


Underground Railroad

Sharon Haydock, Pittsboro, NC, donated a portrait of Hannah Thompson Haydock painted by C. C. Webber in 1882. The portrait was donated in memory of Thomas Carmichael Haydock's family. Hannah was born to Quakers Thomas A. & Elizabeth Benbow Thompson. They belonged to the White Lick Monthly Meeting and are buried at West Union Cemetery outside of Monrovia. She married Zeno Haydock in 1840.

The Morgan County Bicentennial committee reported that the West Union Friends were declared abolitionists. Their deep belief in freedom inspired many of the Friends to help slaves escape to Canada through the Underground Railroad system. Children who attended the West Union Schoolhouse would catch glimpses of

slaves waiting for assistance in the heavy woods near the school.

Over the years five locations have been identified as underground railroad sites in Morgan County: Porter's Cave, northwest of Paragon; a site in the Morgan Monroe Forestry; West Union Church area, Monrovia; the Morgan County History Center & Museum (the Blackstone house), the cellar; the original Black homestead, Brooklyn. These may or may not have been stops on the railroad.

Coming Soon Video Clips



Carver shared the following story:

"When Araminta was a little girl her family crossed the Ohio River into Indiana (from Kentucky). Her father or grandfather was clearing

land, probably in Dearborn County, and a large bear attacked her and her sister, Sarah. The father killed the bear and rescued the girls. Another time Araminta was scalped

by Indians and left as dead." The scalping story is what caused Paul and Barbara North to seek out Arminta's grave, which is located in the Samaria Baptist Church Cemetery, Paragon. A picture of Arminta is shown above, A scalping did not remove the entire scalp and hair.
