Here's a peek at our Main Storage area upstairs. We have a very limited space for storage. Most items are stored on shelving in containers. Large items such as maps are in the map storage units. Linda Stivers has built rolling, adjustable storage units for large pic-

ture frames. The gals have done a fantastic job of using all available space. Randy Marsh has mapped our rooms showing display case locations.



The storage on the far end is items that have been donated but not yet entered into our museum software. Another room houses the clothing, uniforms, and hats.

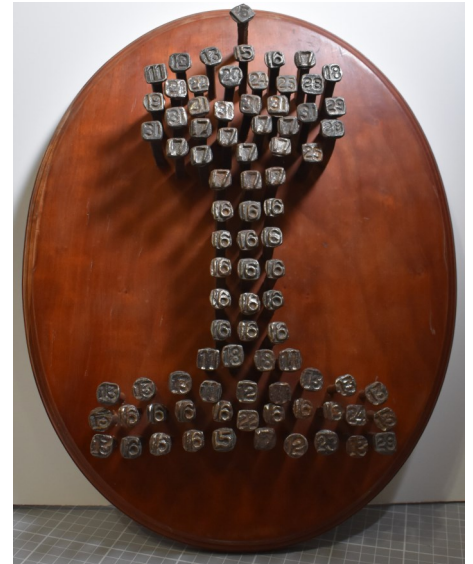


Martinsville Cookie Stroll

Morgan County History Center & Museum Meetings

The annual MCHC&M meeting was held at the Grace Worship Center, Centerton, in December. During the election Volitta Fritche and Randy Marsh were re-elected to their positions. In the January board meeting, Randy Marsh was elected chairman of the museum, Patty Dow, vice chair and secretary, and Darrell French was elected treasurer. The board officially meets every first Tuesday of the month. The next meeting is February 6 at the museum.

The museum operating committee meets every first Monday of the month at the museum. During January planning meetings were held every Monday.

We Are Here to Help

Indiana Department of Natural Resources recently contacted us trying to locate the Nebo Mill. A quick call to Becki Hamilton in the County Assessor's Office resulted in an answer and a picture of the mill which is still standing. DNR department of historic preservation and archaeology is currently working on resurveying Morgan County for historic resources to locate many of the older sites that were surveyed back in 1990's.

Wayne Haase came in for assistance with his Hoosier Homestead Application. He's awaiting the Indiana Department of Agriculture final approval.

Several people have been in looking for genealogical information. Our files are small but growing.

The museum assisted the Morgan County History and Genealogy Association with their graveyard sonar project. We are eager to be of assistance and appreciate your input.
