ELECTRIC VEHICLES

Many thanks to Joe Geagea for his interesting talk at our February luncheon. In answer to a question about electric vehicles, his staff forwarded the following projections:

Chevron's perspective, from the strategic planning group:

Our current reference case projections have EVs getting to 10 percent of new vehicle sales by 2035 in the U.S. Note that this will not be evenly distributed across the country. CA is expected to lead EV adoption with EVs reaching nearly 25 percent of vehicle sales in the state by 2035.

On the impact of EVs on the oil market:

Electric vehicle (EV) sales growth continued to soar last year, increasing 45% from 2016, while total new light vehicle (LV) sales increased just 1%. While the sales growth rate is eye-catching, it is still from a small base. Adding in the one million EVs sold in 2017 with those already on the road, the global EV fleet at the beginning of 2018 stood at about 2.8 million. By comparison, the oil-powered LV fleet was about 1.3 billion. The EV fleet is still tiny—just 0.2% of the global LV fleet—and the impact on oil demand is small as well, but it is growing. A rough estimate is that EVs displaced about 50,000 b/d of oil consumption in 2017. In other words, if there were no EVs, oil demand would have been 50,000 b/d higher. Keep in mind 50,000 b/d is smaller than rounding errors in a global refined product market of about 86 MM b/d and a total liquids market that will reach 100 MM b/d this year.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

Under the new tax law, if we itemize our deductions, we will be able to deduct no more than \$10,000 in state and local taxes. Many of us have paid off our mortgages and, unless we have significant medical expenses, we may not have enough itemized deductions to match or exceed the new standard deduction of \$13,300 for a single senior or \$26,600 for a senior couple. Many of us will thus take the standard deduction rather than itemizing. That means that any charitable donations we make do us no good, tax-wise.

But there is an alternative. If you have a regular IRA and are over 70-1/2 years old, you have to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) each year from your IRA. You can make charitable donations directly from your IRA, called Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD). They count against your RMD and reduce the taxable amount of the RMD. Thus you can reduce your taxable income and can take the new larger standard deduction as well. Another potential benefit is that, in reducing your adjusted gross income, you may reduce the surcharge applied to the premiums for Medicare Parts B and D for higher income taxpayers.

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Chevron Announced Increase in Quarterly Dividend

Jan. 31, 2018 – The Board of Directors of Chevron Corporation (NYSE: CVX) today declared a quarterly dividend of one dollar and twelve cents (\$1.12) per share, payable March 12, 2018, to all holders of common stock as shown on the transfer records of the Corporation at the close of business February 16, 2018. This increase puts Chevron on track to make 2018 the 31st consecutive year with an increase in annual dividend payout.

Chevron Issues Second Climate Report for Investors

March 1, 2018 – Chevron Corporation (NYSE: CVX) today published its second report describing the company's approach to managing climate change risks and its resilience under a low carbon scenario. Titled Climate Change Resilience – A Framework for Decision Making, the publication builds on the company's prior report on managing climate change risks and provides more detail on the company's approach to governance, risk management, strategic planning and emission reduction investments and activities, including key metrics.

The report summarizes Chevron's work to test the competitiveness of its current assets under multiple scenarios, including some of the most restrictive greenhouse gas reduction proposals such as the Sustainable Development Scenario from the International Energy Agency. The results demonstrate that the company's portfolio, due to its maturity and diversity across assets and geographies, is resilient in a wide variety of possible scenarios and enables Chevron to be flexible in response to potential changes.


