Dear Messiah,

Welcome to Advent – the season that will slowly lead us to Christmas Eve and the birth of the Christ child. For many of you, this season will go all too quickly with all there is to do! Scheduling and preparing meals with loved ones, making sure Santa comes (sufficiently) to everyone in your life and family, and coordinating your own life in the middle of it all. Church this season is the place where you can come to slow down, find quiet, and “drop in” to the rhythm of the journey we’re making together to Christmas.

So much of the world this time of year pushes at us. *Be merry and bright!* is the call of the season I encounter most around town, on social media, and in tv adds. There is cause to be happy of course, even to rejoice: Jesus, the word made flesh, is coming and soon. But this matters little to the world we live in.

But in the church it matters to us, so much so that we approach this season much differently. We center anticipation of his coming, we prepare for it, and we reflect on what his coming means for ourselves and for the world. And we do these things with rituals we only use in Advent, in this season of waiting.

For instance, we will be lighting an Advent Wreath – this helps us mark each of the four Sundays of Advent with the lighting of an additional candle each week.

Imagining the first candle lit this coming Sunday, I am struck this year by those that are not yet lit. These candles signify to me what is missing, what is *wanting*, in the world and in our own lives. It speaks to the loss of loved ones no longer celebrating with us, the lack of basic necessities for so many (including food, housing, and even safety), and all those we know and love suffering in darkness. But one candle *is* lit, flickering hope in us and anticipation for the growing, insistent light of the journey pushing back the darkness.

Some churches that do not celebrate Advent (and some that do) sing Christmas carols to push back that dark. It’s a season of celebration for them – Joy to the world! all month long. We will be singing Advent carols until Christmas Eve, as another way of marking time and extending our journey through Advent, delaying the gratification that is promised but has yet to arrive.

And once again this year, in hopes that it will increase our anticipation even more, we will not be celebrating the Eucharist (Holy Communion) during Advent. In this way we will lean into the wanting of this season, anticipating all the more “God with us” in the Christ child. On Christmas Eve, we will feast once again on all that God promises to do through this child.

I hope none of this leaves you feeling deprived this season. Rather, I hope you find that your journey through Advent is deepened and that when Christ arrives, as he surely will, what we find wanting in our own lives pales in the light of his presence.

Do you want to help mothers and babies through Lutheran World Relief?



Barb Ostrum, in my mind, has always been the "get it done" person around here. As a retired administrator, she has the critical thinking skills and abilities to keep things moving in the right direction, and has served on our church council for many years. She is an excellent singer, music reader, and bridge player who actually teaches people how to play bridge. I am in awe of her dedication to Messiah and to our community. We are indeed blessed that she is a member of our flock.

My faith journey began with my parents at American Lutheran Church in Billings: Sunday school, Sunday church, confirmation, youth group, church choir and pot lucks.

At college, I always sought out and found a church I could walk to. My first teaching job in Denver proved more difficult to find a church fit. So I really church shopped that year.

After marrying we attended American Lutheran in Billings. We followed Sunday church and Sunday school as well. We volunteered as money counters as well and going out to lunch afterwards. We also were nursery attendants, room decorators, choir members, served on church council and attended many pot lucks too. Then the marriage dissolved. I continued volunteering at American Lutheran in many worthwhile events and projects.

In 1996 I began my remodel of the Red Lodge cabin as general contractor and electrician of record. I also attended Messiah, the only Lutheran church in Red Lodge. The congregation was welcoming for sure. I retired from education in 2000 and became a member of Messiah.

I loved volunteering at Messiah by singing in the choir and serving on church council. I volunteered in the community as part of DSVS, Habitat for Humanity, Carbon County Arts Guild, and Thrivent. I have always enjoyed my time spent in helping others in purposeful ways.

For decades my main service project has been quilting. Even to this day I quilt at Messiah and keep my machine at home well oiled. Last year our fourteen hands created 104 Lutheran World Relief quilts and so far this year 49 quilts are ready for packing.

My faith has been the mainstay of my life. Well, I enjoy playing Bridge too...only one group has a money pay off. And Christmas Kids Shoppe is on Sat Dec 6 this year, coming up very soon. COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING SERVICE AND MEAL—NOVEMBER 23, 2025

Sunday evening, three churches, the Red Lodge Community UCC, Calvary Episcopal, and Messiah Lutheran Church joined together to offer a Thanksgiving service and meal to the greater Red Lodge Community, here at Messiah. Gwen Williams, a friend of our congregation, gave a generous donation to ensure that we would have plenty of turkeys and hams and whatever else we needed to feed a crowd. The community church was bringing salads and Calvary Episcopal was bringing desserts. Because we had no idea how many people might attend, we sent out a plea to the Messiah congregation for side dishes and desserts, hoping we would have enough food and also hoping we wouldn't have far too much.

Saturday, our Family Life Committee decorated the gathering space and set up 97 place settings as well as tables where the food would be served. We were hopeful that we had calculated correctly so that all would be fed. Our treasurer and master chef, Paul Schauer, was here cooking turkeys, stuffing, hams, mashed potato casserole and his famous creamed corn, and food donations began coming in.

Sunday evening came and people began arriving, bearing side dishes and desserts. Oh my! We had an abundance of everything. The seats in the sanctuary were full, we shared a lovely service of thanksgiving, and then we ate. We estimate that we fed about 100 people as well as delivering meals to shut-ins.

So many people helped to make this a success. Many thanks to everyone who helped out in any way or brought food or simply came and enjoyed the fellowship!

All this would not have been possible without one special guest, a visitor who offered to come and help with the meal; his name is Dennis. He pitched right in, cut up the hams and turkeys, dished up stuffing and much more. He even stayed to clean up and take out the garbage! We suspect he was an angel sent to help us. Thank you, Dennis.

a community ministry of kindness

Save Your Suds is a ministry that was started by Calvary Episcopal Church in June of 2023.

The purpose of the program is to spread kindness in our community by helping people pay for their laundry expenses at Rock Creek Laundromat.

Owner of the laundromat, Jim Moore, generously donates the cost of washing. He provides us with a key to the washing machines that allows us to bypass the need for quarters or credit cards.

The cost of drying is covered by donations from the Episcopal Church Women and from parishioners from Calvary.

Volunteers run the program which is held on the first and third Sundays of every month from 5-7p.m.

Each week a bin is provided to that week's volunteers.


The bin is outfitted with the following items:
