- Contributed to the first World Sneakbox World Championship to encourage rehabilitation of these beautiful classic wood boats.



The BBYRA's outreach program has also yielded some heartwarming results.

- The Sea Scouts participated on race committee patrol boats, learning about sailboat racing, race management, and practicing radio communication during our weekly race days.
- The NJ Interscholastic Sailing Association has been hugely successful with its fleet of Flying Junior sailboats which are used for high school sailing most of the fall and spring weekends at Toms River Yacht Club.

Plans are underway for the 2026 season, where we will continue engaging youth and building enthusiasm for sailing on Barnegat Bay.
