Dear Messiah,

May is here and spring is creeping forward. As I write rain is falling outside. But as rain does this time of year, it carries with it a future that we can look forward to – of emerald hills, budding trees, longer days and eventually the flow of our "seasonal creeks". The anticipation spring rains bring have me thinking about our life together and what comes next.

Pastor's Bible Study is pausing our Tuesday night gatherings for May with a plan to resume Tuesday, June 10th. Pentecost Sunday is June 8th, so we will have set out into a new church season – one focused on the gospel word catching fire. Thinking about that Pentecost story in which language barriers are breached and a shared vocabulary grows, I'm thinking about what Pentecost could mean for us.

On June 10th, the Pastor's Bible Study will begin a course of study called The Spiritual Quest in a Changing Culture: Primary Questions on Faith and Worship. Originally a Christmas gift from my father, it's a study guide focused on the spirituality of Christianity and the worship that forms it. "... [W]orship helps to shape who we become", writes author Rolf Nosterud. He goes on to explain the basic premise of the study: "to understand Christian Faith is to understand Christian worship and vice versa."

In some of my first years as Pastor of Messiah, I attempted to convey a deeper meaning of various parts of our worship. As a deeply meaningful aspect of my own formation, I sought to "translate" worship for you, often in the context of our services. But, as Nosterud writes, although worship is an important part of forming Christian faith among disciples, it is not sufficient. One needs opportunities to dialogue... in order to mature our faith for living in our changing culture. (xii LS).

Created by a Lutheran pastor, this is a course of study that promises to give us a better understanding of who we are as a worshipping community and the shape God gives us through that worship. "There is work to be done. Many lay people need help finding words to initiate the discussion of how their faith, their Bible, and the symbols of worship relate to the longings in their soul. (xLS)" Quest with us, that together, we might find the words.




