AN ELEPHANT ENCOUNTER

In early June, Joan and I returned from our ninth safari trip to sub-Saharan Africa. This time we had an unusual encounter with an elephant.

Kanga Camp is located in Mana Pools National Park, in Zimbabwe. The camp was built around a water hole, the Kanga pan, that draws lots of animals and birds, being the only source of water in the dry season. The camp is considered to be an "Armchair Safari" destination, because when the water out in the bush has dried up, all the animals have to come there to drink. Then you can sit in the lounge area and watch them, without getting into a safari vehicle.





Among the elephants that came to the pan was one, named Big Mac by the

staff, who regularly ventured into the camp. One afternoon while we were reading on our deck after lunch, he came by looking for nyala berries that had fallen from the tree by our tent. After a while he decided to check us out and put his tusks and trunk over our railing to sniff Joan. The tip of his trunk came to about four inches from her chest. She was tempted to run her hand down his trunk, but knew it was probably a bad idea. We were told that he would remember her scent if he met her again.

By the time I got the camera, Big Mac had moved to the side, as shown in the photo. When he left, he went to the berry tree by the lounge, one of his usual spots. He was able to maneuver in and out of a very tight space.

While we were at Kanga for two more days, he didn't come to visit us again.
