

Dear Messiah,

This edition of the Messiah Lutheran Church Newsletter is late! My sincerest apologies to all of you. Melinda made a professional move in late January to a rare and sudden offer she couldn't refuse. We are sincerely happy for her and grateful for her continued involvement and presence.

That said, adjusting to the office and administrative life of Messiah in her absence has been tricky, as you can imagine. It turns out that March 1 would have been the two year anniversary of Melinda beginning at Messiah. So for this reason, I'd like to take this opportunity to lift up two things I observed about Melinda in the two years we shared an office.

The role she played in the life of this church since her hire is much larger than you might suspect. In addition to performing the basic duties of the position (weekly bulletins, monthly newsletters, communications with parishioners, and answering the phones), she took on some of the book-keeping, she cleaned the church once a week, she collaborated with me in all manner of things related to church, and she built anew website for Messiah (!). And that's not all! Having been on the job one month when I walked in the door for my first day, Melinda was among the first to welcome me: An unseasoned pastor with zero experience working with a professional assistant! Melinda put up with my learning, and she did so gracefully. As well, her curiosity about the faith and dedication to learning to support us in our experience of it was motivating, inspiring, and generous. She contributed whole-heartedly to the functioning of her church and this pastor. And her general presence in the office added so much for me in this prolonged experience of isolation. What we owe her as a church we could never hope to repay.

But, as many of you may have, I also observed her growth as a person. The woman I met when I first walked in back in April 2020 was not the same one who bid farewell to this job in late January. She developed, evolved - not only as a person but as a Christian - a faithful disciple of Christ. By God's grace we watched her become more fully who God made her to be, and for this we give thanks to God. For your faithful, dedicated, important work and for your sheer generosity of spirit, we thank you Melinda. You left this place and this pastor in far better shape than we could have asked for. For the impact you leave and your continued presence and practice with us, we rejoice. On behalf of Messiah, God bless you in all your future endeavors.

A Time for a Reset

In the first seven chapters of Genesis, we move quickly from the glory of creation to disobedience, expulsion from the garden and fratricide to the wickedness of humankind. We read, “The Lord saw that the wickedness of humankind was great in the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of their hearts was only evil continually” (Genesis 6:5). God’s beautiful creation, in harmony with itself and its creator, had gone completely off the rails. God had given the creation as a gift—and the gift was rejected. Time for a reset.

“And the Lord was sorry that he had made humankind on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart. So the Lord said, ‘I will blot out from the earth the human beings I have created—people together with animals and creeping things and birds of the air, for I am sorry I have made them’” (Genesis 6:6-7). Then, in chapter 7, we get the flood.

This is a story of God’s deep and terrible pain. We were created by love for love. And now this terrible betrayal moves God to destroy God’s own precious creation. Another part of this tragedy is that human disobedience and arrogance resulted in the destruction of creation. It is too deep for me to understand the depth of God’s horror when beholding how twisted humankind had become and God’s agony in sending the flood.

Some days—or if I am honest, many days—I want to press the reset button. We are still stuck in this pandemic. The whole world is anxious and angry and grieving. And though the world is living through this together, not all people are affected equally. Some (I among them) have access to vaccines, medical care, a safe home in which to shelter and the privilege of working from home. And this is just one pandemic.

There is the continuing pandemic of racial inequity. When I say the Pledge of Allegiance, I want to believe that we are a people “with liberty and justice for all.” Whether we see the racial inequities laid bare, feel freedom threatened by mask and vaccine mandates, or see voting rights threatened—all positions voiced by members of this church—it is painfully clear that we aren’t living up to that pledge. There are societal forces that seek to tear us apart and set us against each other. And as I write this, Russia [is] invading Ukraine and plunging Europe into war.

Over and over again humankind has betrayed the hope God has for us. God declared the creation very good. We have fallen short. This must certainly be a time for a reset. I can think about how I would reset. Many others in our church who have been wounded by society, and even the ELCA, would have legitimate cases for what needs to be reset. And I wonder, if all of us simultaneously pressed the reset button, would that cancel all of us out?


And God said to Noah, “I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth (Genesis 9:11). The rainbow, interestingly, is the sign of this covenant with all of creation, a rainbow that only comes after a storm. This is God’s reset.

We are in a storm. In no way would I minimize nor silence the real pain experienced by our people. But I want to hold out the truth and the promise of God’s ultimate reset—the death and resurrection of Jesus. In this act of redemption, God has brought about the reconciliation of all people and of all creation. This reset, though not completely realized, gives us a way to speak and hear truth from one another.

Jesus said, “You will know the truth, and the truth will make you free.” (John 8:32)

Building Update

Exterior materials have all been chosen. You can find samples on the board in the back of the Sanctuary. A forum was held to dream about what the Sanctuary will look like and some modifications are being made to the plans to incorporate wall sconces. The team made the decision to remove the very costly moveable glass wall between the sanctuary and gathering space which also allows us to use a fire alarm system vs a sprinkler system, also saving money. We continue to explore cost saving ideas as well as choosing interior products such as the pendant lights for the Sanctuary. Small groups are making progress on their topics.




