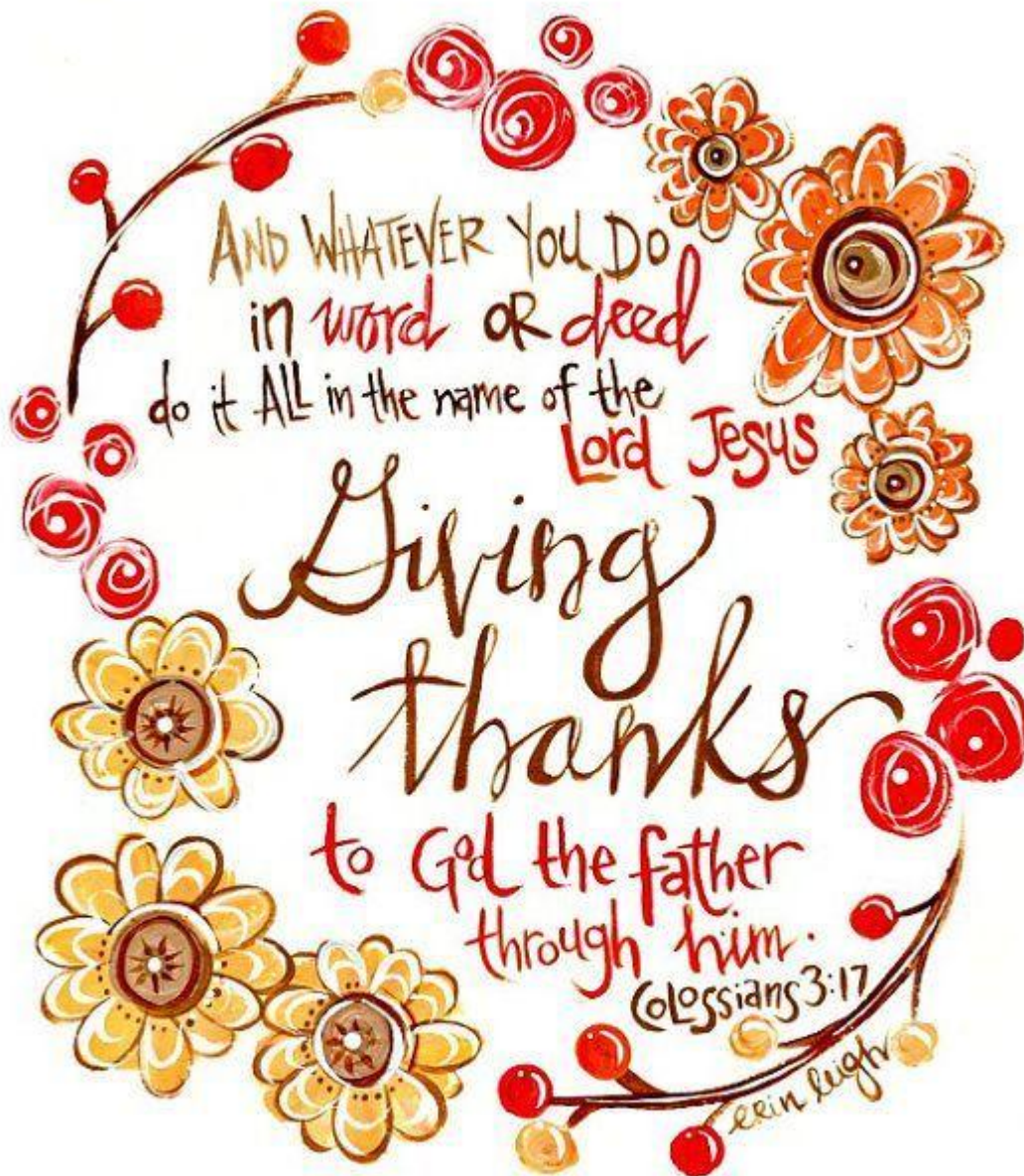

Dear Messiah,

I write this on the eve of All Saints Day - Halloween - and the funeral of Dick Rosekelly. Preparing for his funeral I've been more and more aware of the role we have as a community of faith in supporting one another along the path we walk together. Increasingly, it's clear, here in Montana and across the country, that the number of ordained clergy is shrinking. As an ordained clergy person myself, I wonder about our future ability, as a national church body and as local churches like Messiah, to continue in this work.

What's become clear as well is that our churches do not lack leadership. Lay members of churches without pastors, especially in Montana, have been stepping up to the task of sustaining their communities, even enlivening their life together. It's a blessing to have a pastor in this day and age, but it's not essential for a church to function or thrive.

As you know, Church is neither a building nor its ordained leaders - it is the people. Worship itself is the work of the people (the literal meaning of the word liturgy!) But while we know these things, we have not lived them in a way that demonstrates their truth. We have leaders who work hard on our behalf as a community, but we have many more leaders than these.

This is why I have been inviting people to lead worship with me. Have you been curious as to why?

Experiencing worship with leadership shared the church will learn to trust itself. These Assisting Ministers are silently growing faith in these things that we know to be true. Through them, Messiah is growing a quiet strength, a resilience and resolve, that we can and will do church together when the days come that we have no pastor.

For those of you who'd like to serve your church in this role, know that it is an act of leaning into the Spirit's guidance and the very grace of God. It will grow you. None of us do anything "perfectly" - indeed this is never the point! We do this because our church needs faithful people leading it. The congregation where I was baptized and confirmed, that hosted the funeral of my father, has been in a pastor search for 2.5 years. I have no intention of leaving Messiah any time soon, but when the time comes, you will have a wait too. So we work together to prepare those who will lead.

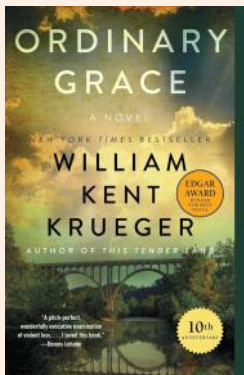
Messiah Charity Quilters would love your help

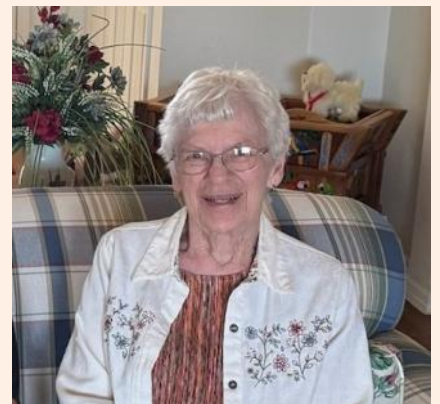
When Dick died in 2018, he chose to be buried in the Veteran's section of Red Lodge Cemetery across the road from Messiah's new location.

Jim and Jeri Kyner share the spotlight this month.

The first word that comes to mind when I think of this couple is kind followed closely by industrious, faithful, and reliable. As long as I have known Jim and Jeri, they have been pillars of the church, quietly doing jobs that need to be done at the building and sharing God's love by visiting shut-ins, providing meals for people who are in need, sending messages of encouragement, and actively participating in services here at Messiah. Oh, and Jeri makes the BEST chocolate chip cookies! We are indeed blessed to have them here with us.

Jim's Story

I was born March 10, 1941 in Glenwood Springs, Colorado.

As a toddler, I remember living in a cement block house that looked down on a paved street and the railroad tracks which ran along the Colorado River. There was a grass slope that was fun to roll down. I also remember our house vibrating when the train went by.

Then I remember living in a tent in a trailer park near Dragerton, Utah. Behind the tent was a rabbit hutch. I would reach up as far as I could and put my fingers in the cage and a rabbit would nibble on them. I tried to ride my tricycle on the dirt road by our tent but the front wheels would just spin in place. One day my brother was riding our mom's bike behind me on the road. He told me "Move over!" I moved to the other side of the road, and my teddy bear protected my fall but my brother fell into a pile of boards with nails poking out. He was mad at me!

We left Utah and drove back to Glenwood Springs in my dad's model A Ford.

In Glenwood Springs in the winter, we would side-step up the road to the cemetery where Doc Holiday and one of the "Wild Bunch" were buried. That's where I learned to ski! From third grade to high school I skied at the Red Mountain Ski area in Glenwood Springs. The warming hut was an old CCC barracks. We also skied at Aspen for 50 Cents when we could find a ride to get there. We could ride home in my friend's dad's Coke truck.

My brother and I always had paper routes besides working for my Dad. All of our wages were put into an account for college. Both of us became teachers with master's degrees. I met Jeri in college.

Jeri's Story

I was born on February 27, 1943, in an Army hospital in Fort Jackson, South Carolina. For the next three years while my dad was fighting in World War II in Europe, my mom and I moved around spending time with relatives. When my Dad came home for short visits, I was afraid of him, he was a stranger!

When I was 4, we moved to Austria. I loved Austria partly because our family was together. I had many friends to play with and we explored bombed out buildings. In 1949 my brother was born and I went to Kindergarten in Austria. For the next 12 years, I attended school in 12 different places, including Japan. My school in Japan was a one and a half room school. I usually had 1 or 2 other kids in my grade. We lived on the side of Mt. Fuji. It was very beautiful!

When I was 13, I started babysitting and teaching swimming lessons. My Dad matched my earnings and saw to it that all the money I made went into my college fund.

I graduated from high school in Mineral Wells, Texas and then went to college at the University of Northern Colorado. That's where I met the love of my life,
Jim Kyner!

Jim and Jeri's Story

We got married in 1963 while we were still going to college. We both worked two jobs in the summers so we could continue college in the fall. Jim worked for his Dad building and remodeling houses. His Dad always saved the concrete demolition and replacement for Jim to do. In the evenings, Jim hosed off the picnic and sun bathing areas around the "world's largest outdoor hot springs swimming pool". Jeri taught swimming lessons in the mornings. The rest of the day she worked at the swim shop and sold tickets to people so they could get into the swimming pool.

In 1965, we both graduated from college and we both got teaching jobs in Worland, Wyoming. We thought we could live there for a year or two but found we loved skiing, hiking, camping, backpacking, hunting canoeing and teaching in the Big Horn Mountain area. Worland was also a great place to raise our sons, Jardy and Jack. Jardy says he had a "Leave it to Beaver" childhood. We both ski patrolled at Meadowlark Ski Area near Ten Sleep, Wyoming. Jim went on to become a regional Director over most of the Wyoming ski areas. He was also the first ski team coach in Worland.

After 37 years in Worland, we retired and got jobs teaching in a Yupic Eskimo village in Alaska. We learned more than our students did! Now we could afford to retire in Red Lodge. For the last 22 years we have enjoyed all the outdoor activities Red Lodge has to offer.

We have also made great friends here and have enjoyed our wonderful church home.

Christmas Kids' Shoppe 2025

On Saturday, December 6 at 9:00 a.m., our church will be filled with many eager children wanting to shop for free gifts for family members.

In 2024, Messiah's Christmas Kids' Shoppe served over 160 young shoppers who went home with more than 850 wrapped gifts! Messiah is located at 912 Lower Continental (off Hwy 78) in Red Lodge.

There are many opportunities for everyone to help make this year's Shoppe another wonderful event! Please review the lists below for a task that suits your time and interest and sign up on the chart at the church or telephone Jeri at the number shown below.

PRIOR TO THE EVENT

Bakers - Bake small cookies to be served during the event.

Friday, November 14 (10:00 a.m.) - Come to the church to assemble parent letters and shopping tickets for children to take home in their Friday Folders. We will also pass out merchant letters and Kids' Shoppe posters. Bring a stapler and staples if you have them.

Thursday, December 4 (6:00-8:00 p.m.) - Load up the things that are not at the church and bring to the church.

Friday, December 5 Set up Tables (9:00 a.m.) - Arrange gifts on tables in the sanctuary. Arrange the wrapping area and chairs. Arrange chairs for children and adults in the gathering area.

DURING THE EVENT

December 6 (8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.)

Kitchen Staff - Arrange and serve cookies and beverages to the adults.

Door Monitors - Welcome children. Check their shopping tickets or help them complete one. Pass out big shopping bags. Keep children in the line while awaiting their turn to shop. Only children are admitted to the Shoppe while adults enjoy refreshments in another area.

Personal Shoppers - Help a child select gifts for those listed on his/her shopping ticket. PLEASE mark who each gift is for on the shopping ticket, e.g. "Ball for Joey" or "Earrings for Mom" so the gifts can be properly labeled when wrapped.

Gift Wrappers - Wrap or bag the gifts. Bows and curly ribbons are available.

Wrappers' Helpers - Write "To" and "From" and fill in the appropriate names on the gift tags and tape tags to the proper gifts.

Table Monitors - Restock gifts on the tables as needed.

Greetings and Blessings!

Your Messiah Church Council met on October 8th at 6 pm.

You can find the full report, including financials, in the member section of our website or by requesting a copy from our Administrative Assistant.

Summary of the October meeting:

Paul Schauer, Treasurer, noted that the September ending balance in the Mission Investment Loan is \$ 296,000.

Paul will contact the Chamber of Commerce to purchase a hanging flower basket in the 2026 Broadway display; he will donate the cost on Messiah's behalf.

Maria Gibson, Education Committee Chair, was happy to share that the rest of this year's Sunday School classes all have teachers signed up!

Martha Crofts, Family Life/Volunteer Coordinator, reported about the planned Community Thanksgiving Service followed by a dinner on November 23rd at 5 pm. There is also an Everybody's Birthday Party and Talent Show planned.

Sandy Moe, Outreach Committee Chair, met twice with the Fellowship Field Committee to discuss opportunities for development. Sandy has completed training on the technology booth, printed schedules for volunteers, and has been running the livestream during Sunday services with the continued help of Duane and Marla.

Kathy Kraetz, Property Committee Chair, reported that the sprinkler system has been blown out, the letters on the side of the Church have been installed and that there is some maintenance to be completed at the parsonage.

Linda Daily, Stewardship Committee Chair, reported that the Stewardship materials were created and made available to the congregation. The returned card will assist the church Council in creating the Mission Spending Plan for 2026. The congregation will vote on the 2026 Mission Spending Plan during the congregational meeting on November 23rd.

Dianne Milleson, Worship Committee, reported that the next Song and Readings Service will be on November 16th. Mid-week Advent services are being planned with the UCC and Episcopal Churches.

Katrin Chandler, Church Council President, shared the annual review forms for Pastor Ben and Dianne which will be filled out by all council members. The executive committee is also sending out a congregational survey to our active membership.

Brooke Flynn, Church Council Secretary, reported that copies of the updated Constitution will be available to the congregation on October 19. Then at the November 23rd Congregational Meeting after worship, the congregation can vote on the updated Constitution. The congregation will vote to ratify the Constitution at the Annual Meeting. After the vote, Brooke will send the ratified Constitution to the Montana Synod.

SAVE YOUR SUDS

a community ministry of kindness

Save Your Suds is a ministry that was started by Calvary Episcopal Church in June of 2023.

The purpose of the program is to spread kindness in our community by helping people pay for their laundry expenses at Rock Creek Laundromat.

Owner of the laundromat, Jim Moore, generously donates the cost of washing. He provides us with a key to the washing machines that allows us to bypass the need for quarters or credit cards.

The cost of drying is covered by donations from the Episcopal Church Women and from parishioners from Calvary.

Volunteers run the program which is held on the first and third Sundays of every month from 5-7p.m.

Each week a bin is provided to that week's volunteers.

The bin is outfitted with the following items:

Detergent, Dryer sheets, Washer key and instructions for the use of the key, Quarters for the dryers, Clipboard to record number of loads and amount of quarters used

Members of the community have become somewhat dependent on the SYS program and are very appreciative of the help. This is a wonderful way to support our neighbors and spread kindness in our community. Calvary would love to have our friends from Community UCC and Messiah join us in this essential ministry.
