Folds of Honor is a 501(C)(3) nonprofit organization, rated a four-star charity by Charity Navigator and platinum on GuideStar, that provides educational scholarships to the spouses and children of military men and women who have fallen or are disabled as a result of active duty service in the United States armed forces. Our educational scholarships support private school tuition or tutoring for children in grades K – 12, as well as post-secondary tuition assistance for spouses and dependents.

HIGHER EDUCATION

Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll at an accredited college, university, licensure/technical program for an associate's or bachelor's degree, certificate/license, or post-graduate degree or program

Open to applicants pursuing their first degree, certificate or license, and to those pursuing post-graduate work, such as a master's degree, doctorate, or a second bachelor's degree or trade/technical program certificate

Minimum SAT/ACT and GPA: 2.0 or higher term GPA for the two most recent academic terms (Fall and Spring, not Summer)



CHILDRENS FUND

Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll in an accredited private school OR tutoring institution

Applicants must be at least age 5 (by September 1st of calendar year applying in) and enrolled in full-time Kindergarten program



SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Our scholarship is open to **any** child or spouse whose service member has either fallen **or** has a combined service-connected disability rating through the VA

You can apply during the Annual Application

Window: February 1 – March 31

Value of the scholarship: up to \$5,000 per academic year, based on unmet need

Since its inception in 2007, Folds of Honor has awarded nearly **62,000** scholarships totaling about **\$290** million in all 50 states. Among the students served, **45** percent represent minorities.
