
# Light in the Beartooths

#### Dear Messiah,

We are rounding the last corner of summer and anticipating fall – can you believe it?! A few things will be starting up in this next season that will grow our relationships with each other and with the Spirit of God who is guiding the way. We had a good adult forum during the 9:00-10:00 hour before worship Sunday, July 28, during which we discussed the proposed Congregational Care Committee. A number of details were actually decided at that meeting that will keep confidentiality central to our work. And while more details will need deciding in the coming month, the "road" will be made as we walk it together.

In the wake of that meeting, a few people have offered lists of skills they have that could be put to use by this committee in support of our members. Enough of such lists have come across my desk that a new element of this Congregation Care Committee is forming, something we might call a Congregational Care Inventory.

This collection of things members are willing to offer would be a place committee members could turn to get help where it is needed. Examples of such things include basic computer problem help, the purging and simplifying of financial records and files, help with paying bills such as disputes or confusing billing mysteries (of which there are so many!), searching for professionals who might be able to offer specialized help and resources, and taking things to the post office, the recycling center and picking up groceries / prescriptions / etc. just to name a few. These could also include delivering meals, providing company to relieve adult care providers, a simple visit, moving/hauling help, and more. What would be on your list of things you would be willing to offer a member who needed some help?

One question I have is how we would collect each of your "lists". Perhaps it's a simple sheet of paper we include on the Messiah Connects notepads, or it's an email to which you can respond. I think coming up with our lists is a useful exercise in helping us to imagine all the ways we can offer support, help, encouragement and care to each other. An equally important exercise might mirror this one – thinking of all the things in which you could use some help and support.

To be sure, this Congregational Care Committee and a possible care inventory are counter cultural here in the American Mountain West. Being willing to offer help might be less counter cultural than being willing to receive it, but Jesus consistently shows up to those willing to risk the vulnerability asking for help entails. May we be so bold.


The Annual Fun Run for Charities in Red Lodge is a Labor Day Weekend fundraising event for charitable organizations in Carbon County.


