
Attention: All Parade Participants

The **parade participant headquarters** will be in the East Parking Lot of the Briarwood Mall. Jaycee parade marshals will be wearing **red** volunteer shirts with **blue lanyards**. They will have the line-up list and will be able to direct you to your position and answer any questions you might have.

A liability waiver has been enclosed with this letter. <u>All participants must print and sign their names on the waiver to participate in the parade. We strongly encourage you to fill out the waiver and return it electronically by July 1st</u>, or bring this form with you the day of the parade. Minors participating in the parade must have a parent or legal guardian sign the waiver. Please feel free to make additional copies of the waiver. Extra copies will be on hand the day of the parade.

A parade marshal will be assigned to your group. This marshal will be collecting your liability waiver, will help control the pace of the parade by helping your unit stay the appropriate distance from the unit in front of you, and will answer any questions you might have.

We ask for your cooperation to avoid traffic problems. Please do not park any vehicles in the route or line up areas unless they are part of your parade. Also in this document is a copy of the Ann Arbor Jaycees **Parade Rules**. Please review them with your group and follow them accordingly.

Group signs, shirts, or similar are encouraged to make announcing easier for our emcee.

Participant Schedule of Events:

8:00-9:00am Participants arrive, check-in, turn in waivers, and line up in their position

9:55am Pull out Begins

10:00am Official start of the parade

The 2023 parade route is approximately 1 mile and will take about 30 minutes to complete. We expect that a single group will take about 20 minutes to walk the route. Be sure to take your time and stop at several points so the parade doesn't move too quickly and the crowd can get photos.

Ann Arbor Jaycees 4th of July Parade Rules

Est. 1936

- 1. Please do not park your vehicle along the staging areas unless your vehicle is in the parade or you are unloading equipment.
- The Parade Committee has final determination of acceptance of each participant unit as well as the
 overall objectives of the parade. If the unit misrepresents the accepted description of the unit, it may
 be removed. Likewise, participants with conduct or content unbecoming of a friendly celebration of our
 country and community may be removed.
- 3. Groups that are removed for any reason from the parade may be barred from future participation.
- 4. Participant groups shall not change assigned lineup position without approval of the Parade Committee. Failure to gain approval may result in possible removal from the parade and participation may be barred from future participation.
- 5. No fee will be paid to any participant unless there is prior written agreement and approval by the Ann Arbor Jaycees.
- 6. Please follow your parade marshal's instructions to maintain the pace of the parade.
- 7. You may hand out items (including candy) to people along the route. Do not encourage crowd participants to run out into the street. We prefer you drop items closer to the edge of the road. Please refer to a parade marshal with questions.
- 8. Each parade unit must provide their own banner or other identifying signage.
- 9. All animal units must provide a "clean-up" detail behind their units.
- 10. All participants will be required to follow the designated parade route to completion. If you leave the parade route you may not be allowed to re-enter the parade.
- 11. The Parade Committee shall have sole and final approval of all activities related to the Parade in controlled areas designated by and under the permit issued by the city of Ann Arbor. Common and good sense shall dictate the tone and the management of this family and community based parade.
