Dear Members,

I am pleased to introduce the 2022 Impact Report of Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) summarizing our objectives, actions, and community impact in the past 12 months. In another year of economic and societal volatility, members of The Club at Las Campanas stepped up their support to programs that enable our purpose: Inward through Scholarships and Outward through Community Grants. As a result, LCCF has awarded more funds to nonprofit agencies and scholarships in the past two years than cumulatively awarded in its first 20 years as an organization. Thank you to all those who donated, volunteered, and support these causes!

In this report you will find details on our major programs, Community Grants and Scholarships, as well as information on activities such as the expanded Arts Program. Our two arts events, the Art Sale in June and the new Studio Artists Tour provided over \$35,000 to LCCF's Community Grants Program. The Annual Holiday Appeal for Community Grants achieved an all time record with \$600,000 awarded to 27 nonprofit organizations for their programs in greater Santa Fe. Such extraordinary generosity is appreciated by grantees and enables them to expand their outreach. Our Scholarship Program served 37 scholars (30 employees and 7 children of employees) with an average benefit of \$4,100 per semester, enabling our scholars to focus on learning.

The all-volunteer LCCF board is comprised entirely of members at Las Campanas. We work to ensure our programs address critical needs within the Santa Fe area. Our mission (see below) inspires us and through your generosity and commitment, LCCF is making a significant, positive impact in our community.

In 2022, we were delighted to add new board members, Karen Dealy, Bob Guoy, Skip Helm, Denise Rutherford, and Jim Samis. We extend our sincere appreciation to Cathy Kalenian, Carol McDonald, Mac McDonald, Diane Primrose, and Linda Smith for their many contributions and years of service as they retire from the board. We are grateful to the strong support from Las Campanas management and staff, Al Antonez and Isabel Chavarria.

# 2022 COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM IMPACT

As noted in C.T.'s summary on page 2, 2022 was a banner year for our Community Grants Program. We are grateful for a record number of donors with record total dollars donated, allowing a record \$600,000 in grants to Santa Fe area nonprofit organizations. LCCF has now awarded over \$2M in Community Grants since 2002 — over \$1M in the last two years alone. Thank you to all Las Campanas members for delivering on our *Outward through Community Grants* initiative. Your generosity is remarkable and together we're making a difference for those in need in the Santa Fe community.


LCCF Community Grants supports nonprofits focused on education, health, and human services. Grants are allocated by organization size and in balance across these three areas of need. In addition, our designation feature allows members to select nonprofits from our grantee list for donations of \$2,500 or more. In the 2022 Annual Appeal, members designated nearly \$210,000 to favorite nonprofits. Except for modest expenses, every donated dollar goes directly to work in the nonprofits we support.

Acknowledging that individual philanthropy is a personal choice, our vision for LCCF Community Grants is to:

- Make our program appealing to a broad cross section of our membership,
- Increase the member participation rate,
- Continue to create a sense of community in Las Campanas through member engagement and events, and
- Maintain strong growth in total dollars granted each year.

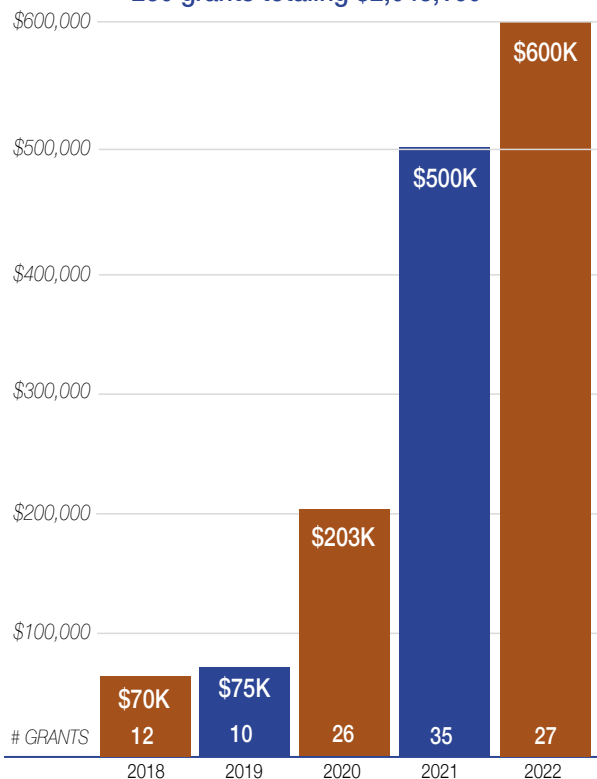

# 2022 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM IMPACT

Since 2014, the LCCF Scholarship Program has awarded 376 scholarships totaling over \$940,000. Scholarships are awarded to eligible employees and their children under our *Inward Through Employees* initiative to support Las Campanas employees and their families in pursuing their dreams through higher education. Through the generosity of members, we've increased support to 37 scholars annually and increased the average award—now at \$4,100. In 2022 alone, scholarship awards totaled more than \$230,000.

Following in the esteemed footsteps of C.T. Herman, and most recently Mac MacDonald, I took over as Chair of the LCCF Scholarship Committee before the fall semester. It has been incredibly fulfilling to get to know our scholars, witness how hard they work to accomplish their goals and know that LCCF is able to reduce or eliminate debt they would have created accomplishing these goals.

Among our scholars, there are seven seniors who will graduate in May. They attend colleges and universities all around the country. Their majors include Biology, Civil Engineering, Criminal Justice, Economics, Forensic Psychology, Information Systems, Marine Science, Marketing, Mathematics, and Psychology. Four of the seven

are earning double majors. Many are planning to attend graduate school and, with pride, we can anticipate great accomplishments from all of them.

In a year when we had no active fundraising because of a sufficient balance in the Scholarship Fund, donations received still totaled \$174,700. Members are clearly committed to this long-standing educational program.

The incredible generosity of our members makes all of this possible. Know that the LCCF scholarships we've sponsored have had a positive impact on each of our scholars and their futures. Thank you!

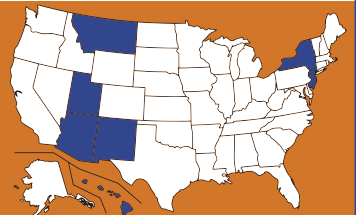

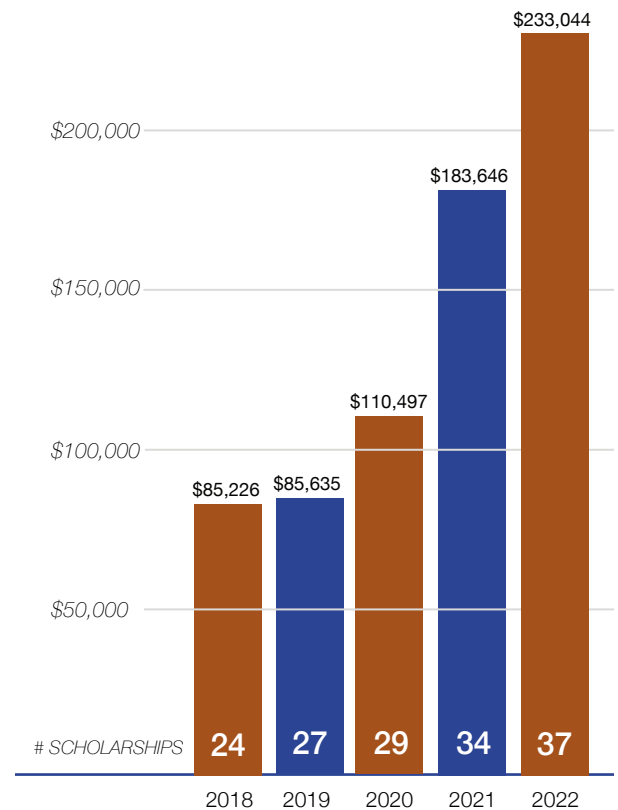

## ABOUT SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Employees of The Club at Las Campanas and their dependents may be eligible to apply.

- Full-time employees are eligible after completing one year of employment.
- Seasonal employees are eligible after working a second season.

Enrollment and attendance must be at an accredited college, university, or trade school (in-person and remote learning are both eligible).

Full-time employees are eligible for awards up to \$10,000 per semester (\$20,000 per academic year). Seasonal employees are eligible for awards up to \$5,000 per semester (\$10,000 per academic year).

Besides tuition, the scholarship can be used for fees, books, supplies, and a one-time only purchase of a laptop or tablet (up to \$1,500).

## ABOUT TSAs

Under the guidance of the Scholarship Committee, the Teen Savings Account (TSA) Program provides high school age Club employees and high school age children of Club employees an opportunity to establish a custodial savings account to be used for costs related to post-secondary educational expenses.

Upon opening an account, the student is granted \$500 from LCCF and additional contributions to the account by the teen or their family are matched, up to \$500 each calendar year. There are currently 18 accounts held by Guadalupe Credit Union\* in Santa Fe with a total balance of \$20,371.

\*Prosperity Works of Albuquerque provides financial and administrative services for the TSA Program.



# 2022 COMMUNITY FUNDS DONORS

**Thank you to our donors for their extraordinary generosity!** LCCF is making a positive difference in the lives of so many in our community because of those listed on these pages. Response from Club members was strong to fund raising requests from multiple events and channels. The Scholarship Classic & Employee Appreciation Day was held in June and raised \$174,700 for the Scholarship Program. The Arts Program, featuring the Art Sale in June and the Studio Artists Tour in September, raised over \$35,000 for the Community Grants Program. Most funds for Community Grants were received as a result of the Holiday Annual Appeal. 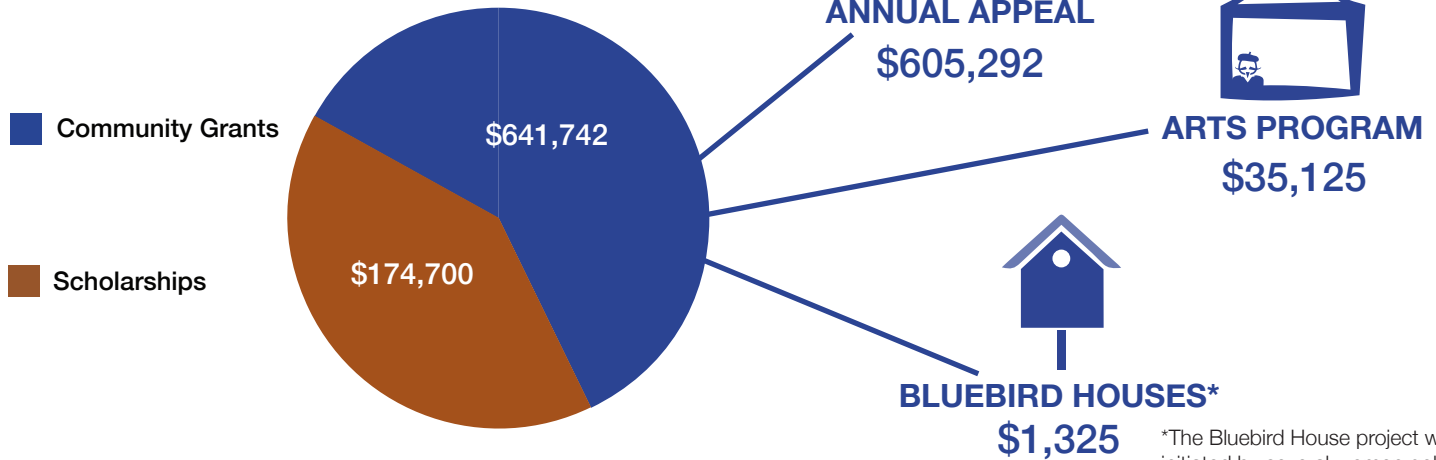

# FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

The LCCF financial guidelines are straightforward. We strive to minimize our expenses so that we can maximize our funding for grants and scholarships. We maintain a reserve which is invested with the Santa Fe Community Foundation.

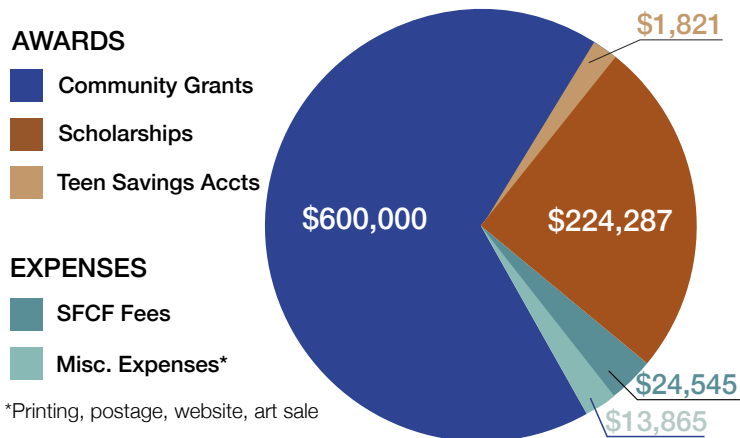
