General information

Our conference will be held at King's House Conference Centre, Sidney Street, Manchester, M1 7HB. The closest train stations are Manchester Oxford Road (0.4 miles away) and Manchester Piccadilly (0.7 miles away). A number of buses serve the area, and we encourage attendees to use public transport where possible. The nearest car park is NCP Circle Square, Princess Street, M1 7DN - a 3 minute walk from the venue. The conference will be held on the first floor of the conference centre, which is accessible by lift. There are no steps at the ground floor entrance to the conference centre.

Refreshments will be served throughout the day, and lunch will be served after the second workshop session. Our workshop hosts will guide participants through group discussion and learning, aiming to end each session with a practical action point to make a difference locally.




