CHRISMON SYMBOLS

Chrismons originated at Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia in 1957 and have been adapted by churches of many denominations to be used at Christmas to remind us of God's Son Jesus Christ. The word *Chrismon* is derived from "Christ Monogram." Chrismons are religious symbols representing many aspects of the Christian faith. Chrismons are traditionally white (the liturgical color of Christmas and Easter that signifies joy and holiness) and gold (representing the glory, majesty and kingship of Jesus.)

Dear Messiah,

The silence around church all these days between Sundays that Dianne and I experienced for our first few months in the new building was rather pronounced. That silence dimmed remarkably when The Meadowlark Children's Center opened its doors. Whatever silence that remained evaporated this week. Chime rehearsals, chair and tables being set up and moved around, donations for Christmas Kids Shoppe streaming in, tree decorating, Holden Evening Prayer rehearsals (The liturgy we'll be using during Advent), people with questions, and yes, baby's and toddlers all added to the din of church as Christmas approaches.

This is a joyful thing, dear ones. Life lives at Messiah - perhaps this time of year especially. But what I hear in all the activity here this week is an expression of what has been building for the last 8 months. Life! In all the mess, the decorating, the wailing, the working out of worship details and the coming and going of helpers and organizers, we are living into the call of God in this new place, and this week it's taking noisy form! I want you to hear that, dear friends, and to listen for it.

But all this activity is also a reflection of what our Western Culture is doing this time of year too. Christmas shopping ads on every radio and tv station have been the background noise of households since long before Thanksgiving. Christmas ceased to be magical for many of us when children came on the scene, and then Christmas became a production to make it magical for this next generation. Presents need buying, relatives need to know when they're coming or going or hosting, schedules need to be made, decorations! Tactical plans for wrestling Christmas into submission by December 24th has taken our focus this time of year.

As I said in a summer sermon though, behind the noise in our heads, in our homes and around us this season, the silence remains. We take a sincere and fairly serious approach to Advent in our worship here at Messiah. There is fun and festivity to be sure, but in the midst of it we seek to help each other deepen our experience of the quieting walk toward Christmas. And if there's anything I've learned from our Meadowlark friends, it's that babies need quiet, if only to fill it with their dulcet, babbling (shrieking?) tones.

So this Christmas, I wish you luck with all that you have to do. But more than that, I hope you gradually descend from the holiday high and eventually find a quieting pace that leads you through the noise to a most silent night.

The Latin or Roman Cross is the most recognized Christian symbol and represents the crucifixion.




The Calvary Cross is a Latin Cross standing on three steps which represent Faith, Hope, and Love.



The Celtic Cross is a Latin Cross with a circle, representing eternity.

The Triumphant Cross is a Latin Cross on top of a circle. The circle represents the earth with a latitude and a longitude line. The Cross on top reminds us that Jesus is triumphant over the challenges of the world.

The Tau Cross and Serpent is a sign of salvation from John 3:14 "And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." It is also a symbol of Jesus as Healer.



The Angel reminds us of the angels who told the shepherds of Jesus' birth. It can also represent the second coming of Jesus, which the Bible says will begin with an angel blowing a trumpet.

The Chalice is a symbol of Communion and also represents God's forgiveness.

The Butterfly is a symbol for resurrection, transformation and immortality. A chrysalis symbolizes the death of the caterpillar, which then springs forth in beautiful new life.

The Grapes represent Communion and Christ's saying "I am the vine, you are the branches."

The Cross and Chi are two Chis superimposed. The Chi in the normal "X" position represents the first letter in the Greek word for Christ. The second Chi in the cross position represents the crucifixion.

The Lamb is a frequent image of the Messiah in both the Old and New Testaments.

The Manger is a reminder of the humble birth of Jesus.

The Lamp represents Jesus as the Light of the World.

Each month Messiah Lutheran supports a designated charity. If you would like to contribute to this cause, please designate "special offering" on your check or with your online gift.

Our special offering for December supports the Freedom in Christ Prison Ministry at Montana State Prison in Deer Lodge. This mission is widely supported by Montana Synod – individuals, congregations, the Synod Office, and Churchwide. Even so,

funding over the past three years has dwindled placing the Ministry at risk. Freedom in Christ has called Pastor Marlow Carels to take over after Pastor Rob's retirement. Board members have been asked to take on some of the fund raising efforts.

Putting dollar issues aside, the Ministry remains incredibly important as a resource that inmates turn to for support, guidance, and spiritual renewal. Transforming Corrections published a study in 2017, <u>The</u> Impact of a Volunteer Prison Ministry Program on the Long-term Recidivism of Federal Inmates,

that showed that recidivism rates dropped by 21% for inmates engaged in Prison Ministry. For women, older inmates, and low risk offenders, the rates dropped by nearly 60%. There is virtually no ELCA presence in the Women's Prison in Billings and Montana Synod has the most involvement of the mainline Protestant denominations in the Men's Prison. FIC hopes to engage with the Women's Prison in the next two years if more consistent funding is established.

The Men's Prison houses nearly 1,600 inmates and has their own issues with staffing and funding from the state. Visitor access has been dramatically curtailed leaving inmates with little or no contact with the 'outside world'. FIC tries to fill some of that void.

Please keep FIC in your prayers and consider donating to this month's special offering.

"We have operated in the Montana State Prison for ten years and the recidivism of our guys is low, which coincides with statistics showing that faith ministries inside prisons (and re-entry programs) reduce the return to prison by 80%."

The congregation passed the proposed 2024 budget on November 19. We will be watching spending very closely in 2024 as it will be our first full year in operation in the new building. Pledged contributions, a good estimate of non-designated income, along with income from Meadowlark Childrens Center, puts us right where we need to be. Pledged amounts for the MIF loan came in higher than our mortgage payments will be for this year, so we hope to reduce principal at the end of next year and shorten the life of the loan.
