Good Morning Attorney General Formella and Attorney McCormick:

I write to you to share what I believe is evidence of a crime that has been committed by Town of Dalton Selectman Tom Dubreuil, in an effort to keep concealed from the public eye communications and documents relative to the Casella GSL landfill project in Dalton. As you can read in the attached documents, Selectman Dubreuil acted unilaterally in his official position as a town selectman, with knowledge and without authorization, on November 26, 2024, to block a 91-A RTK request for communications and documentation relative to the Granite State Landfill project.
See attached document 1, 91-A RTK request submitted to the Town of Dalton, October 17, 2024.

On November 20, 2024, Selectman Dubreuil responded to the request, submitting only one lone document, an email exchange with Lisa Riendeau of the AVRDD Mt. Carberry Landfill, dated November 6, November 4 and November 1, 2024. See 2nd attached document.

On November 21, 2024, I authorized Attorney Jeremy Eggleton, of Orr & Reno, to send a follow-up letter, in support of my 91-A RTK request. In his letter, Attorney Eggleton suggested that the IT contractor conduct a search of the Town's email server. See 3rd attached document.

Following that, the next regular meeting of the Town of Dalton Selectboard was held on Monday, November 25, 2024. See page 3 of the attached meeting minutes in the 4th attached document, which notes that there were 3 "non-public" topics discussed, which I can only surmise included a discussion about the November 21, 2024 letter received from Orr & Reno, with a vote of 2-1 to authorize the IT search (I have no confirmation of this, as the minutes were sealed).

The very next morning, at 6:41 AM, Selectman Dubreuil sent an **official email to the Town's IT contractor, Certified Computer Solutions, in his position as a Town Selectman**, the following:

On Nov 26, 2024, at 6:41 AM, Thomas Dubreuil <tdubreuil@townofdaltonnh.gov> wrote:
*Good morning, I'm writing to you to let you know that a RTK request has or is being sent to you asking you to scan all my town emails, documents. **This is not to be sent** until you have received confirmation from our town legal. This is and has become a legal matter, because this beyond RTK. Thank **selectman Tom***

See 5th attached document, 11/26/2024 email from Selectman Tom Dubreuil. (Which I received only as a result of the fulfillment of my 91-A RTK request) I would also note that it appears the none of the other board members, nor admin, were cc'd by Selectman Dubreuil.

On December 4, 2024, Town Administrator Jeanette Charon sent an email request to the Town's IT contractor, Certified Computer Solutions, to conduct a search of the Town's email server in order to comply with the 91-A RTK request of October 17, 2024. She was promptly informed by Ms. Lavelle of Certified Computer Solutions that Selectman Dubreuil had "requested that we **hold off on completing this project** until we have approval from the Town's legal team". Town Administrator Charon then replies that "The Board voted 2-1 on this topic. Respectfully, **Tom (Dubreuil) does not have the authority to make that request**".
See 6th attached document.

On December 12, 2024, I received four emails from Town Administrator Charon, containing a zip file in each as an attachment, totaling 81 documents pertaining to my 91-A RTK request of October 17, 2024.

It is my belief that the unilateral and unauthorized actions of Town of Selectman Tom Dubreuil, on November 26, 2024, in direct conflict with an approved decision by the Town of Dalton Selectboard, as referenced by Town Administrator Charon in her December 4, 2024 response to Certified Computer Solutions, to purposely obstruct the fulfillment of a right-to-know request is not only a violation of RSA 91-A RTK law, but also RSA 642:1 (I).

RSA 642:1 Obstructing Government Administration

I. A person is guilty of a misdemeanor if that person uses intimidation, actual or threatened force or violence, simulated legal process, or engages in any other unlawful conduct with a purpose to hinder or interfere with a public servant, as defined in RSA 640:2, II, performing or purporting to perform an official function or to retaliate for the performance or purported performance of such a function.

Selectman Dubreuil had no authorization to reach out to the Town's IT contractor as he did, in an attempt to **knowingly and purposely hinder/interfere with the fulfillment of an official Town request for fulfilling a 91-A RTK request**. If that doesn't fit the definition of some kind of illegal behavior by an elected official in official capacity, then Heaven help us!

This latest evidence of wrongdoing should serve to validate what I believe to be is an ongoing conspiracy by Selectman Dubreuil and Selectman Eric Moore, to help advance a very unpopular, controversial landfill project, worth Billions of dollars in future landfill and solid waste revenue streams, on behalf of Casella Waste Systems. The documents I did receive serve to confirm that these two men are acting unilaterally, communicating via cell phones, outside of public meetings, without public knowledge, nor legal authorization, in conjunction with representatives from Casella Waste Systems, as I have previously charged.

I continue to prove wrongdoing by these two elected officials, based on the information I have uncovered and witnessed. What else may be going on behind the scenes that we don't know about? Only your investigative powers can uncover and flush out the truth. A pattern of behavior is visible here, which continues to support my belief that there is a conspiracy at play, involving corrupt, public officials, a solid waste company, and **Billions of dollars** in future landfill and solid waste revenue streams.

In order to not get sued a third time by Casella, I need you to understand that all of this is my opinion, based on my research and experience.
