### Marching Bands

- Allowed to have one vehicle following
- Walking chaperones
- Everyone must be uniformed and easily identifiable
- All marching participants , including band members, cheerleaders, flag swirlers, dance team, color guards, drum majors, should have a maximum number of participants of 125 people.

### Dance Groups (youth & adult groups) & Marching Troupes

- Allowed to have one vehicle following or leading
- Amplified speakers
- Walking chaperones
- Everyone must be uniformed and easily identifiable

### Non-Profit Organizations

- Allowed to have one vehicle, trailer, or float
- Advertising banners, flyers, marketing material allowed to hand out
- Throws allowed (see throws page)

### Businesses

- Allowed to have one vehicle, trailer, or float
- Advertising banners, flyers, marketing material allowed to hand out
- Throws allowed (see throws page)

### Military Troops

- Allowed to have one vehicle, float or trailer
- Walking troops

Social Clubs - Motorcycle, Shriners, Fraternities & Sororities, Sports, Political, etc.

- Allowed to have one vehicle, trailer, or float, outside of motorcycles and car clubs
- Advertising banners, flyers, marketing material allowed to hand out
- Throws allowed (see throws page)

First Responders – EMS, Fire Department, Police Department, etc

- Allowed to have one vehicle, trailer, or float
- Advertising banners, flyers, marketing material allowed to hand out
- Throws allowed (see throws page)

Alumni Group

- Allowed to have one vehicle, trailer, or float
- Advertising banners, flyers, marketing material allowed to hand out
