delegates, which schedule shall be finalized no later than March 15 of each year for the ensuing season. It shall decide all questions relating to sailing instructions, courses, charts, signals, marks, measurements and allied subjects. It shall have charge of the actual conduct of the races and the selection of courses and the official scoring. It shall recommend changes in the racing rules governing BBYRA sponsored regattas which shall first be submitted to the Executive Committee for review and approval before submission to the Delegates for final action. BBYRA Regatta Committee membership representing eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum. The Regatta Committee shall receive reports from the Protest, Scoring, Sailing Instructions, Safety and Class Eligibility Committees and the Vice Commodore will report important matters to the Delegates, without the need for debate and duplication of said committees reports by both the Regatta Committee and the Delegates.

8. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Financial Committee, chaired by the Treasurer, which shall include the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore and immediate Past Commodore. This committee shall be responsible for combining all budgets prepared by individual committees into an annual budget for presentation to and approval by the Delegates at the annual meeting. This committee shall monitor the financial condition of the BBYRA throughout the year and review and approve all expenditures within the budget of the BBYRA as approved at the annual meeting. This committee shall also be responsible for seeing that the financial condition of the BBYRA is in conformity with the guidelines of the Section 501 (c) (3) status under the Internal Revenue Code.

9. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Appeals Committee, whose members shall be appointed by the Commodore not later than March 1st each year and shall consist of a chairperson and at least four (4) members, all of whom shall be Individual Members in good standing, and preferably shall hold certification as a USSAILING Certified Judge. The committee shall elect, from its membership, a secretary, who shall serve for a term of one (1) year or until a successor is elected. Should the committee adopt any procedural rules which are not prescribed by the Racing Rules approved by USSAILING, said rules shall be published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website, and/or be posted upon the official bulletin board maintained by the Regatta Committee and displayed at each race day during the BBYRA's series of championship regattas. In addition, the secretary of the committee shall cause to be mailed to each Active and Associate Member Club's Regatta Committee representative, a true copy of any such procedural rules. Said representative shall be responsible for the appropriate display or distribution of such rules to his/her club.

10. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Protest Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month after the annual meeting of the BBYRA. The chairperson shall form a suitable composition of the committee from among the general membership of the association. Written results of protest hearing shall be delivered to the scorer. The Vice Commodore will be advised of the results of hearings. It shall be the responsibility of skippers or their representatives to be present at said time and place designated for the hearing of a protest. When possible, the chairperson of the Protest Committee hearing panel on a given race day shall cause said hearing(s) to be held on the date of the race out of which a protest arises.

11. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Scoring Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting, and whose title shall be Scorer. The Commodore may appoint one or more assistant scorers. Both the Scorer and any assistants shall be Individual Members in good standing, and they may be members of other committees. It shall be responsibility of this committee to maintain the BBYRA's computer and related software; to develop a suitable system of records for each of the championship series' regattas; to complete and receive the records of each such regatta and compute the championship score therefrom. The committee shall cause to be published on BBYRA's website or distributed to each Active and Associate Member Club, either directly or through said Clubs' Regatta Committee representative or alternate(s) for the appropriate display and/or distribution at each Active and Associate Member Club, a copy of the cumulative record of each classes competitors and their current standing in their respective classes championship series so that each competitor is able to learn of his/her current standing in the championship series of his/her class. All issues related to a particular competitor's standing should be directed to the Scorer.

12. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Liaison Committee, chaired by the Rear Commodore, which shall meet at least once a year with the representatives of each of the classes then being sailed in the championship series. The committee will receive the

recommendations of the class representatives and report to the Regatta Committee their suggestions for the improvement of racing on Barnegat Bay, and other matters within the purview of the BBYRA's racing activities. The representatives of the classes may appoint, by majority vote, a person to attend at meeting of the Regatta Committee as an observer.

13. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Junior Sailing Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. Said chairperson shall be appointed from a list of persons recommended by the BBYRA's incumbent chairperson of the Junior Sailing Committee, and shall not be an Active or Associate Member Club's junior sailing coordinator for the ensuing sailing year; shall have prior junior sailing administrative experience and be a current Individual Member of the BBYRA. The chairperson may appoint assistants, with the advice and consent of the Commodore, who shall be Individual Members of the BBYRA during their tenure. The chairperson shall: preside at all meetings of the committee; represent the BBYRA at US SAILING Junior activities; coordinate the BBYRA's and Area "C" calendars in cooperation with the BBYRA's chairperson of BBYRA sponsored US SAILING National Cup Events, e.g., O'Day, Sears, Bemis/Smythe, etc; report upon the junior sailing activities of the BBYRA to the Delegates at their annual and spring meetings; appoint a cochair for the purpose of recording minutes and assisting the Treasurer in maintaining financial records of the activities of the junior sailing programs; develop programs for fundraising activities by the committee in coordination with the Treasurer of the BBYRA and with the approval of the Executive Committee; and carry out such further activities in furtherance of the purposes of the BBYRA as the Delegates may deem appropriate.

14. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Membership Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. This committee shall be responsible for promotion of the membership in the BBYRA of the class known as Individual Member. In addition, the Membership Committee shall keep an accurate roll of Individual Members, and issue annually either directly to each active and associate member club or through said Clubs' Regatta Committee representative or alternate(s) membership cards and decals, if any, to those making payment of dues.

15. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Sailing Instructions Committee, charged with the responsibility to annually update, as required, the published sailing instructions, and charts, to be proposed to the Regatta Committee, and published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and he/she shall work in cooperation with the Class Liaison Committee and the Vice Commodore, in their race management functions.

16. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Eligibility Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. The committee shall recommend and maintain guidelines for series eligibility, review the annual performance of each class and investigate the credentials of applicant classes. It shall make recommendations concerning old and new class eligibility to the Regatta Committee.

17. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the General Programs and Services Committee, consisting of at least three Individual Members, one of whom shall be a Past Commodore, all of whom, including a chairperson, shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. In addition, the Commodore shall specify those members of the committee responsible for the website and publication of the Year Book provided for herein. It shall be the responsibility of the committee to develop insurance programs for the BBYRA and its members, including coordination of the BBYRA's insurance programs and that of its Member Clubs, Delegates and Committees, with those services provided by USSAILING, and other organizations; to develop programs for the solicitation of funds for effecting the purposes of the BBYRA as spelled out in its BYLaws, Constitution, and Exemption Letter dated February 28, 1992 from the Internal Revenue Service of the United States Department of the Treasury, determining the BBYRA's exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) and 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code; to solicit invitations from the various Active Member Clubs to host the annual Commodores' Ball or other similar event, and to schedule the dates for future conduct of same; to develop a schedule of advertising fees for space in the BBYRA's Year Book, and to coordinate efforts with the Appeals Committee, Regatta Committee, Sailing Instructions Committee and Executive Committee for the publication of said Year Book; to publish said Year Book; and to be responsible for the public relations of the BBYRA including but not limited to a website. The General Programs and Services Committee shall develop a Policies and Procedure Manual for the conduct of any fund raising activities to be undertaken by or on behalf of the Association, by any of its Active or Associate Member Clubs, or Individual Members. Said manual shall deal explicitly with fiscal responsibility for

such activities. The General Programs and Services Committee shall be responsible for insuring, chartering, maintaining and managing the Ribcraft boats owned by the BBYRA.

18. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Safety Committee, chaired by the Fleet Captain. It shall be the function of the Safety Committee to implement an onwater and offwater safety program for regatta competitors and personnel. The Safety Committee shall be responsible for obtaining appropriate annual "Permit for Marine Event" from the Coast Guard and any permits required by the State of New Jersey.

19. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the US SAILING National Cup Events Committee, charged with the coordination of the BBYRA's elimination series for the US SAILING National Cup Events. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and shall report to the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA on the progress of the US SAILING events BBYRA eliminations, and make recommendations for the improvement thereof.

20. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Historical Committee, charged with the preservation of the records and memorabilia of the Association and its members. It's chairperson, appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, shall be known as the BBYRA Historian. The Historian shall submit a written report of the committee activities to date in the current calendar year.

21. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Training Committee, chaired by the Fleet Captain. It shall be the function of the Training Committee to provide training by organizing and/or holding competitive events and/or meetings in the nature of seminars.

22. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Equipment Committee, chaired by the Rear Commodore. It shall be the function of the Equipment Committee to store and maintain the equipment of the BBYRA and to make same available to the Regatta Committee whenever and wherever requested by the Commodore or Vice Commodore.

ARTICLE TWELVE – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the BBYRA in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these ByLaws and any special rules of order the BBYRA may adopt.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN - INDEMNIFICATION

1. The BBYRA shall indemnify all corporate agents against all expenses and liabilities in connection with any proceeding involving the corporate agent by reason of his or her having been such a corporate agent other than a proceeding by or in the right of the BBYRA if: a) such corporate agent acted in good faith in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be not opposed to the best interests of the BBYRA; and b) with respect to any criminal proceeding, such corporate agent had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.

2. All terms used herein shall have the meanings attributed to such terms as set forth in NJSA 15A:34(a).

3. It is intended that the rights of indemnification provided hereunder shall be as broad as permitted under the laws of the State of New Jersey. Without limiting the foregoing, the BBYRA herewith adopts the provision of NJSA 15A:34 as though fully herein set forth; whenever said statute permits the Association to provide indemnification this ByLaw shall be deemed to require such indemnification to be provided by the BBYRA.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN - AMENDMENTS

Any amendment in the Bylaws may be initiated by any Individual Member, circulated to the members of the Executive Committee.



2020 Reciprocal Rights Shared Among BBYRA Member Clubs

One of the great strengths of the BBYRA is the reciprocity offered to members of other clubs. This is certainly true of our willingness to provide aid, pickup/discharge of passengers and participation in club regattas. At some clubs, this extends to social reciprocity that includes access to the bar, dining and social activities of a club. In this section we usually list the type of reciprocity offered by our clubs.

This year, due to Covid-19, our clubs are finding it difficult to offer services to their own members and protocols may differ from club to club. For those reasons it is difficult to see how social reciprocity can be offered by any of our member clubs this year.

Therefore, I would like all of our members to understand that "social reciprocity" should be considered suspended for 2020. If conditions change and any club wishes to again extend social reciprocity, we will be more than happy to spread the word.
