Reason for Policy

Trustees have a legal duty to protect children and adults at risk from potential or actual harm whilst engaged in activities linked to the charity.

This policy will be reviewed annually by the Trustees and a written report given to the Annual Meeting by the person named in section 8.

- 1. We recognise that everyone has different levels of vulnerability and that each of us may be regarded as vulnerable at some time in our lives. As Trustees we commit ourselves to the safeguarding of children and of all people who may be vulnerable.
- 2. We commit ourselves to promoting safe practice in all our activities.
- 3. It is the responsibility of each Trustee and Volunteer to prevent the physical, verbal, emotional, financial and sexual abuse of children and adults at risk and to report any such abuse that they discover or suspect.
- 4. We commit to exercise proper care in the appointment and selection of Trustees and Volunteers.
- 5. Each person who works with vulnerable people will agree to abide by these recommendations and the guidelines established by the charity.
- 6. The charity will not itself organise events at which unaccompanied children and/or adults at risk will be present. If we change this then the whole policy will be reviewed.
- 7. Hirers of the facilities who organise events at which unaccompanied children or adults at risk will be present must, as a condition of hire, have appropriate Safeguarding policies and procedures.
