Dear Messiah,

Summer is here and Pentecost is well underway. The Spirit has come and walks with us into this new season. We listen for its invitation into the life it gives and the direction it leads. I'd like to talk about one such direction I see the Spirit tugging us, and ask you to consider where you're feeling its pull, in both your life and in our life together.

Coffee Hour. We gather after worship over treats (both savory and sweet), and always with coffee. We greet each other and engage with visitors who brave the vulnerability that comes in submitting to unfamiliar crowds more familiar with each other than with 'you.' The mugs in our hands, the hot coffee we share, fills the space between us that allows our focus to divide – our attention isn't solely directed at each other but given a gentle buffer in what we sip. It's a "third thing" that allows our socializing to be easy, perhaps less intense, more inviting. There's a reason people "go out for coffee," and why Lutherans joke about coffee being "the third sacrament."

Our coffee poses a question though, and I feel the Spirit pausing, waiting for our reply.

The "coffee culture" is ubiquitous in North America. You can find people everywhere drinking it like water. There is no place in North America though where coffee grows, so whatever coffee you drink, that steaming mug in your hands comes to you through economic agreements between countries that do grow coffee and those that don't. Many such agreements are made at the expense of coffee growers, who work for less money than what would constitute a fair or living wage.

There are companies that are trying to work around such agreements in order to support coffee growers more directly and effectively. Equal Exchange is a company that has created an alternative economy that cuts out the "middle man" and buys directly from coffee producers in developing countries. This enables the farmers to receive a better price, the consumers to receive a better product, and a level of fairness that is not possible when more special interests are part of the process. Equal Exchange provides the market, coffee growers provide the product, and a connection of support is forged.

This summer we are going to be drinking Equal Exchange coffees at Coffee Hour. There will be more information available around our coffee corner for you to peruse. What we speak of in worship about loving our neighbor will take on international significance with every sip you take after worship. The Spirit is offering us one more way to love globally, one cup at a time. You might find yourself saying, "That's some good coffee."


Messiah Charity Quilters would love your help
