On February 24, 2023, Zion International Missions Ministry, Inc. conducted a Bomba Village Health Clinic Groundbreaking Ceremony in Belize, Central America.. The Groundbreaking Ceremony was a monumental moment that consisted of Belize Community Healthcare Workers from different villages, residents from the rural areas, volunteers, and the Belize Ministry of Health & Wellness staff.



### Healthy People & Healthy Villages

Bomba Village Health Clinic will provide healthcare services to families in six (6) surrounding villages: Bomba, Lucky Strike, Maskall, Rock Stone Pond, Santana and St. Annes. The Bomba Village Health Care clinic will provide general healthcare services for children and adults. The medical staff will have special focus on meeting the healthcare needs, which will specialize in these four (4) areas:

- **Eye care** (Vision) – How to care for your eyes
- **Oral Care** (Dentistry) – Proper Oral & Gum Care
- **Prostate Health** – Symptoms & Supportive Care
- **Mental Health**- Signs, Symptoms & Solutions

General healthcare services will include conditions of hypertension, diabetes, and women's wellness.

Providing healthcare services will address current illness and prevent problems devastating current and future generations.



### History:

In 2005, the first Missions team to Belize conducted a limited medical survey within Maskall and Bomba villages. The medical survey report provided Health care data to the Belize Ministry of Health.

In 2010, a second Missions team visited Belize and a follow-up survey was conducted in the same villages to collect data and compare the survey's conducted in 2005.



In July 2021, ZIMM's Health care mission's team was established with healthcare professionals, and they conducted medical surveys in the six (6) villages.

No family should be without easy access to healthcare. Therefore, ZIMM's efforts are to bridge the healthcare gap between the villages and Belize City.
