Before discussing this title, we must back up a little. Actually, ... quite a ways.

The Christ

Without Him, there are no Christians and obviously ... no Christian websites. So, who is He? The Bible teaches that God became a man. He is called, the Christ (the anointed one) and Jesus is identified as that One. What a person believes about this claim - has no effect upon it. For centuries, God had worked with one particular culture, and chose to make His appearance there. *"He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came into His own things (Israel), and those who were His own did not receive Him"* (Jn 1:10,11). Over those centuries, He had revealed many things about His person, will, and ways. Israel should have welcomed Him, but, as a whole, they did not. We are told He had *"no stately form or majesty that we should look upon Him, nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him"* (Isa 53:2). Most likely, His enemies hated His looks and mannerisms ... maybe even the pitch of His voice. They were determined to silence that voice. Eventually, they framed Him, and had Him executed.

At one point in His ministry, Jesus stated, *"A pupil is not above his teacher; but everyone, after he has been fully trained, will be like his teacher"* (Lk 6:40). Human nature has not changed. If given the opportunity, many will silence a voice they do not want to hear. For any Christian, a life that does not end like the Teacher's ... well, that pupil has been spared. That's fine with me. I have no desire to end this life on a Roman cross - or any contemporary equivalent.

In spite of this possible outcome, Christians, over the millennia, have steadfastly shared their experiences they have had with the living God. Political and technological advances have often granted new avenues for the expression of this witness. Whether a government granted religious freedom, or someone invented a printing press, or a radio, or a television ... great platforms have been opened for a Christian's "voice." Let's look at a new one.

The Internet

A few years ago, there was no such thing as the Internet ... or a Christian website. This medium is truly astounding. It is now possible for Christians to upload their work and influence people all over the world - without leaving the desk. Christians who live in countries where they can exercise this "voice" have been granted inordinate favor. Such fortune is remarkable. Words cannot convey the magnitude of such an opportunity. Personally, I am amazed God has placed such a "megaphone" at the end of fingertips attached to such faulty hands ... like mine.

So, with this new medium, the Christian should expect new rules, right? New times, new opportunities, new boundaries, right? Well, you already know what I am going to say. All the old rules still apply. A Christian website is not *"a free zone."* So, what are the rules? *"Each man must watch how he builds on (the foundation). For no man can lay a foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any man builds upon the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw, each man's work will become evident; for The Day will display it, because it is to be revealed with fire; and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. If any man's work, which he has built upon (the foundation) survives, he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss"* (1Cor 3:10-15). Of course, any material about God that springs from a different foundation has absolutely no hope of prevailing before our Creator. DOA.

Reward ... or Fire

A primary determinant between reward and fire is the accuracy of the proclaimed knowledge. "Good intentions," or one's "interpretation," or what "seems right," or "feels right," does not obligate God to use that information to expand His Kingdom. Did I even need to say that? And it does not matter if error springs from simple ignorance - or malicious deception. It is still destined for fire.

The Bible's most dire warnings are directed at those who represent the Creator. He is to be represented accurately - and warnings are clear toward those who take on this task. "*Let not many among you become teachers, my brethren, knowing that as such we shall incur a stricter judgement*" (Ja 3:1). This is warning to *brethren* - who have been pardoned! So what awaits false teachers, and false prophets, etc., - who promote contrary religious constructs? God is extremely direct about this ... with consequences far beyond our contemplative abilities (See 2Pet 2:1-22 and Jude: 3-19 for starters.)

But along with accurate content, there is another bedrock consideration for "*how*" one should properly build upon the foundation. Before I became a Christian, I always knew when I stumbled on a Christian radio or television station. Within minutes (or seconds) they would be asking for money - my money, your money, grandma's money, anybody's money, everybody's money. I wondered, "*What kind of 'God' needs to have His representatives in my billfold?*" This turned me off ... and, with the flip of a switch, I turned them off. Fortunately, the Author of the Bible didn't turn me off.

At age 23, I decided to read the Bible. To my amazement, I found an abundance of information about money ... and religious frauds. At the time of this writing, I have been a Christian for over thirty years. God has never charged me a penny for any of His information - or acts - on my behalf. And He never will. So, if I am claiming to represent Him to others ... why would I? Of course, I have heard "*why*" for three decades ... but most "*whys*" are rationalizations - not reasons. He doesn't *need* my money, your money, grandma's money, anybody's money, everybody's money. "*Freely you received, freely give*" (Mt 10:8). Shouldn't the Christian seek out this option *first*?

So, let's consider a Christian website and the Bible. With small personal cost, one can now *freely offer* what God has taught him/her - all over the world. This is exciting ... and stunning. When I think of Christians past (and present), who have never been granted such a "*voice*" ... it is clear this has nothing to do with fairness. But, even more to the point, when God Himself was here, did He give Himself a megaphone like this? So, this platform ... for a pupil?

Do you have a Christian website? Purpose to make it solid in content - a treasure chest - with no money barrier in front of His treasure. Like it or not, every nook, cranny and corner of it will be examined by His unyielding-to-error gaze for content ... and procedure. Why "*toil for fire*" (Hab 2:13)? May God have mercy on us all.

Endnote: It is now 2019 and I have just tweaked this article. In the early years, my site had quite a bit of traffic. But after Google created new algorithms that negatively impacted my search engine rankings, here are my last 7 days: 12 first time visitors and 10 returning visitors. That is 3 visits per day. I probably should be discouraged and disheartened ... but I'm not! Impacting 22 souls all over the world this week ... discouraged? No way! 52 weeks x 22 visitors per week = 1,144 in a year!
