Do not go gentle into that good night, Old age should burn and rave at close of day; Rage, rage against the dying of the light.

Dear Messiah,

These are the opening words of a poem by Dylan Thomas (1914-1953). I heard them in these first days of this new year amid the news (a terrorist truck attack in New Orleans, a bombing in Nevada, a plane crash in Korea, and more). In these last days of the Christmas season, I'm reminded how easily this buoyant, season of joy at the birth of Jesus gives way to the darkness of January, just days after the darkest day of the year. Are you feeling a little bit of dread as the rest of winter approaches? A little bit curious about where that sense of hope that came with Christmas will come from next?

But as all seasons go (including liturgical seasons in the church) with the end of one another approaches. Epiphany starts on Monday, January 6th, and it is the season of Light. The joy of Christmas gives way to the season of light – the light of Christ entering the world, the star by which the "Wise Men" find Jesus, the light of wisdom, the light of truth, the light of hope, and the light each of us carries in the world that we're exhorted to let shine. Even as the Sun begins its slow return, lengthening these days, Epiphany and the long, dark months ahead are a time to "rage against the dying of the light."

I was reminded too in these first days of 2025 that in John's gospel "Belief" is always an active thing – it's not something you have, in other words, it's something you do. I think this is true. I also think it's true for a lot of other things. Like happiness – it's not something you have, it's something you do. What about hope? Do we have hope, or do we do it? Maybe a little of both, but you get my drift.

What I'm getting at is, I want to know, what are you planning to do to keep your light burning, to keep your hope alive through this dark season of light? How are you planning to rage against the dying of the light, your light? Will you be exercising more? Eating less junk food? Maybe getting a little more consistent with your daily devotionals? These might sound like new year's resolutions, but they are not. These and many more things are ways to sustain your light – because the world needs your light, this year and beyond.

Messiah Charity Quilters would love your help


from 1pm—3 pm each Monday. Everything is provided except your sewing needle and a pair of scissors. We will teach you what you need to know.

ANNUAL MEETING

Please join us for our annual meeting being held on January 26th. After worship, we invite you to enjoy an early lunch provided by Paul Schauer and his wife, LeeAnn. We will hold the annual meeting in the gathering space toward the end of the meal. At this meeting, we will be asking members to vote on the nominations ballot, the gift policy and the sabbatical policy. We invite members and non-members to attend the lunch and the meeting and openly welcome comments and questions. It is a meeting where we reflect on the year we just closed and look to the coming year and all we want to accomplish.

OPEN LEADERSHIP POSITIONS

We are still seeking 3 people to fill Council positions.

1. Vice President. This person steps in to run the meetings if the President is not able. This person works on specific projects as requested/needed (i.e. endowment fund, policy manuals). The term of this position is for 3 years, ending Jan, 2028.

2. Outreach. This team leads Outreach activities, striving to include the community in good works (ex. concerts on the land, worship on the land, snow-angel making) and to invite the community to join us at Messiah. This team also leads the monthly special offering, seeking speakers to present on various topics. The term of this position is for 3 years, ending Jan, 2028.

3. Stewardship. This team leads our annual stewardship campaign for both the general fund and for our mortgage. Additionally, this team oversees the counting and reporting of donations as they are gathered. As this position has been vacant for some months, the term of this position is for 2 additional years, ending on Jan, 2027.

We are also seeking one or two people to serve on the Nominating Committee for 2025. This team works primarily Oct - Dec, finding members for the various church leadership roles each year. The outcome of this team is the ballot that is presented to the congregation at the annual meeting. The term for this committee is 1 year.

This is the proposed Sabbatical Policy for Messiah Lutheran Church.

MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH SABBATICAL GUIDELINES

PURPOSE OF A SABBATICAL

Wholeness and wellness are important principles in the life of the church and in the practice of its ministry. Congregations and agencies will be served best by pastors and deacons who are healthy--both spiritually and physically--and who are committed to grow both in their understanding of the faith and in enhancing their skills in ministry. A sabbatical provides an opportunity for the pastor to take an intentional, extended period of time away from regular parish demands to experience renewal, study, spiritual growth, travel, or skill development. After the sabbatical the pastor returns to the parish with new energy and resources for ministry.

LENGTH OF SABBATICAL

A sabbatical may be granted for twelve weeks (three months). The sabbatical takes the place of any continuing education time for that year. Vacation time is not included as sabbatical time.

ELIGIBILITY

A pastor may take a sabbatical after every sixth full year of service with approval by the church council.

FINANCING A SABBATICAL

The congregation will pay full salary and benefits during the sabbatical. Expenses incurred during the sabbatical – e.g. Tuition, books, supplies, travel and living expenses outside of the parsonage – will be borne by the pastor. These expenses may be covered by allotted continuing education funds.

PLANNING

Planning for a sabbatical should begin the calendar year before the sabbatical. A written proposal for a sabbatical should be submitted for approval no later than six months before the sabbatical. The timing and proposed plans for a sabbatical must be approved by the church council.

COMMITMENTS FOLLOWING A SABBATICAL

The pastor is normally expected to serve Messiah for at least twelve months following the sabbatical. The pastor will present the results/impact of his/her sabbatical to the congregation within a mutually agreed upon period of time following the completion of the sabbatical.
