I'm learning as the rest of us with a variety of bugs attacking our trees. I recently noticed beetles in a Douglas Fir that had been blown over last year. It was a very large tree that wasn't brown. After splitting the tree, the bark at the base had a small number of beetles in it. I think most of the issues with Douglas Fir in our area are the spruce, budworm and moth. If you see Douglas Fir needles turning brown it could be the Douglas Fir beetle, the cousin to mountain the pine beetle.



# A look inside bark to wood layer:




Example below is a neighbor's ponderosa that was infected and needles turned brown around 6 plus months ago. Steve & I dropped the tree March 30th 2025 and when cutting it into pieces the bark came off. The white worms (larvae) were falling out everywhere. There were a few beetles in the bark, but most had already flown. The point is if you don't get rid of the infected tree or cover it with plastic to kill with summer heat the larvae turn into more beetles that may fly at a later date.





Below are examples of the blue stain the beetles release into the tree. The stain basically chokes off the water to the tree killing the tree.





#### What do I do with an infested tree?

- 1. Easiest way is to haul it to a slash site (see links below).
- 2. If you want the wood wrap in clear plastic, seal it off in a sunny area. Try not to stack the wood more than 2 layers for best results.
- 3. If you have a large diameter tree and want the wood I would split the bark off the tree. I got rid of the bark/beelte layer of the tree. There is nothing wrong with stained wood for burning. This is a lot of work!
- 4. I've read burying the wood at least 8", but that takes equipment most people don't have.
